Pastor's Corner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

To find the Papal Bull I referenced in my homily, simply do a search on "Misericordiae Vultus" and the first search result should take you to the Vatican's website.

I am pleased to announce that after months of searching we have found and hired a new full-time Music Director. Francisco Ortiz will be joining our community in the middle of January. Here is a little bit about Francisco and the talents he will be bringing to our community.

Francisco Ortiz was born and raised in Vallejo, attending St. Vincent's Elementary and St. Patrick-St. Vincent's High School. He went on to earn his B.A. in Music from Dominican University in 2006, studying percussion with Ken Crawford as well as choral / orchestral conducting and voice with Dr. Craig Singleton. In 2008 Francisco received his Master of Music in Music Education degree from Holy Names University where he studied conducting with Judit Hartányi, Professor at the Liszt Academy in Budapest.

Francisco began working at St. Raphael Church and Mission in San Rafael as Music Director in 2005. There he developed and grew the music ministry including working with choirs in Spanish, English, Vietnamese and Brazilian Portuguese. Francisco selected and rehearsed music for Sunday liturgies in English and Spanish and accompanied these groups on piano and organ.



In addition, I would like to address some of the concerns that have been expressed about hiring a full time Music Director. First, all of our current music ministers have been encouraged to continue to offer their musical talents here at St. Dominic's Church. Second, we will continue to celebrate the musical diversity we currently have at the different Masses here at St. Dominic's. Francisco's main objective is to oversee and expand our music program while honoring what we currently have in place. I would like to thank all our of music ministers for all they do and look forward to us continuing to give God the beautiful worship for which He is worthy. As always, I am more than willing to speak about any concerns you have about this issue, or any other issue, in our worshipping community. Please join me in welcoming Francisco to our community.

Two weeks ago I was asked to give a blessing to a couple celebrating 40 years of matrimony. After a reading from the Gospel, homily and the nuptial blessing, the couple addressed each other. It was obvious to all that after 40 years of marriage they are more in love with each other today then the day they were first married. I

I love waterfalls. When I am out hiking, I will take any side path that leads to a waterfall. The first time I swam in a waterfall pool was memorable. I am not sure where this love came from, but there is something about the motion and sound of the water as it is falling that soothes my mind and enlivens my soul. I also know that waterfalls can be dangerous: The force of the water can sweep everything over the edge. Still, when Jesus refers to his living water in the encounter with the woman at the well (John 4), I immediately think of water falling into a pool and the abundant life that grows around the area.

For Christians, water signifies both life and death. At creation, God said, "Let the water teem with an abundance of living creatures" (Genesis 1:20). God then used the waters of a flood to destroy wickedness on earth (while saving Noah and others). Water washes us clean and keeps us alive. On a recent trip to Israel, I had an opportunity to stand in the Jordan River and renew my own baptismal vows. I was struck by the power of the words and the coolness of the water. It also occurred to me that simply renewing my vows was not enough. Our promise, inherent in the Creed, is that we will live a life transformed by grace with the help of the Holy Spirit. That is both comforting and challenging. But Jesus, who is living water, whose Spirit brings us life and whose fire is ready to purify and make us ready, is with us now and forever.


The pre-walk rally begins at 12:30PM in San Francisco's Civic Center Plaza, and the Walk for Life,

Deacon Errol: Understanding the Year of Mercy

Pope Francis has announced a special Year of Mercy beginning December 8, 2015, and continuing through November 20, 2016. The Year of Mercy is a special time for prayer, pilgrimage, and works of mercy, a graced opportunity to encounter the mercy of God.

WHY A YEAR OF MERCY? "At times we are called to gaze even more attentively on mercy so that we may become a more effective sign of the Father's action in our lives. For this reason I have proclaimed an Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy as a special time for the Church, a time when the witness of believers might grow stronger and more effective." (Pope Francis)

WHAT IS A JUBILEE? For centuries, the Church has observed Jubilees – times of special grace and forgiveness of sins – at significant anniversaries, as in the 800 Jubilee that commemorates the founding of the Dominican Order in 1216, started November 8, 2015. The Year of Mercy is an "Extraordinary Jubilee" because it does not mark a particular anniversary. As in other Jubilee Years, the Jubilee Doors at the Major Basilicas in Rome will be opened and the faithful will have the opportunity to obtain a plenary indulgence for themselves and for their deceased loved ones. What a magnificent sign of God's mercy to obtain a plenary indulgence for the Year of Mercy as well as the Dominican Jubilee!

