## **Pastor's Corner**

Some upcoming changes

The Diocese of Sacramento recently issued new Guidelines for Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC). After receiving and reviewing the guidelines, I sought the advice and input of a number of long-time parishioners and EMHC's. These changes will put us in compliance with these Guidelines. Except for the first, which is already in place, they will take effect on the First Sunday of Advent, December 1.

The first change is actually a matter of the Church's universal law (Canon Law): namely that EMHC's be at least 16 and Confirmed. It has been the parish's practice to allow teenagers in the Confirmation preparation program to serve as Extraordinary ministers. Therefore, as a transitionary step toward full compliance, I instructed Lisa Toomey not to offer being an EMHC for this year's Year I students, but to allow the Year II students to continue to serve this year.

The second is that the guidelines instruct parishes that there be two chalices with the Precious Blood of Christ for every one station with the Body of Christ. Currently at most Sunday Masses, we have four of each. This will actually reduce the number of EMHC's needed for each Mass after December 1. We tried to think if there was a way to add a 3rd station with the Body of Christ (and 5th and 6th stations of the Precious Blood), but could not find a configuration with easy and logical flow.

Related to this change, we will be doing away with the "runner," who currently brings the Eucharist to the back of the Church. Liturgically speaking, the focus of the Communion Procession is the whole congregation coming forward to the sanctuary to receive the Body and Blood of Jesus; except for those with mobility issues, the home bound and those in the hospital, there is no "delivery" for Holy Communion. Therefore, the ushers and I will be asking those with mobility issues to please sit in the two section of pews immediately in front of the sanctuary steps (next to the El Greco St. Dominic and Our Lady of Guadalupe, facing each other rather than the altar) or in the first row of pews. That way, the priests, deacons, and EMHC's will begin by distributing Holy Communion to those in those sections. I realize that this may be the most difficult change for a few of you, since I am asking you to change where you sit for Mass.

Finally, the prayer offered by EMHC's for those not receiving Holy Communion will be, "Christ be with you." The Guidelines also make it clear that we priests are not to extend an invitation to those who are not Catholic or those who are not receiving Holy Communion for whatever reason the option of coming forward for a blessing. This will mostly affect funerals and weddings, where typically many in the congregation do not receive Holy Communion. That being said, anyone who comes forward with her or his arms crossed at any Mass here at St. Dominic's will continue to be blessed by a priest or deacon or prayed over by an EMHC with the formula above. Again, the primary reason for the Communion Procession is to receive Holy Communion, not receive a blessing. And in fact, everyone receives the priest's blessing a few minutes later in the Mass, just before the dismissal.

I know change is never easy and I understand that some changes around Holy Communion were made in this last year here. I hope my explanations help you to see that these are not arbitrary on my part, rather they are with the goal of keeping us in harmony with practices of our local church, and the Diocese of Sacramento.



#### St. Dominic's Catholic Church Annual Report to the Faithful

Thank you for your generosity. Because of you, the daily work of preaching and living the Gospel at St. Dominic's continues to thrive. On the next page, you will find a summary of the parish's financial position for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019. Here are a few important points:

Our expenses were under budget by \$43,412.

We finished the fiscal year with offertory collections below budget by <\$43,995>, down 16% from the previous year.

The fiscal year ended with Net Income of \$19,245 only because we received the \$19,000 insurance settlement for the burglary.

We recently reviewed our results for the first quarter of this fiscal year, and in the spirit of timely reporting, we are providing those results as well.

Expenses are under budget by \$7,395.

Offertory collections are below budget by <\$31,477>, despite not budgeting for an offertory increase this year.

These deficits in offertory collections, both last fiscal year and the first quarter of this year, are cause for concern.

We are always looking for opportunities to reduce expenses, but please be aware that if we continue to fall short of our offertory budget, then we will need to eliminate valuable parish programs.

At this time, we ask that you prayerfully consider one or all of the following ways to help balance our budget:

Increase your weekly, monthly or quarterly donations by 5% to 10%.
