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Pastor's Corner

Like many of us, I am struggling to put what I am feeling into words these days. Sometimes putting together this piece of the bulletin, which I usually enjoy doing, simply doesn't happen. Such was the case this week, so I am again leaning on another of my favorite author for some insight.

...The problem comes when we never get around to talking about the hard part of the Good News. The problem can even be that we start forgetting it ourselves, and start believing that consolation is the main reason Jesus came. But what's wrong with us required much more than a hug; it required the Cross. It doesn't seem this way; we too, have been catechized by the world and reflexively think of ourselves as needy, wronged children. We'd rather feel as if we're victims of a cruel world than admit we are contributors to the world's cruelty, lost sinners who perversely love our lostness, clinging to our treasured sins like a drowning man to an anvil...

How bizarre such language seems today! We look around our neighborhood and our congregation and everyone seems so *nice*. We know what really wicked people are like - we see them in the papers every day - and we're not like that. God must find us, in comparison, quite endearing... With these and a thousand other sweet murmurs we shield ourselves from our real condition and remain Christian babies all our lives: pampered, ineffective, whiney, and numb...

... The Lord does not love us for our good parts and pass over the rest. He died for the bad parts and will not rest until they are put right. We must stop thinking of God as infinitely indulgent. We must begin to grapple with the scary and exhilarating truth that [God] is infinitely holy, and that He wants the same for us...

The insight is about our true condition. We begin to see our fallen inclinations the way God does, and realize how deep-rooted the rottenness in our hearts is. This awareness grows slowly, over many years, because He mercifully shows us only a little at a time. But He sees it all. His is like the eye of a surgeon, which sees through to the sickness deepest within. There is no other way for us to be healed...

Then we are free indeed: free from any need to hide, to conceal or impress, to make excuses for ourselves, to demand our fair share. Free to love God with abandon, free to love others without bargaining and conditions. Free to love even those who hurt us because, ultimately, nothing can hurt us. Knowing our own sin, we pray for all other sinners, asking God to show them the mercy He has given so abundantly to us...

Vallejo/Benicia/American Canyon CA – Beginning September 23rd thru November 1st 2020 we will be conducting our 40 Days For Life prayer vigil. Due to the COVID concerns and smoke problems from the CA fires we are proposing three ways you can participate in focused prayer for an end to abortion, for conversion of hearts, for mothers and fathers who feel they have no other choice, and for the unborn child who's very life is at risk. 1.) Focused visible prayer on the sidewalk of PP in Vallejo. Masks must be worn and people must be 6' apart, or you can park and pray in your car. 2.) We are offering a virtual-Zoom prayer hour each day at 3:00 pm during the vigil. Login info will be sent to those who wish to pray in this format. 3.) Please consider to commit to one hour in front of the Tabernacle at St. Dominic's, offering your prayers for this most important cause for life. Dominican Saint of the Week

September 18 - **St. Juan Macias, friar and Religious**
St. Juan was born in 1585 to poor farmers in a small town in Spain. Both of Juan's parents died when he was 4 years old. He was raised by his uncle and trained to be a shepherd, passing away the long hours in the mountains praying the rosary. When he was 16 he was introduced to the Dominican order while attending mass in adjoining village. At the age of 25 St. Juan was working for a wealthy businessman who offered him an opportunity to travel to South America. He set out to the Americas in 1619 arriving first in Colombia then Ecuador and eventually arriving in Lima Peru where he would remain for the rest of his life. On 23 January 1622 Juan entered the Dominican Priory of St. Mary Magdalene in Lima, as a lay brother, doing the manual labor necessary in the monastery. One year later he took his final vows. Juan Macias was well known mainly for two things during his life. First, his love for the rosary and secondly, for his generosity to the poor, 200 of whom he fed every day. As the priory porter, a position he held for 20 years went against his natural inclination of solitude and prayer, he served with joy as a discipline of his vow of obedience. St. Juan helped the Beggars, disabled people and other disadvantaged people; they flocked to him at the monastery gates for counsel and comfort. The poor came for food and the rich for advice. St. Juan Macias died of natural causes in 1645. Several miracles were attributed to St. Juan both in his life and after his death. He was beatified along with Martin de Porres, in 1837 by Pope Gregory XVI and canonized in 1975 by Pope Paul VI. St. Juan Macias pray for us.

September 19 - **Blessed Pio Alberto del Corona, friar and bishop**

Alberto del Corona was born on 5 July 1837, the fourth child of a shoe store owner. He felt a deep religious calling while he was a child and after pleading with his father, entered a convent of the Order of Preachers in 1854. Alberto took the religious name Pio in 1859 during his profession. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1860. He founded a religious order of sisters "Dominican Sisters of the Holy Spirit" with the blessing of Pope Pius IX in 1872. In 1874 he was made a bishop by Pope Leo XIII. In 1899 He was made an Assistant to the Pontifical Throne. He was chosen by the Pope to be a cardinal which he refused and was greatly relieved when the Pope chose someone else. Del Corona used an iron chain as a penitential belt and he often used a whip to lash himself as a form of penance. He was held in high esteem by Pope Leo XIII who once said "he is one of the most learned and holy prelates of the Church" and Pope Pius X stated "that one is a saint". The archbishop of Florence said he was "a good and faithful disciple of St. Dominic." He was declared blessed on September 19, 2015 by Cardinal Angelo Amato in the Name of Pope Francis. Blessed Pio Alberto del Corona pray for us.

After agreeing with them for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard. Going out about nine o'clock, the landowner saw others standing idle in the marketplace, and he said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard, and I will give you what is just.' So they went off. And he went out again around noon, and around three o'clock, and did likewise. Going out about five o'clock, the landowner found others standing around, and said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?' They answered, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard.' When it was evening the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Summon the laborers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and ending with the first.' When those who had started about five o'clock came, each received the usual daily wage. So when the first came, they thought that they would receive more, but each of them also got the usual wage. And on receiving it they grumbled against the landowner, saying, 'These last ones worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us, who bore the day's burden and the heat.' He said to one of them in reply, 'My friend, I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?' Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last." The Gospel of the Lord.