WHERE ARE THE DOORS OF MERCY? This Jubilee observance is unique in that Pope Francis has instructed that Doors of Mercy be designated not only in the Major Basilicas in Rome, but in every diocese around the world, in all cathedrals, churches and major shrines. Pope Francis opened the first Doors of Mercy on November 29, when he visited the Cathedral of Bangui in the Central African Republic. Bishop Soto will open the Doors of Mercy at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament on Sunday, December 13. It is with great joy that the diocese has named St. Dominic's a pilgrim Church for the Year of Mercy, so that the main doors inside our church will be, like those doors at the Major Basilicas in Rome, major shrines, and cathedrals across the world, holy Doors of Mercy.

HOW SHOULD WE MARK THE YEAR OF MERCY? Pope Francis has written: "It is my burning desire that, during this Jubilee, the Christian people may reflect on the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. It will be a way to reawaken our conscience, too often grown dull in the face of poverty....Let us rediscover these corporal works of mercy: to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, welcome the stranger, heal the sick, visit the imprisoned, and bury the dead. And let us not forget the spiritual works of mercy: to counsel the doubtful, instruct the ignorant, admonish sinners, comfort the afflicted, forgive offences, bear patiently those who do us ill, and pray for the living and the dead." In addition, the Year of Mercy is an opportune time to celebrate the sacraments, especially the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the Eucharist, to pray, to reflect on the Scriptures (particularly the Gospel of Luke, which we will read throughout the year at Sunday Mass), and to make a pilgrimage and pass through the Doors of Mercy in Rome, as well as through our own local cathedral or designated pilgrim parishes.

Prayer for the Year of Mercy Lord Jesus Christ,

you have taught us to be merciful like the heavenly Father,

and have told us that whoever sees you sees Him.

Show us your face and we will be saved. Your loving gaze freed Zacchaeus and Matthew

from being enslaved by money; the adulteress and Magdalene from seeking happiness

only in created things;

made Peter weep after his betrayal, and assured Paradise to the repentant thief.

Let us hear, as if addressed to each one of us,

the words that you spoke to the Samaritan woman:

"If you knew the gift of God!"

You are the visible face of the invisible Father,

of the God who manifests his power above all

by forgiveness and mercy:

Let the Church be your visible face in the world,

its Lord risen and glorified. You willed that your ministers would also be clothed in weakness

in order that they may feel compassion for those in ignorance and error:

let everyone who approaches them feel sought after,

loved, and forgiven by God. Send your Spirit and consecrate every one of us

with its anointing,

so that the Jubilee of Mercy may be a year of grace

from the Lord,

and your Church, with renewed enthusiasm,

may bring good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and the oppressed,

and restore sight to the blind. We ask this through the intercession of Mary, Mother of Mercy,

you who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit for ever and ever.

Amen.



What is Children's Liturgy of the Word?

Children's Liturgy of the Word (C.L.O.W.) is a wonderful celebration of the Mass for children, where the Readings and Gospel are proclaimed in a way they can understand. Our sessions are held each Sunday during the Sunday 9:00AM Mass. C.L.O.W. is geared toward children between the ages of 4 and 7. Children in this age bracket are invited up to the altar after the Opening Prayer. They receive a blessing by the celebrant and then process into the church sacristy, or a nearby classroom, which has been prepared with a small altar and the Lectionary for Masses with Children. The children are provided an age-appropriate discussion of these readings and related activity and invited to share their own ideas and thoughts about the readings. The activity of the day consists of craft, a take home coloring page or prayer, or a song. After this, the children return to the church and their families with the Presentation of the Gifts.

CEAT EXAMPLE Why do we celebrate the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe?



I never used to hear about Our Lady of Guadalupe, but now every year my parish celebrates the feast. Why?

In 1531 the Blessed Mother appeared to Juan Diego in the form of Our Lady of Guadalupe. She sent him to the bishop to ask that a church be built where she appeared so all may see and know her compassion. As a sign, she left her image on his cloak. This cloak is still venerated in Mexico and is as bright as ever, defying scientific explanation.

Devotion to Mary under this title began almost immediately. Pope Leo XIII made her celebration a memorial for the universal Church. During the twentieth century, she was proclaimed the **Queen of Mexico and Empress of the Americas**. In 2002, John Paul II canonized Juan Diego. Since then the growing Hispanic population in the United States has made her feast increasingly visible and popular.



In his 2014 homily on the feast of Guadalupe, Pope

Francis reminds us why this feast is so relevant to the Advent season: "In the wonders that the Lord has fulfilled in Mary, she recognizes her Son's manner and mode of conduct in salvation history. Overturning worldly judgments, destroying at all costs the idols of power, wealth and success, denouncing self-sufficiency, arrogance and secular messianism which distance people from God." Guadalupe lifts the lowly and draws all to her Son and his Church.

questions about the Church and our faith as it is today.


