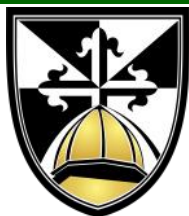

Pastor's Corner

Random thoughts

This week, I want to share two thoughts from my current spiritual reading, from one of the great saints of both the Eastern and Western churches, St. Maximos the Confessor (580-662). Although he wrote for a primarily eremitic and monastic audience, like any truly great pearls of wisdom, anyone can draw benefit if one is open.

The first reminds us to pay less attention to what others are doing and more attention to our own thoughts and actions. When we focus on the sins and shortcomings of others, real or perceived, we are disempowering ourselves and setting ourselves up for victimhood. We make our happiness contingent on others doing what we want them to do. That is not the way the physical or moral universe works: we are not in control. Rather, our true power comes from working on ourselves: always looking to Christ, repenting of our sins and mistakes, and using our skills, gifts, and charisms. This is how we can be the salt of the earth and the light of the work even in the darkest times.

"He who busies himself with the sins of others, or judges his brother on suspicion, has not yet even begun to repent or to examine himself so as to discover his own sins, which are truly heavier than a great lump of lead ... That is why, like a fool who walks in darkness, he no longer attends to his own sins but lets his imagination dwell on the sins of others, whether these sins are real or merely the products of his own suspicious mind."

The second reminds me of a classic saying about meditation: "Don't believe everything you think." Yet, as our interpersonal relationships continue to weaken, we are less and less inclined to allow others, even those we trust and love, to judge our thoughts and accept their judgement. We have come to the point when we think that for someone to reject or disagree with any thought, feeling, or reaction, they are rejecting us and doing so completely. We have forgotten that each of us can be, and often is, mistaken. Put another way, none of us possess all of the truth. We need one another to help sift through the chaff and keep what is good. We need to, again, always look to and hope in God, and build up both personal humility and the ability to be vulnerable to others.

"Just as parents have a special affection for the children who are the fruit of their own bodies, so the intellect naturally clings to its own thoughts. And just as to passionately fond parents their own children seem the most capable and the most beautiful of all – though they may be quite ridiculous in every way – so to the foolish intellect its own thoughts appear the most intelligent of all, though they may be utterly degraded. The wise man does not regard his own thoughts in this way. It is precisely when he feels convinced that they are true and good that he most distrusts his own judgment. He makes other wise men the judges of his thoughts and arguments – lest he should run, or may have run, in vain – and from them receives assurance."

Dominican Saint of the Week

August 24-30, 2020

August 23rd - **St. Rose of Lima, lay Dominican & virgin (right)**

St. Rose was born in 1586 in Lima, Peru to Spanish colonist and named Isabel Flores de Olivia and was an exceptional beauty. She was nicknamed Rose due to her beautiful face and completion. She had a deep calling to be a nun from an early age, but her parents opposed this idea wishing her to marry. To deter her many suitors, Rose marred her face with hot peppers causing blisters and lesions. Her father finally relented and allowed her to join the Third Order of St. Dominic at the age of 20. She lived a holy life dedicated to the poor, Rose followed a life of extreme prayer, fasting and penance. On one occasion, she burned her hands as a self-imposed act of penance. She was known to wear a heavy silver crown, with spikes that could pierce her flesh. The spikes reminded her of the Crown of Thorns. At one point one of the spikes become so logged in her skull that the crown was removed with great difficulty. St. Rose died on August 25, 1617. St Rose pray for us.



August 26th - **Blessed James Bianconi of Bevagna, friar and priest (left)**

Blessed James Bianconi was born in Bevagna in 1220. At the time of his birth, three new stars were seen in the sky containing the image of a friar preacher, Bl. James, Bl. Ambrose of Siena, and St. Thomas Aquinas. James became a member of the order of preachers in Spoleto in 1236 after meeting two Dominican friars that were preaching a Lenten mission. He helped to stop the Nicolaites heretical movement in Umbria and even managed to convert the leader of the movement back to the faith. Praying before a Crucifix, James was overcome with a sense of his own unworthiness and begged God some sign that his soul was to be saved. Blood gushed from the hands and side of the corpus on the cross, and a voiced from heaven told him he was saved. Some of the miraculous blood was preserved for more than two centuries and it worked many miracles, but it was stolen by heretics. Blessed James upon his death was brought a glass of water to drink, as it touched his lips it turned to wine. Blessed James died in 1301. Blessed James Bianconi pray for us.
