Pastor's Corner

As we observe Labor Day this weekend, I offer some thoughts about work from one of my favorite theologians, Dorothy L. Sayers. She was one of the first women to graduate from Oxford University. As she had enough money to live on from writing her famous Lord Peter Wimsey stories and other fiction, she was able to do what she considered her real vocation: to write works of theology and apologetics. Her essay *Why Work?*, from which I quote, was first published in 1942. –Fr. Carl, OP

"I have already, on a previous occasion, spoken at some length on the subject of Work and Vocation. What I urged then was a thoroughgoing revolution in our whole attitude to work. I asked that it should be looked upon, not as a necessary drudgery to be undergone for the purpose of making money, but as a way of life in which the nature of man should find its proper exercise and delight and so fulfill itself to the glory of God. That it should, in fact, be thought of as a creative activity undertaken for the love of the work itself; and that man, made in God's image, should make things, as God makes them, for the sake of doing well a thing that is well worth doing."

"...we should no longer think of work as something that we hastened to get through in order to enjoy our leisure; we should look on our leisure as the period of changed rhythm that refreshed us for the delightful purpose of getting on with our work."

"...we should fight tooth and nail, not for mere employment, but for the quality of the work that we had to do. We should clamor to be engaged in work that was worth doing, and in which we could take pride."

"No crooked table legs or ill-fitting drawers ever, I dare swear, came out of the carpenter's shop at Nazareth. Nor, if they did, could anyone believe that they were made by the same hand that made Heaven and earth. No piety in the worker will compensate for work that is not true to itself; for any work that is untrue to its own technique is a living lie."

"She [the Church] has forgotten that the secular vocation is sacred ... The Apostles complained rightly when they said it was not meet they should leave the word of God and serve tables; their vocation was to preach the word. But the person whose vocation it is to prepare the meals beautifully might with equal justice protest: It is not meet for us to leave the service of our tables to preach the word."



Dominican Saint of the Week

September 6 - Blessed Julia Rodzinska, virgin and sister. Martyr of Poland.

Stanislawa Rodzinska was born in a small Polish village on March 16th 1899. The youngest of five children, she was born prematurely and was not expected to survive, consequently she was baptized two days after her birth. Stanislawa had a happy early childhood, but this happiness was cut short by the untimely death of both her parents. The family was broken up, the boys going with relatives while the girls were rescued by the nearby Dominican convent. The girls formed a close bond with the Mother superior calling her Mom. Stanislawa excelled in her studies and was sent to a teacher's college, as she was very fond of children and wished to instruct them in the faith. The draw of religious life was very strong, so on September 3rd, 1917 she received the Dominican habit and changes her name to Sr. Mary Julia. Sr. Mary Julia excelled in her vocation becoming a teacher, principal and superior. During WWII she organized underground religious classes and a clandestine program to give financial assistance to retired priest. In July 1943 Sr. Julia was arrested and placed in solitary confinement in the Gestapo Prison in Vilnus. A year later she was transferred by the Nazis to the concentration camp in Stutthof. While a prisoner in Stutthof, Sr. Julia organized secret Rosaries and shared what little food she had with others. She volunteered to take care of the sick and dying, however weakened by malnutrition and physical exertion, she contracted typhus and died on February 20, 1945. Blessed Julia Rodzinski, Martyr of Poland, pray for us.

September 6 - Blessed Michal (Jan Francizek) Czartoryski, priest. Martyr of Poland

Prince Jan Francizek Cazartoryski was born to Polish nobility on February 19, 1897. During WWI he was decorated in 1920 with the Cross of Valor for fighting in the front lines in defense of Lviv. In 1927 Prince Jan took the Dominican habit, taking the religious name of Michal. He was ordained a priest in 1931. Fr. Michal thought the greatest virtue in life was bravery- its most noble act martyrdom, "by an external and internal act, I am to show God that I love Him with a constant intention, constant concentration, constant respect, constant attachment, adherence, sacrifice I am to serve my Lord and Creator." During the "Warsaw Uprising" Fr. Michal was attending to the sick and wounded as Chaplin of the Third Home Army. He was shot and killed by Nazi troops on September 6, 1944. Blessed Michael Czartoryski, Martyer of Poland, pray for us.

Both Sr. Julia and Fr. Michal are two of the 108 Martyrs of Poland. Holy men and woman, who in the worst possible situation, witnessed the love of Jesus Christ to their fellow man. These 108 individuals were beatified in Warsaw on June 13, 1999 by Holy Father St. John Paul II.

"Because of their lives and pastoral activities and their barring witness to martyrdom, they sacrificed their lives for a free Poland."
