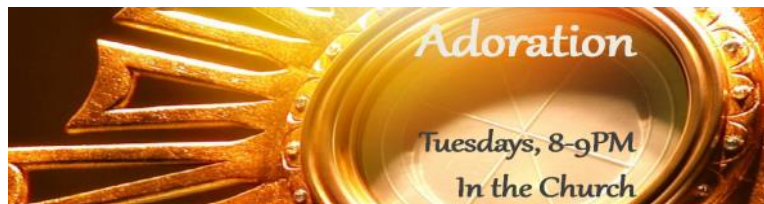

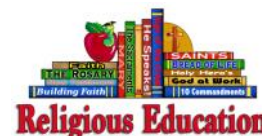

Paying it Forward: A parishioner story

Paying it forward, the phrase coined to imply a benefactor of a good deed who repays it to another instead of the original benefactor, may stretch back to 1916 when Lilly Hammond wrote the line “You don’t pay love back; you pay it forward” in her book *In the Garden of Delight*. In Catherine Ryan Hyde’s novel, *Pay it Forward* we encounter Trevor McKinney whose classroom assignment consisted of doing good deeds for three people and asking only that they offer a good deed for someone else, setting off a chain reaction, he hoped could make the world better. The following is an endearing letter from a parishioner who intends to pay forward a good deed and fulfill a promise made long ago. Keep in prayer the children who will receive their 1st Communion this year.

Dear Deacon Errol,

I attended Catholic schools from the first grade through my sophomore year of high school in various cities in California. My father drove a tractor and trucks to make a living and with six children, my parents were not able to pay tuition for Catholic school. We were very poor financially; however, we were rich in so many other ways that meant more than having any amount of money.

My grandmother was a Catholic convert at the age of 13 and deeply believed in her Catholic faith. My grandparents lived with us and Grandma led the Rosary every night after dinner. Having all of us attend Catholic schools was so very important to both my grandparents and my parents. My grandparents and mother worked for the church in exchange for part of our tuition and somehow, my parents managed to pay what was needed. We were blessed to receive a wonderful Catholic education.

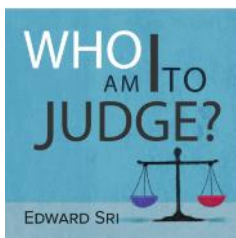
When I was in the second grade and ready to receive my first communion, a kind, generous woman came to the school and asked to take a needy child shopping to purchase her or his First Communion clothes. I was chosen. The woman accompanied my mother and me to the store and bought the most beautiful communion dress, veil, shoes, socks, gloves and even a little white prayer book and Rosary beads. I remember thanking her over and over. She told me she was happy to do this for me but she wanted my promise that when I grew up and was financially able to do so, I would do the same for a deserving child in need of help. “Keep the tradition going”, she said. And I promised I would.

Thank you Deacon Errol for helping me fulfill the promise I made so many years ago. Please find a child that is both deserving and in need of a little help to celebrate their first communion. There is one condition, the child must promise to do the same for another child when they grow up and are able to do so. Keep the tradition going...

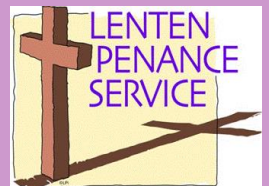
