Pastor's Corner

One of the things I did on my day off was to clean the desk in my room. I am embarrassed to admit that in one pile of papers, I came across some unopened birthday cards, along with opened ones. From back in June. <face palm> It turned out to be both the most unpleasant and the most joyful surprise of the day. After my initial reaction subsided, I decided to re-read the opened cards and read the unopened ones. (And yes, mom, I finished cleaning my room!) What started as an "oh no!" moment ended up being a glow of gratitude that was with with me for the rest of the day. Thank you for all the cards and gifts to celebrate my big 5-0. It says a lot to me about who YOU are that you have been so exceptionally warm, kind, and generous to me in my first year here.

The 5th century BC Greek philosopher Heraclitus said bluntly, "There is nothing permanent except change." Another of his thoughts expresses the same sentiment, but a bit more poetically, "You can never step into the same river; for new waters are always flowing on to you." We have two weekends of outdoor Masses, attendance growing each weekend. On Wednesday and Thursday this week, our school children came to campus pick up supplies and the uniforms for this year. The "First Day of School" Mass was live-streamed, as they begin this year online. We've had three babies baptized outside in the amphitheater behind the church as well as our first outdoor funeral Mass. Br. Gregory has arrived, and he (and we!) are waiting for him to be ordained to the priesthood. Fr. Brad has been gone over two weeks now and is finishing his cross-country trek to Washington, D.C., having visited family and friends along the way. And we await the arrival of our new Residency Brother, Br. John Peter, while still missing our last one, Br. Athanasius.

Transitions and new beginnings are a time of uncertainty and even anxiety. We are leaving what is comfortable and familiar for the new and unexpected. Even here, memory is a gift. As we face the future, we can recall how things in the past have worked out in ways that we never expected. We remember how God, our family, friends, colleagues, and others helped us get through things that seemed daunting or overwhelming. We also remember when we helped someone else get through a difficult situation; at the moment, we may have been unaware how we important our presence was.

In the end, transitions are a time pregnant with the possibility of new beginnings. It is precisely in the newness and uncertainty, in the unknown, where God can work powerfully. If we surrender the illusion of control and are open to what has not yet come to be, we will be richly rewarded. With our cooperation and love, God can work in and through us more than we can ever ask or even imagine! (*cf.* Eph. 3:20)



Dominican Saint of the Week August 17-23, 2020



August 19th: Blessed Jordan de Rivalto of Pisa, Friar and priest (right)

Jordan was born in 1255 in Pisa. He studied the use of preaching for evangelization and pioneered the use of the Tuscan language for preaching and lecturing. In Florence he would reportedly preach five times a day, walking about, both indoors and out, followed by a crowd of listeners as he developed his topic. During his lengthy sermons his friend and Disciple, Silvester of Valdiseve sat near the pulpit with wine to refresh him. Jordan's preaching was said to have a positive effect on Florentine public live and morality by its emphasis on sound (i.e. Thomistic) doctrine, Christian living and perseverance. Jordan died in 1311. Blessed Jordan of Pisa, pray for us.

August 17th: St. Hyacinth of Poland, Friar and Priest (left)

St. Hyacinth was one of the first members of Dominicans and the "apostle of the North", and is also called the "Apostle of Poland". On a visit to Rome he met St. Dominic and decided to join the order of preachers. He received the habit from St. Dominic himself in 1220. After his religious profession, he was make superior of a small band of missionaries and sent to Poland. They were well received and their sermons produced a deep conversion of the Polish people. He also founded communities in Sandomir, Krakow, and Moravia. His missionary work extended through out Prussia, Pomerania, Lithuania, Denmark, Sweden, Norway and Russia. He died in Krakow on August 15, 1257. St Hyacinth pray for us.

August 18th: Blessed Mannes O.P. Friar, Priest and Brother of St. Dominic. (not pictured)

Born in 1170, as one of his younger brother's first followers, he helped establish the Order in Paris and was entrusted with the care of Dominican nuns in Madrid. He was "a contemplative and holy man, meek and humble, joyful and kind, and a zealous preacher." Mannes died in 1235. Blessed Mannes pray for us.
