

Outdoor Mass ~ As We Gather

The Friars, Deacons and parish staff are excited to welcome you to celebrate outdoor Mass.

We have missed all of you!

We have obtained our Temporary COVID-19 Outdoor Activities and Encroachment Agreement from the city of Benicia. The health and safety of our parishioners and staff are our number one priority. We ask for your cooperation, patience, and prayers during this unprecedented time.

Mass Options and Info:

- The decree issued by Bishop Soto on March 13, 2020 dispensing ALL the faithful from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy days of Obligation remains in effect.
- Individuals age 65+, and persons with compromised health conditions, are asked to continue with the shelter-in place-instituted by state and local authorities.
- If you are exhibiting any symptoms, such as a fever, runny nose, cough, or sneeze, please stay home.
- Outdoor Mass will be celebrated on Sundays at 9:00am and 11:00am weather permitting.
- As per Bishop Soto if the forecast calls for temperatures of 90 degrees or above we are to cancel the outdoor Mass. In the event that this happens we will have a live-stream Mass.
- Masses are being live-streamed Monday-Friday at 8:15am and Sunday at 7:00am & 1:00pm (English/Spanish); these are not be open to the public.

Here's what you can expect when you arrive for outdoor Mass: Located in the Small Parking Lot Behind the Church

- MASKS ARE REQUIRED WHEN ON OUR PREMISES. They must be worn covering your mouth and nose at all times.
- The only entrance to Mass will be between the school and the Parish Hall from the large parking lot. Signs will be posted throughout the area.
- To facilitate contact tracing should someone become ill, you will be asked to provide your last name and telephone number upon entry.
- No gathering before or after Mass. Please line up on designated 6 ft. markers.
- Bring your hats, sunglasses, sunscreen and chairs. There will be a few chairs available for those with mobility issues.
- Seating will begin 30 minutes before Mass. Please be sure to arrive early to ensure seating before Mass starts.
- Greeters will be screening and seating attendees. Please follow their instructions.
- Seating spaces will be assigned to you and those you live with only. Once you are seated you
 may not switch seats or move from your location.
- Worship Aids are available in the bulletin online and in myParish app.
- Restrooms will not be available during Mass.

To ensure the safety of all attendees:

- Please do not sing.
- Please cough or sneeze into a tissue or your elbow.
- There will be no offertory collection. Baskets for donations will be available at check in.
- Please do not hold hands during the Our Father.
- Please follow the usher's instructions during Communion and dismissal.
- Hand Sanitizer is required upon entry and available after Communion.

Pastor's Corner

I am really missing you!

I am a confirmed introvert who masquerades as an extrovert on Sundays. For most of my priesthood, I took Monday as my day off. The reason? Because I am drained after doing what I love and what I am called to: celebrating Masses, preaching, and being with my parishioners all day long, and sometimes throwing in a Baptism or a confession or two, all this after a full week of ministry. A mentor of mine, who was as extroverted as they come, once tried to convince me that I was an extrovert. He told me, "Carl, you're as warm and friendly as I am; you greet and talk to as many people as I do, and you do it with a smile." I told him while that was true, the difference is that at the end of Sunday (or any other busy day), he can't sleep because he is wired up and full of energy; I, on the other hand, am exhausted. He looked genuinely startled, "Really?" He asked me. "Really!" I said. That is the difference between introverts and extroverts.

I confess that when we began the shelter in place, I enjoyed not having all sorts of meetings, one-on-one and especially various sizes of groups, both here in Benicia and for the Diocese and Province hither, thither, and yon. Honestly: it felt like a weird kind of vacation. Now, months on, we are back into it, and things are very different.

This past week, I was allowed to go to the hospital to minister to two dying patients for the first time in months. It is always sobering to be with those who will be leaving this world soon, but I came home from the hospital feeling happy. When reflecting on that odd reaction and on a conversation I had earlier in the week, it hit me. After months of celebrating Mass in an empty church, chatting with only a very few of you (often in Safeway), not ministering to the sick and the dying, making off-the-cuff videos to share my thoughts, during those visits I got to be a priest like I know how to be a priest: up close and personal. It was a breath of fresh air.

Nothing in my training or my experience prepared me for being a priest or the pastor of a parish when my primary contact with parishioners is mediated through a screen. Like all of us, I am in new territory and learning everyday how to navigate it. And again, I have to confess that I do not like the feeling of being a newbie, of not knowing what I'm "supposed" to be doing or how best to do it, of facing a steep learning curve that sometimes looks like Mt. Everest.

Now I am tired for another reason: because I miss you and I can't be your priest and pastor in the way I know how to be. Change is hard! This whole situation is taxing us emotionally and spiritually in ways that we haven't even imagined yet. I know I need to keep being reminded and accepting of this fact, and I expect you do too. I hope my sharing my little moment of self-insight will help you grasp and articulate a little moment of light for you, because only together and with the grace of God, will we get through this with our lamps burning brightly.


