Pastor's Corner

Behind Locked Doors

We are, like the first disciples on the first Easter, each in our homes behind closed doors. Unlike our spiritual forbears, it is not because we had the you-know-what scared out of us during Jesus' Passion or because we are ashamed of abandoning Him at His moment of greatest need. Nor will we be able to get together, still behind closed doors, any time soon, to lick our collective wounds. Today we mark one month under the state-wide shelter-in-place order to slow the spread of COVID-19 in our community and with our governor's six-point plan, it looks to be some time yet before we will be able to gather.

More importantly than our homes, there are still places in our hearts and souls that are locked as securely as we can make them. Those are the places where the Risen Lord desires to come and bring His peace. He desires to heal our deepest wounds, fears, and all those things we keep well away from the light of day, much less the light of God. It is fairly easy to invite the Lord to come into our homes, but those other places are much more challenging!

Jesus' appearances after His Resurrection show us that His resurrected body has no trouble entering into locked places; He is not limited to where He can go. Thomas' absence on Easter night shows us that we still have to be present, we still have to be there in those dark places. Jesus does not force Himself; while He can go, he much prefers to be invited. Thomas left the door open, as it were, when he joined the other Apostles the next week. Then Jesus could show His mercy to Thomas, as He did to the others the week before, by offering His peace.

The Lord knew not only the sins but the hearts of His most intimate followers. He knew they were weak, with the exception of His and our Blessed Mother, but He also saw what they could become: the people God the Father made them to be at the moment of their conception. I am convinced this is how God sees us: not the sum total of our sins and mistakes, but the greatness for which each of us was made. So when He goes behind the locked doors in our hearts and souls, it's not to expose us or humiliate us, it is to bring His healing and forgiveness: to bring us God's infinite mercy.

As we continue our celebration of Easter, let us resolve to let Christ into the totality of our lives, not just the pretty places, the neat places, the places where we have everything together, but everywhere. Let us let the glory of Christ's Resurrection permeate our beings and allow ourselves, even now, to be transformed in the image of God's crucified, Risen, and glorified Son.
