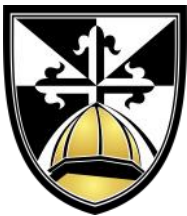

Dominican Saints of the Week

October 4th - **Our Holy Father Francis of Assisi**, deacon
Everyone knows his story, ask a Franciscan.

October 5th - **Blessed Raymond delle Vigne of Capua**, friar, priest and Master of the Order
Raymond of Capua was a leading member of the Dominican order and served as its Master General from 1380 until his death. First he was prior provincial of Lombardy, and then as Master General of the order Raymond undertook the restoration of the Dominican religious life. For his success in this endeavor, he is referred to as its second founder. He was born in 1330 in Capua to a member of a prominent family of that City. In 1350 while a student of law at the University of Bologna, he entered the Dominican order. Raymond was the spiritual director and Confessor of Saint Catherine of Siena. He spent six years advising her and hearing her confidences while Raymond gradually learned to trust her holiness and judgement. Blessed Raymond favored the development of a new interpretation of the observance, for which he drew upon The Franciscan example. For this work he gained the designation of being the second founder of the order of preachers. He was beatified by Leo XIII on the 500 anniversary of his death in 1899. Blessed Raymond of Capua pray for us

October 6th - **Blessed Bartolo Longo**, lay Dominican
Bartolo Longo was an Italian lawyer, born to a wealthy family, on February 10th 1841 in the small town of Latiano. He was a former satanic priest and returned to the Catholic faith and became a third order Dominican, dedicating his life to the rosary and the Virgin Mary. In the 1860s the Catholic church in Italy found itself at odds with a strong nationalist movement. General Giuseppe Garibaldi played a key role in Italian unification, saw the pope as an antagonist to Italian nationalism and actively campaigned for the elimination of the papal office all together. Many students at this time in Napoli dabbled in Witchcraft and consulted Neapolitan mediums. Longo became involved with a movement that he claimed led him into a Satanist cult. After some study and several spiritual experiences, Longo said that he was ordained as a satanic priest. After years of depression, nervousness and confusion; bothered by paranoia and anxiety, he turned to his friend Vincenzo Pepe for guidance. Pepe introduced him to Dominican father Alberto Radente who let him back to the Catholic Church and introduced him to the Rosary. On October 7th 1871 Longo became a Dominican tertiary and took the name Rosario. With the help of Countess Mariana di Fusco, he established the shrine of Our Lady of Pompei. On October 26th, 1980 he was beatified by Pope John Paul II who would call him the Apostle of the Rosary and mentioned him specifically in his Apostolic letter Rosarium Virginis Mariae. Blessed Bartolo Longo pray for us.

October 7th - **The Blessed Virgin Mary of the Rosary**
The feast of Our Lady of the Rosary was instituted to honor Mary for the Christian victory over the Turks at Lepanto on October 7th, 1571. Pope Saint Pius V and all the Christians had prayed the rosary for victory. The rosary of the Psalter of the Blessed Virgin Mary is one of the best prayers to Mary, the Mother of God.

October 8th - **Blessed Ambrose Sansedoni**, friar and priest
Blessed Ambrose was born at Siena on April 16th, 1220 to a noble family of the area. He entered the novitiate of the Dominican Convent in his native city of Siena at the age of 17 in 1237. He was sent to Paris to continue his philosophical and theological studies under Albert the Great and had for a fellow student there Saint Thomas Aquinas. Ambrose worked on diplomatic missions for popes and secular rulers of Europe. He evangelised in Germany, France and Italy. His preaching helped lead blessed Franco of Siena to the solitary life. Known as a mystic with a deep contemplative prayer life, he received ecstasies and visions, was known to levitate while preaching and he was seen circled in a mystic light in which flew bright birds. He was beatified by Pope Gregory XV on October 8th 1622. Blessed Ambrose of Siena, pray for us.

October 8th - **Blessed Matthew Carrieri**, Friar and priest
Blessed Matthew was born in the city of Mantua sometime around 1420. One of the major events in Matthew's life was his capture by a Turkish Corsair, while on a voyage from Genoa to Pisa. When he was asked to explain their purpose for being on board the ship, Matthew spoke up so forcefully and convincingly that the captain set him and the two fryers accompanying him free. The friar then saw that the Pirates were keeping a woman and her daughter captive planning to sell them into slavery in Algeria. He proposed to the captain that they keep him in their place, so shocked with the pirate captain by Mathews willingness to sacrifice himself that he freed all 5 captives. During his lifetime he was alleged to have received the Stigmata of Christ. On October 5th, 1470 he asked his Superior for permission to die, and upon receiving permission he died. Blessed Matthew Carrieri, pray for us.

October 9th – **St. Louis Bertrand**, Friar and priest
St. Louis Bertrand was born in Valencia in 1526, through his father he was related to St. Vincent Ferrer, a wonder-worker of the Dominican order. Despite the efforts of his father to dissuade him, Louis joined the Dominican order in 1539. In 1547 he was ordained to the priesthood by the Archbishop of Valencia St. Thomas of Villanova. He was appointed to the office of master of novices which he served on and off for 30 years. During the plague of 1557, he devoted himself to the sick and dying. When the plague ended, he wished to join an apostolate of preaching in South America. Although it is said his voice was raucous, his memory treacherous, and his carriage without grace, he became a fervent preacher. He sailed for America in 1562 and landed in Cartagena, Colombia where he began his career as a missionary. He is said to have converted 30,000 native peoples personally, he traveled to the Canary Islands and several of the West Indies Islands notably those of Saint Vincent and Saint Thomas. In 1569 St. Louis return to Spain to plead for the cause of the oppressed Indians, and he was not allowed to return to South America. Between 1569 and his death in 1580, St. Louis was a spiritual counselor to many including Saint Teresa of Avila. Pope Clement X canonized St. Louis Bertrand in 1671. An interesting aside there is a statue of St. Louis Bertrand on the North Colonnade of St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. St Louis Bertrand, Apostle to the Americas, pray for us.

campaign to build on successes in Vallejo/Benicia/
American Canyon CA**

Vallejo/Benicia/American Canyon CA – Beginning September 23rd thru November 1st 2020 we will be conducting our 40 Days For Life prayer vigil. Due to the COVID concerns and smoke problems from the CA fires we are proposing three ways you can participate in focused prayer for an end to abortion, for conversion of hearts, for mothers and fathers who feel they have no other choice, and for the unborn child who's very life is at risk. 1.) Focused visible prayer on the sidewalk of PP in Vallejo. Masks must be worn and people must be 6' apart, or you can park and pray in your car. 2.) We are offering a virtual-Zoom prayer hour each day at 3:00 pm during the vigil. Login info will be sent to those who wish to pray in this format. 3.) Please consider to commit to one hour in front of the Tabernacle at St. Dominic's, offering your prayers for this most important cause for life. There is no specific day when you must commit to praying, but please commit to prayer and fasting and let me know if you want to participate in the virtual-Zoom option so I can gather email addresses and send the login information. Please contact Tony Hensley at tonyh@ctpub.com to sign up for one hour per week.

40 Days for Life is a peaceful, highly focused, non-denominational initiative that focuses on 40 days of prayer and fasting, peaceful vigil at abortion facilities, and grassroots educational outreach. The 40-day time frame is drawn from examples throughout Biblical history. The prayer vigil will take place in the public right-of-way outside Planned Parenthood at 303 Sacramento St. Vallejo CA. All prayer vigil participants are requested to pray for peace, pledging to conduct themselves in a Christ-like manner at all times.
