## Pastor's Corner

### The Power of Connection

I made one of my oldest friends in Kindergarten. He is the closest thing I ever had to a blood brother, a true brother by another mother. In addition to being the same class for many of our earliest school years, we spent the better part of many summers together. I remember one time, when his children were small (they're now in college!), they were visiting Monterey and I joined them for a day. His wife and daughter were off doing something else while I was with him and his son. The three of us were talking about one of his son's closest friends and some problem they had had recently. Without warning, my friend grabbed me in a sidelong bear hug and said, "Son, do you know who my BFF is? This guy right here!" Apparently, that was just what his son needed, because he went off happy. Needless to say, I was too.

There is a couple I first met when they were engaged to be married. She is a year older than me, he a year younger. I assisted at their wedding (I wasn't ordained yet). When they bought their first home, they sent me a key; even though they've sold that house, I still have that key. I baptized their first daughter and am the Confirmation sponsor for one of their sons. About ten years ago, he called me to let me know that their kids had voted unanimously in a family meeting to officially give me the title, "Uncle." Every time we talk on the phone, which isn't often because of schedules (she's a doctor and he's a teacher), it's like we just saw each other yesterday.

I recently reconnected with a man who is a parishioner at one of my previous assignments; he reached out to share with me that he had been diagnosed with depression. In coming to terms with his demons, he had, among other things, saved his marriage, which he told me in our last conversation before I left his parish, was about to end. In sharing deeply about our experiences with the disease, we have quickly come to be a strong support for one another. This week was his birthday and a milestone anniversary of his AA sobriety, and our conversation that day was a real celebration of his deeper healing and "new" life.

Why do I share these with you? It is to remind us that now, more than ever, we need to connect deeply and powerfully with people in our lives. In and through them, God powerfully shows we are loved and cared for more than we can imagine. Our life's circumstances and tumult often make us feel alone and isolated, especially these days with added isolation of COVID. But the power of connection, of true love and concern, cuts through the darkness, gloom, and isolation that weakens us and helps to be a "light to all peoples." Please reflect on people in your life like those I just described in mine and reach out to them: tell them you love them, allow them to say they love you, and rejoice you are so richly blessed.

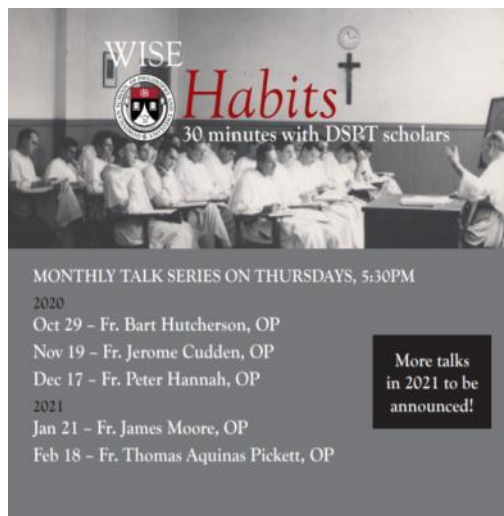

# Dominican Saints of the Week

**November 15 - St Albert the Great,**  
friar, bishop and Doctor of the Church



St. Albert the Great was born before 1200, a calculated date of his birth is 1193. Little is known of his early life; he was probably educated principally at the University of Padua where he received instruction in Aristotle's writing. In 1223 he

became a member of the Dominican order and studied theology at Bologna. Albert became Master of Theology in Cologne, Germany, one of the first Germans to hold this position. Later Albert taught theology at the University of Paris as a full-time Professor holding the seat of the Chair of Theology at the College of Saint James. During this time, Thomas Aquinas began to study under Albert. In 1260 Pope Alexander IV made him Bishop of Regensburg, and he left his position after 3 years. St Albert was a scientist, philosopher, astrologer, theologian, spiritual writer, ecumenist and diplomat. Albert molded the curriculum of studies for all Dominican students, introduced Aristotle into the classroom and probed the work of neoplatonists such as Plotinus. After suffering a collapse of health in 1278, he died on November 15, 1280, in the Dominican Convent in Cologne, Germany. Since November 15, 1954 his relics are in a Roman sarcophagus in the Crypt of the Dominican Church of St Andreas in Cologne. Albert was beatified in 1622. He was canonized and proclaimed a Doctor of the Church December 16, 1931 by Pope Pius XI and is the Patron Saint of Natural Science. St Albert the Great, pray for us.

