## Pastor's Corner

### The Rosary Works

A treasure map does not become worthless because it is old. Nobody finds a treasure map and throws it away simply because it is old. The value of a treasure map is not determined by how new or old it is. The value of a treasure map is determined by two factors. Does the map lead to treasure? How great is the treasure?

The Rosary is like an ancient treasure map. It has led countless men and women from all walks of life to the treasures of peace, joy, clarity, and contentment. If you're willing to give it a try and follow where it leads, you'll find the Rosary is a rich prayer that can transform your life.

1. Peace. We live hectic lives in a chaotic world. All this can lead to a confusion that fogs the mind, unsettles the soul, and leads to poor decisions. Amidst all this chaos and confusion our souls yearn for peace and clarity. There is just something about the Rosary that settles our hearts and minds. It reaches deep down into our souls and puts us at ease, creating a peace that is rare and beautiful.

2. Always What We Need. The Rosary is ever fresh, ever new, and deeply personal. Every time we pray it, we can have a completely different experience than we did yesterday or last week. Of course, the Rosary doesn't change, but we do. Our questions change. Our struggles and concerns change. Our faith and doubts change. Where we are in our journey with God changes. The Rosary provides the context, the format, and the process for God to speak to us about all these things.

3. Mary. Nobody sees the life of a child the way that child's mother does—not even the father. This is Mary's perspective of Jesus' life. She has a unique perspective. It seems that every genuine Christian, not just Catholics, should be interested in that perspective—and not just interested, but fascinated. In the Rosary we ponder the life of Jesus through the eyes of his mother. This is an incredibly powerful experience if we enter into it fully.

4. Epic Moments. When we pray the Rosary, we reflect on some of the most epic moments in history. For example, the Annunciation, Mary's moment, the moment when her "yes" changed the world. Imagine the monumental courage that would have required. Think about it. Everything hung in the balance. What would have happened if Mary had said no? And there are 20 of these moments in the different mysteries of the Rosary. Imagine what we can learn.

5. Slow Down. Praying the Rosary regularly encourages us to slow down, which in turn should encourage us to live life at a different pace than the rest of the world. We learn from Mary how to look at an experience, hold it in our hearts, and ponder what it means for our lives. This slower pace also allows us to be present. The Rosary will teach you to be 100% present to whoever and whatever is in front of you at any given moment.

### New Mass Intention Policy

Masses for the remainder of 2019 sold out early in September. This presents a problem when someone wants to offer a Mass for a recently deceased loved one, and the next available is three months away; if there is one available at all. Due to the limited number of Mass intentions offered each month, and the speed at which they sell out, we have a new Mass Intention Policy.

- ♦ Mass intentions will now open only **ONE** month in advance on the 1st. This means January 2020 Mass intentions will not be available until December 1, 2019. (February will open January 1, March will open February 1, etc.)
- ♦ Families will be limited to purchasing three (3) Mass intentions per month.

We hope this new policy will give everyone the same opportunity to have Mass said for their loved ones.

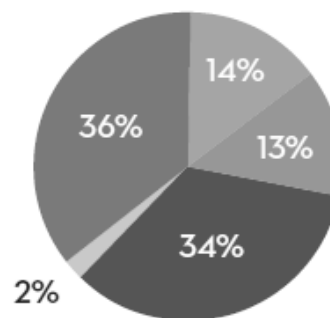
