

THE SYMBOLS OF EASTER THE PASCHAL CANDLE

Welcome to our great Easter Celebration - what the fathers of our Church call the "week of weeks." They write that the Easter Season is the season of fulfillment, the season of new life. This special season has many rituals and symbols that are unique to the season. This week we examine one of the most prominent symbols that are central to the Easter Environment – the Paschal (Easter) Candle.

Fire and light are two of the widely used symbols seen in our Catholic tradition. Baptismal candles are given to infants when they are born; throughout many a century fire has been the primary symbol used to represent the Holy Spirit. Our prayers often speak of light and flames, "Walk always as children of the light and keep the flame of faith alive in your hearts." It seems fitting then that one of the most significant symbols used in the Church is the Paschal (Easter) Candle. Throughout the fifty days of Easter the Paschal Candle is lit to remind us of the presence of the risen Christ who lives and is present in the Church. The candle is lit for the first time during the Easter Vigil. The lighting of the Candle originated as part of the ancient daily ritual of Lucernare ("lighting of the lamps") as darkness fell. In the early centuries in Rome, the Paschal Candle was lit during the night of the Vigil of Easter and symbolic of the resurrected Christ. In the Frankish kingdom, the added tradition of adding incense to the candle began and continues to this day. Five large grains of incense are inserted at the ends of the crossbars of the cross on the candle as the Presider says, "By his holy and glorious wounds may Christ our Lord guard us and keep us. Amen."

Throughout the fifty days of celebration that make up the Easter Season, the Paschal Candle stands large and in a place of great prominence just as the resurrection stands large and prominently in the lives and beliefs of Christians. The Candle is one of the primary symbols of Easter because it so aptly speaks of Jesus' risen life. After the Easter Season, the Paschal Candle is placed near the baptismal font where people can still see it but out of primary focus. When the Paschal Candle is used outside of the Easter Season, during baptisms, funerals or evening prayer, for example, it is in order to remind us how intimately connected our lives are with Christ's and that we all share in his risen life.

As we reflect upon the Paschal Candle during this great Easter Season, may the light of Christ strengthen us, so we may share that light with everyone in our world this day.

Gospel Reflection

The Redemptive Power of Christ

Now that we're a renewed people -- an Easter people -- the scriptures at Mass remind us of the stark difference between living a redeemed life and living in sin. The first reading for this Sunday says: "Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away." The second reading says: "Those who say, 'I know him', but do not keep his commandments are liars, and the truth is not in them."

And the Gospel reading says: "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name...."

We are all liars in some way every day, professing our faith with our lips but not always in our behaviors. Our actions often say that we don't truly believe what we say about Christ's love. Our worries might be saying that we don't truly believe that God cares about each and every situation.

Our decisions say that we don't truly believe that Jesus knew what he was talking about when he commanded us to love our enemies and do good to those who hurt us. Our moral relativism says that we don't truly believe he was smarter than us when he gave us his commandments.

How loudly do your actions preach the truth about Jesus? Many of us undervalue what Jesus has done for us, thinking that his death and resurrection is enough to get us into heaven; we neglect the need to humble ourselves under the reality of the need for daily redemption.

God's not expecting perfection from us on this side of heaven's gate. What he does want, however, is our desire to become more and more like Christ every day. As long as we're continually examining our lives and educating ourselves about how we can improve, and as long as we follow through by doing what is necessary to produce changes, God is very pleased with us.

Questions for Personal Reflection:

What sinful tendencies still enslave you? What will you do this week to turn these over to Christ and his redemptive power?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing:

What do you do to stay in touch with your need for Christ and his redemptive power? How do you rely on the resurrected life of Christ to overcome sinful tendencies and enter into victorious Christian living?



If you've ever wanted to learn more about how Jesus fulfilled the Old Testament then this study is for you!