**November 19 - St Marie Alphonsine Danil Ghattas,**  
virgin and sister

Born Soultaneh Maria Gatttas on October 4, 1843 to a Palestinian family in Jerusalem, and she spent her whole life working among the poor of Palestine. When she was 14, Gattas joined the



Congregation of Saint Joseph of The Apparition as a postulant. In 1862 after her vows, she was sent to teach catechism in Bethlehem. There she also established religious associations promoting devotion to Mary through the Rosary. In Bethlehem, she claimed several apparitions of Mary directing her to establish a Palestinian congregation known as the Sisters of the Rosary. In 1887 young girls received the religious habit of the New Foundation from the hands of the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem. That same year she was released from the Sisters of St. Joseph and joined the new congregation. In March 1885, together with eight other sisters, she professed her final vows in the New Order in the presence of the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem. Sr. Marie dedicated her life to parish ministry and the care and education of Palestinian girls, and the establishment of many orphanages. She was declared blessed by Pope Benedict XVI, on November 22, 2009. She was beatified by Pope Francis on May 17, 2015. The ceremony was attended by 2,000 christian pilgrims from the Middle East.

**November 19 - Blessed Giacomo Benefatti,**  
friar and priest



Blessed Giacomo was born in Mantua in the mid 1202 to a noble family . He enrolled in the order of preachers in 1290 and was later ordained to the priesthood. He acquired his master's degree in theology from the University of Paris and later earned his Doctorate in Theological Studies. His close personal friend the Dominican Pope Benedict XVI appointed him as the bishop of Mantua. He became noted for his tender care of the ill during the epidemics of plague, and Pope John XXII held him in high esteem. Blessed Giacomo died on November 19, 1332. His remains were found to be incorrupt in 1480 after the Dominican church he was interred in was undergoing reconstruction and his remains were found to be still incorrupt in 1604. He was beatified on September 22, 1859 by Pope Pius IX. Blessed Giacomo Benefatti, pray for us.





## **“The Dominican Blessed” by Fra Angelico**

The two banners that are currently hanging in our church, “The Dominican Blessed” are copies of panels that once formed part of an altarpiece made for the Convent Church of San Domenico, Fiesole, near Florence, Italy. The altar pieces are currently displayed at the National Gallery in London. The two panels left and right show members of the Dominican beati or blessed, those who are venerated but have not yet been made saints. These last two panels most probably formed the lowest part of two pilasters that supported the altarpiece on either side of the predella. They would have been on the same level as the predella, framing it on both sides. Although there are a few examples of paintings and frescoes showing Dominican saints and blessed in the court of Heaven, the imagery is unique for a predella, but clearly relates to the order and its mission. Although there is no known or surviving visual parallel for the images, we know from written sources that Dominicans are deeply interested in the saints of their order and many lists of Dominican saints, ordered according to their importance, were compiled. Fra Angelico himself made a series of frescoes including portraits of Dominican Friars for the Chapter House of San Marco, Florence. If you look carefully at the two panels, there are names inscribed on each of the blessed, though most are illegible and unidentifiable. The objects that they are holding could relate to their accomplishments or in some cases, if martyred, the means of their deaths.

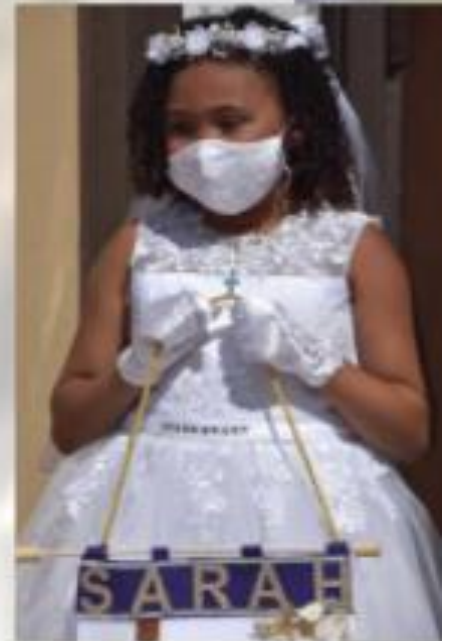
