Welcome Br. Gregory

With great joy and excitement, as well as deep gratitude to God, I am returning to St. Dominic's in Benicia after my previous assignment here in 2015–2016! To help all the brothers and sisters in our parish know me a little better, I would like to take this opportunity to share a little bit about myself.


I was born and raised in a Catholic family in Taipei, Taiwan, where Catholics are a minority among the minority Christian populations (About only 1% of the population in Taiwan is Catholic). I am extremely grateful that growing up, my parents instilled in me a strong Catholic identity and the conviction that the Church is my home no matter where I am. In my teenage years, all I wanted to be was a great scientist, and during high school, I fell in love with chemistry. In the meantime, people at my parish asked me if I had ever thought about being a priest.

When I was seventeen, I moved to Toronto, Canada, where I continued to pursue my dream of becoming a famous chemist. Even as an undergraduate student, I worked in the lab every day. This passion for research took me to the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign and UC Berkeley. Although I was completely absorbed in lab work, God never stopped nagging me. During my undergraduate years, several priests approached me from various communities to see if I was interested in discerning whether I have a vocation for the priesthood. However, I was always in denial.

While living in Berkeley, I was a parishioner of St. Mary Magdalen's parish, and our very own Fr. David Farrugia was my pastor. God's nagging voice came back through the questions of parishioners, and I finally gave in. On the parish bulletin, I found out about the come-and-see weekend held at St. Albert's Priory, the house of studies of the student brothers in the Western Dominican Province. I signed up and was blown away. I loved praying with the community every day, and I fully identified with the Dominican mission of preaching the Gospel. The joy among the brothers also made a deep impression on me. Let's just say, the rest is history.

I entered the Dominican Order in 2012, first as a novice at St. Dominic's, San Francisco. A year later, I moved to St. Albert's Priory, Oakland, and started studying philosophy at Dominican School of Philosophy and Theology, Berkeley. After I completed all my course work in philosophy, I had a year of very happy and fruitful ministries at St. Dominic's, Benicia, under the mentorship of Fr. Jerome and Fr. Corwin. Then I returned to DSPT for my theological studies, during which I had the great blessing of studying at the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas (commonly known as the Angelicum) in Rome, which is the pontifical university run by the Dominican Order. This was truly a fantastic opportunity for me to learn from some of the best theologians in the world and to know Dominican friars from around the world. By God's grace, I was ordained as a deacon in September 2019, and I have been preaching since that time. Having very recently finished the initial formation for priestly ministries, I am looking forward to serving you now as a deacon, and soon as your priest, using all that I have learned in the past eight years.

Helpful Hints & Reminders For Mass

Thank you to all our parishioners for following these guidelines to help us to stay open.

- Bishop Soto Decree Dispensation dated 3/13/2020 releasing ALL faithful from obligation to attend Mass remains in effect.
- Please Stay Home With symptoms of sickness, fever, runny nose, trouble breathing & cough.
- Masks are Mandatory As of 6/18/2020
 Benicia & California Mandates masks for everyone over the age of 2 (covering both your nose and mouth).
- Contract Tracing Names & numbers are collected at entrance for notification in the event someone is sick.
- 5. **Ushers/Greeters** Will seat you, usher you for Communion, and dismiss you please wait for them to signal you to go.
- 6. **30 minutes prior to Mass** Doors open and seating starts.
- Avoid Late Arrival Please be earlier than you normally would to ensure seating and less disruption to others already in Mass. Late arrivals could be turned away if seating is not available.



Matthew 13:1-23 + A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

On that day, Jesus went out of the house and sat down by the sea. Such large crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat down, and the whole crowd stood along the shore. And he spoke to them at length in parables, saying: "A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seed fell on the path, and birds came and ate it up. Some fell on rocky ground, where it had little soil. It sprang up at once because the soil was not deep, and when the sun rose it was scorched. and it withered for lack of roots. Some seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked it. But some seed fell on rich soil, and produced fruit, a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold. Whoever has ears ought to hear." The disciples approached him and said, "Why do you speak to them in parables?" He said to them in reply, "Because knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven has been granted to you, but to them it has not been granted. To anyone who has, more will be given and he will grow rich; from anyone who has not, even what he has will be taken away. This is why I speak to them in parables, because they look but do not see and hear but do not listen or understand. Isaiah's prophecy is fulfilled in them, which says: You shall indeed hear but not understand, you shall indeed look but never see. Gross is the heart of this people, they will hardly hear with their ears, they have closed their eyes, lest they see with their eyes and hear with their ears and understand with their hearts and be converted, and I heal them. "But blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear. Amen, I say to you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it. "Hear then the parable of the sower. The seed sown on the path is the one who hears the word of the kingdom without understanding it, and the evil one comes and steals away what was sown in his heart. The seed sown on rocky ground is the one who hears the word and receives it at once with joy. But he has no root and lasts only for a time. When some tribulation or persecution comes because of the word, he immediately falls away. The seed sown among thorns is the one who hears the word. but then worldly anxiety and the lure of riches choke the word and it bears no fruit. But the seed sown on rich soil is the one who hears the word and understands it, who indeed

bears fruit and yields a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold."
