Pastor's Corner

Quiet and silence

We all need peace and quiet in our lives, and we need it regularly. It not only refreshes the totality of our person, but it also helps us to stay focused on what is important and to let go of what is extraneous. Neuroscience shows rather than being a waste of time or an extravagant luxury, it is an essential part of healthy living. It should come as no surprise then that meditative practices are part of every major religion, including Catholic Christianity. However, we Catholics need to break our ingrained, misguided idea that quiet prayer and meditation is only for cloistered monks and nuns. It is for everybody!

For me, my time is early in the morning. I usually get up between 4:30 and 5:00 so I can run, walk, or otherwise exercise, shower, have a cup of coffee and do my Holy Hour before joining the other friars for Lauds (morning prayer). I have learned about myself (by *much* trial and error) that if I don't get it done early in the morning, it is almost guaranteed not to happen. That is the first important lesson in searching for quiet time: finding that time when you are most receptive and most likely to follow through.

One of the things I appreciate most about being outside so early is dearth of human noises and the abundance of nature sounds like waves, birds, insects, and, in one place, frogs. These natural sounds help me to connect viscerally with the cool air, the moonlight, and the subtle, beautiful sky with its ever-changing tapestry of clouds, sky and stars. These keep the internal chatter that inevitably fills my mind once my "work" day begins at the distant edges of my awareness. They are present, but the symphony of the outdoors and the canvas of the view have a gentle, peaceful way of staying at the forefront of my attention, without being obnoxious or aggressive, like the chatter can be.

This guiet prepares me for the silence of my Holy Hour. This is my time simply to be with Our Lord Jesus in the Eucharist, to be like Mary of Bethany and simply sit at the feet of the Divine Master. Some mornings, I really have to work at keeping my worries (real and perceived), thoughts (noble and banal), plans, disappointments, and the countless other things that fill my brain at bay. Other mornings, the quiet from outside follows me into the chapel. After all, this is why meditation is called practice: we need to work at it! Nevertheless, sounds come in too, usually one of my Dominican brothers coming down into the kitchen for his first cup of coffee. The trick is to let them go just a quickly as they came. I need to resist the temptation to engage in the chatter. (Oh X., don't leave that dirty spoon on the counter! Etc., etc.) Again, this is part of the practice: simply allowing those things I have no control over simply to be present - not stealing my attention - while my

awareness is on the Lord. If my attention does wander, I bring it back to Jesus' Presence simply and without reproach.

I hope finding or strengthening your own quiet and silent time is something you have done during these days when all of our routines have been disrupted. If you haven't, I encourage you to start. Working on your practice of quiet and silence can be one of the unexpected gains you take from this time. Once that time is a treasured part of your day and you feel its benefits, it will then be something you don't give up easily.


