

St. Dominic's Catholic Church Annual Report to the Faithful

We wish to begin by thanking you, the community of St. Dominic's, for your generosity. Because of you, the daily work of preaching and living the Gospel here at St. Dominic's continues to thrive. Over these past few years, we have maintained strong cash reserves and have been able to operate without debt. In addition to supporting the day-to-day operations of the parish, your generosity provided for several deferred maintenance and repair projects that were long overdue:

Parish Hall Makeover (total cost \$49,000):
New Roof, Capitals and Paint
Upgraded LED lighting
New Refrigerator

Church Stabilization & Repair (Total cost \$32,000)

Three 15' concrete pillars were installed and secured to the buttresses on the sacristy side of the church to prevent further movement and the large cracks on the outside of the church were filled to prevent water intrusion.

On the next page, we provided a summary of the parish's financial position for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018. Here are a few of the important points:

Offertory collections represent 84% of our operating income. This money is what we use to pay our day-to-day expenses.

Although Offertory collections increased \$44,718 from the previous year, we did lose one Sunday's collection due to the burglary on June 18, 2018.

Our expenses also increased by \$70,472 from the previous year, largely due to new equipment leases, building repairs and maintenance and increased programming. However, we have already made significant changes to reduce expenses in the new fiscal year.

We were on track to end the year with a small profit, but unfortunately, due to the burglary we ended the year with a loss of <\$9,287>.

We are continuously looking at where we can reduce expenses, but we also need your help. There are additional deferred maintenance projects that need to be done this year including new windows in the parish hall and parking lot sealing and paving.

At this time, we ask that you prayerfully consider one or all of the following ways to help us better meet our expenses:

Register with the parish to receive donation envelopes.

Increase your weekly, monthly or quarterly donations by any amount.

Ask your employer about matching gifts, designate your Mandatory Retirement Distribution (MRD), or donate stock to St. Dominic's.
