Pastor's Corner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are one week away from Easter Sunday when we celebrate Jesus Christ conquering sin and rising from the death. But before we can celebrate, we must walk with Jesus Christ as He undergoes His Passion. Perhaps, you look back on your Lenten journey you didn't meet all of the sacrifices or commitments you had intended back on Ash Wednesday or you are still struggling to really make time and connect with Jesus in a deeper way. It's not too late! Today as we celebrate Palm Sunday and we listen again to the Passion of our Lord, we can enter Holy Week with a renewed focus and intimacy with Jesus.

Our Church has beautiful liturgies that allow us to use all of our senses to experience our lived salvation. Please consider joining us Thursday, Friday and Saturday mornings at 8:15 am for Tenebrae as we chant the Divine Offices of Matins and Lauds.

Also consider attending one or all three of the liturgies of Holy Thursday, when we represent the institution of the priesthood and the Eucharist, Good Friday, where we venerate Christ's suffice Cross, and the Vigil Mass, the first official celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. On Friday several parishioners will give their own personal reflections on the Seven Last Words of Christ and how they affect them. If you have never been to an Easter Vigil it should be on your bucket list. In fact, the instruction of the Roman Missal states, the Vigil is "the mother of all Vigils" and "the greatest and most noble of all solemnities". You will also be able to see me pour copious amounts of water on six of our parishioners as I baptize them.



How should you properly dispose of broken rosaries, Bibles used beyond repair, palm branches from previous Palm Sundays, old husbands, broken statues, and other blessed or sacred objects that can no longer be used?

The simplest way to dispose of blessed items is to drop them off at the parish office in a container clearly marked "Blessed Item(s) – Please Bury". From time to time we will take these blessed items to our Dominican cemetery and they will be buried in sacred ground. So, please feel free to drop off your blessed items at the parish office and we can properly dispose of them for you.

Holy Water can simply be poured in the ground.



Divine Mercy Sunday

April 30, 2000, Saint Pope John Paul II during the canonization of Sister Faustina announced the Second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday.

Jesus told St Faustina that this Feast of Mercy would be a very special day when "all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened." (Diary 699)



Jesus promised that "The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain the complete forgiveness of sins and punishment." (Diary 699) He went on to say "I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My Mercy." (Diary 1109)

Our Lord said "When you go to confession, to this fountain of My mercy, the Blood and Water which came forth from My Heart always flows down upon your soul..." and "Every time you go to confession, immerse yourself entirely in My mercy with great trust, so that I may pour the bounty of My grace upon your soul. When you approach the confessional, know this, that I Myself am waiting there for you. I am only hidden by the priest, but I Myself act in your soul. Here the misery of the soul meets the God of Mercy" (Diary1602)

Jesus also asks us to celebrate the Hour of Great Mercy, promising tremendous graces to those who would at three o'clock, implore My mercy, especially for sinners; and, if only for a brief moment, immerse yourself in My Passion, particularly in My abandonment at the moment of agony.

This is the hour of great mercy ... In this hour I will refuse nothing to the soul that makes a request of Me in virtue of My Passion. (Diary 1320).
