




Check out what is new this year at our school!

This school year SDS students are beginning to learn and understand the virtues through the implementation of *Disciple of Christ, Education in Virtue*. This is a Christian curriculum structured on the teachings of St. Thomas Aquinas regarding the virtues and gifts of the Holy Spirit. It aims to provide a consistent structure and systematic instruction for youth to learn about the virtues so that they can form the habits and dispositions necessary to live as disciples of Jesus Christ. This curriculum emphasizes Christian discipleship as indispensable toward human flourishing and the quest for joy. It has been developed in response to the call for a New Evangelization, firmly conveying the reality that happiness is found in a life of holiness.

In the school setting, the call to discipleship is extended not only to our students but also to our parents, the faculty and staff. It is the fruit of a personal encounter with Christ which affects one's intellectual, spiritual, physical, and social life. "The disciple of Christ must not only keep the faith and live on it, but also profess it, confidently bear witness to it, and spread it" (CCC, 1816).

"Learning about the virtues is indispensable for growing in the Christian life. By practicing the virtues, we not only become all that we are meant to be as human persons, but even more, we more fully reflect the light of Jesus Christ to all we meet." Fr. Brad
