

# The Young Church St. Dominic's Youth Ministry

Who are the youth of St. Dominic's?
They are disciples, Christ's hands and feet in our parish and within the larger community. These young men and women can best be described as inquisitive and eager to grow in faith.
They are generous with their time and their desire to serve.

An aspect of youth ministry most of us are familiar with is teen confirmation preparation. Currently, there are one hundred-thirty teens preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation. You will find them on campus on Sundays and Mondays, participating in small group gatherings and activities. Confirmation is a big part of youth ministry, but ministry with youth is not a single program, it is comprehensive. It extends beyond confirmation and is reflected in eight Church ministries outlined by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. These ministries include: community life, justice & service, evangelization, leadership, pastoral care, prayer & worship, advocacy, and catechesis. Just like the adults in our parish, the young Church is diverse and so are the opportunities offered to them.

Youth Ministry is the work of each family and the work of the Church. It is an important way young people are prepared for mission beyond the Church walls. Ministry prepares the baptized for mission; it is our Baptism that sends us forth to transform the world and to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

#### Youth Advisory Council

St. Dominic's Youth Advisory Council includes eight teens who meet once a month to plan activities and gatherings for the youth of St. Dominic's Parish.

Last year, council member Adriana V. formed a teen, Right to Life group that supported the Walk for Life – West Coast as well as 40 Days for Life. The council looks forward to monthly, "Hot Topic" gatherings, the first which will begin on Sunday, October 28<sup>th</sup>. 
#### Reflecting on the Psalms

#### **Adoption: Faith in Action**



After we got married in 2010, as most couples are, my husband and I were excited to begin our family. But as we learned before too long, what we had in mind and what God had in mind were just a little different. Six months after the wedding I was diagnosed with breast cancer. And after a year of (successful!) treatment, we

learned that having biological children ultimately was not in the cards for us. That didn't dampen our desire for a family, though, and we quickly turned to adoption as the way we would welcome children into our lives.

Between our families, Neil and I have four nieces and nephews who were adopted. We knew it could be a lengthy and complicated process, but we also knew there were amazing payoffs. We waited three years before we were matched with our first child's birth mother. During that time we had plenty of opportunities to be doubtful of the process and feel down on our luck, but ultimately we trusted that God had a plan for us. The plan began on May 21<sup>st</sup> 2015, when we were called to the hospital in Fairfield, CA to welcome our first son, Matthew, into the world. Three years later, this April 22<sup>nd</sup>, we met Teddy at a South Carolina hospital where he was born. We held each of our boys in our arms just minutes after they were born, and they'll forever be our children.

Not only are we thankful for our two beautiful, healthy boys, we are eternally grateful to their birth moms, who each made the difficult decision to have their babies knowing that they would not be the ones to raise them. Our birth moms are a part of our extended family now. They each had different reasons for placing their children for adoption, but they are both brave and beautiful women who played critical roles in our becoming a family. Their actions were out of pure love.

We'd be happy to talk to anyone about our experience with adoption, and we're so glad to be able to share our story as we come together as a parish to celebrate life.

# LITURGY NOTES MUSIC QUESTIONS

We do quite a bit of singing at Mass and sometimes we might not be sure what or why we are supposed to sing. I thought I would try to answer some of the common questions that I have received regarding the music or music ministers in Liturgy:

Is it all right to applaud for the musicians at the end of Mass when they do an especially good job?

To applaud for the musicians implies that they are performers and that we are an audience. In reality, the primary musicians at Mass are the members of the assembly. The people up front (or in the choir loft) are there to assist us with our music. The question is perhaps easier to understand if it is asked in terms of the homilist, lector, or communion minister. Is it appropriate to applaud for these ministers when they do a good job? Clearly it is not. Likewise, we would not applaud for the musicians, no matter how wonderful they are. On some occasions, when the liturgy as a whole has been exceptional, it might be appropriate for the assembly to applaud for itself as an acclamation of joy and praise. However, a more liturgical response might be to sing another song if the joy is so pregnant it cannot be contained.

Is it all right to have more than one cantor at Mass?

The primary purpose of the cantor is to lead the assembly in song and to encourage the assembly to sing, to proclaim the Word of God in singing the responsorial psalm, and to assist with their responsorial singing. The number of people who do this ministry at a given liturgy is not important. In fact, Music in Catholic Worship says, "Provision would be made for at least one to two properly trained singers, especially where there is no possibility of setting up even a small choir" (35). What is important is that the assembly is given clear direction and feel invited to participate. If two or three cantors seem to the assembly to be a small singing group that is focused on itself or is singing only to demonstrate its own virtuosity, the assembly is not likely to participate. If, however, two or three cantors join together to give strength to each other and out of that confidence they lend confidence to the assembly, they are acting as effective liturgical ministers.

Were those some of the questions you wondered about? Do you have a question about Music or other practices you see in the Liturgy? Please know that if you have been wondering about something, I can guarantee that others are too. I would be happy to answer any questions you might have. 
