





LET US BEGIN THE JOURNEY OF LENT

Even before the first note of any song is sung, or before any words are spoken when we enter into Church, we realize that something is different. In just a short time, we will begin in earnest the season of Lent. During Lent we are called again to a time of conversion, a time for prayer and introspection, a time to build an even deeper relationship with our God. In some ways, we go to the spiritual desert for a time of retreat and renewal. To help us on this journey, the liturgy and the environment of the Church change to help us enter more deeply into this sacred time.

The moment one enters the Church, it is apparent that the environment of the Church has taken a dramatic turn from the previous Sunday of Ordinary Time. Gone are all flowers, plants and greenery. Many often compare this stark environment to that of the same desert environment that Jesus went to as he prepared to enter Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. Another perspective is that as we enter into this sacred "retreat", the bareness of the environment is reflective of what is happening on our own spiritual journey, Lent gives us the opportunity to clear away the clutter and the distractions so we can reflect upon our relationship with God. The colors of the vestments and all the materials change from the green of Ordinary Time to the purple hues that represent the penitential nature of the season.

The words of the liturgy also change during the Lenten Season. Two prayers, the Gloria and the Gospel Acclamation – "the Alleluia" are not sung during Lent. The Gloria is an ancient hymn and has its origins from an Easter hymn of dawn. Because of this festive and special characteristic, the Church calls us not to sing it during Lent. The Alleluia is also a joyful proclamation that like the Gloria is festive and special, so it too is omitted during Lent.

We will be reminded of this time for prayer and introspection even further as we observe moments of silence during Mass. Instead of singing songs during the offertory or recessional, at some Masses we will observe silence to emphasize that bareness of environment and continue to reflect on the Scripture we have just heard proclaimed. It isn't that the choirs or musicians are "forgetting" to play or sing, this is with purpose.

Thomas Merton offers a wonderful description of the First Sunday of Lent. He writes, "The dramatic, medieval rites of Ash Wednesday may perhaps make a stronger and more immediate appeal to our feelings. The Mass of the first Sunday however leads us deeper into the real mystery of Lent, uniting us more profoundly and more directly with the Christ who, praying and fasting in us will purify us and offer us together with himself to the Father in the glory of his Easter victory."

Confirmation of adults is offered twice a year in our diocese. The next Confirmation Mass will take place on the Vigil of Pentecost, Sat. June 8, 2019 at 5:00 p.m. the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament.

This special Mass is for adults who were baptized in the Church, received First Holy Communion and have been regularly attending Mass, but were never confirmed. Those who have not received First Holy Communion and have not been attending Mass regularly should be treated as candidates in the RCIA process.

It is the parish's responsibility to prepare candidates for Confirmation based on the four pillars of the Catechism, with a special emphasis on the rites of initiation. Candidates should receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before Confirmation.
