Pastor's Corner

Br. Gregory became Fr. Gregory on Saturday! Br. Chrysostom Mijinke, OP, who did his Residency year here in Benicia in 2016-2017, along with two others, was ordained to the Diaconate. The heart of that Mass is, of course, the prayers of ordination. For your reflection this week, here are some excerpts from those prayers from older translations. Fr. Gregory will not be with us this weekend, but he will celebrate both the 9:00 & 11:00 Masses on Sunday, September 27. -Fr. Carl, OP

Ordination of Deacons:

Almighty God be present with us by your power. You are the source of all honor, you assign to each his rank, you give to each his ministry. You remain unchanged, but you watch over all creation and make it new through your Son, Jesus Christ, Our Lord: he is your word, your power and your wisdom ... In the first days of the Church under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit the apostles of your son appointed seven men of good repute to assist them in the daily ministry, so that they themselves might be more free for prayer and preaching. By prayer and laying on of hands the apostles entrusted to those chosen men the ministry of serving at tables. Lord, look with favor on these servants of yours whom we now dedicate to the office of Deacon, to minister at your holy altar. Lord, send forth upon them the Holy Spirit that they might be strengthened by the gift of your sevenfold grace to carry out faithfully the work of the ministry. May they excel in every virtue: in love that is sincere, in concern for the sick and the poor, in unassuming authority, in self-discipline, in holiness of life. May their conduct exemplify your commandments and lead your people to imitate their purity of life. May they remain strong and steadfast in Christ, giving to the world the witness of a pure conscience. May they in this life imitate your son, who came not to be served but to serve, and one day reign with him in heaven..."

Ordination of Priests

"Draw near, O Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God, author of human dignity: it is you who apportion all graces. Through you everything progresses; through you all things are made to stand firm. To form a priestly people you appoint ministers of Christ your Son by the power of the Holy Spirit, arranging them in different orders...You provided [the Apostles] with companions to proclaim and carry out the work of salvation throughout the whole world. And now we beseech you, Lord, in our weakness, to grant us this helper that we need to exercise the priesthood that comes from the Apostles. Grant, we pray, almighty Father, to this, your servant, the dignity of the priesthood; renew deep within him the spirit of holiness; may he henceforth possess this office which comes from you, O God, and is next in rank to the office of Bishop; and by the example of his manner of life may he instill right conduct. Together with us, may he be a faithful steward of your mysteries, so that your people may be renewed in the waters of rebirth and nourished from your altar; so that sinners may be reconciled and the sick raised up. May they be joined with us, Lord, in imploring your mercy for the people entrusted to their care and for all the world..."

Dominican Saint of the Week

September 22nd - Blessed Francisco Martin Fernandez de Posadas, Friar and Religious

Bl. Francis Posadas was born in Spain in 1644 to a poor family of limited means. His father died in his youth and his mother remarried to man who treated the young child with distain and crudeness. Thinking an education was wasted on the boy, he was apprenticed out to learn a trade. From a young child he was very close to the Virgin Mary, attended mass and prayed the rosary daily. He commenced his novitiate in 1663, but was treated with harshness and contempt by his Dominican brothers because he was from a poor family. The Scala Coeli fathers offered to take him and train him in Latin, but the vindictive dislike on the part of the prior almost prevented this from happening. His detractors within the order soon realized his holiness and patience and unanimously decided to admit him into the priesthood. Francisco modeled his priesthood on the life of St. Vincent Ferrer whom he chose as his patron. He was beatified by Pope Pius VII on 20 September 1818. Blessed Francisco Posadas pray for us.

September 22nd - Blesseds Hyacinth Serrano Lopez and 17 companions, Priest and martyrs

BI. Hyacinth Serrano Lopez and his 17 companions were martyred in the Spanish Civil War in the years 1934-1939 St. Pope John Paul II beatified them and the 215 others in 2001. In 2007 Pope Benedict XVI in the largest single beatification ever, beatified 498 martyrs the Spanish Civil War including 74 Dominicans.

September 24th - Blessed Dalmatius Moner, Friar and Priest

We think blessed Dalmatius was born in 1291 no record of his life exists before he entered the Order. He is best known for his life of poverty wearing only habits and cappa that were in tatters. He lived on hard bread and unseasoned vegetables to which he would add ashes during lent. He very rarely slept, but would take naps resting his head on the altar steps. He is credited with several miracles including healings and spiritual assistance. He was declared blessed in 1721 by Pope Innocent XIII. Blessed Dalmatius Moner pray for us.

September 25th - Blessed Mark Scalabrini of Modena, Friar and Priest.

Blessed Mark Scalabrini was born to the nobility in 1420. Joined the Dominicans in Modena, Italy and was ordained a priest. He was a noted preacher throughout central and northern Italy. Scalabrini was Prior of the Dominican monastery in Peraro, Italy. He performed many miracles both in life and after death. He was beatified by Pope Pius IX in 1857. Blessed Maark Scalabrini pray for us.

September 26th - Blessed Lorenzo of Ripafratta, Friar and Priest

Blessed Lorenzo was born to nobles in Pisa in 1373. He served as novice master in Cortona in the latter half of his career while distinguishing himself in aiding the ill during times of the plague in both Pistoia and Fabriano. He was beatified o April 4, 1851 by pope Pius IX. Blessed Lorenzo of Riparfatta pray for us.

Youth Ministry





Jesus told his disciples this parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out at dawn to hire laborers for his vineyard. After agreeing with them for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard. Going out about nine o'clock, the landowner saw others standing idle in the marketplace, and he said to them. 'You too go into my vineyard, and I will give you what is just.' So they went off. And he went out again around noon, and around three o'clock, and did likewise. Going out about five o'clock, the landowner found others standing around, and said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?' They answered, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You too go into my vinevard.' When it was evening the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Summon the laborers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and ending with the first.' When those who had started about five o'clock came, each received the usual daily wage. So when the first came, they thought that they would receive more, but each of them also got the usual wage. And on receiving it they grumbled against the landowner, saying, 'These last ones worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us, who bore the day's burden and the heat.' He said to one of them in reply, 'My friend, I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?' Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last." The Gospel of the Lord.
