Pastor's Corner

Purple Tier - While we are in the purple tier, we will have one in-person Mass at 11:00 am Sunday in the small parking lot. Everything at that Mass will be as it has been since we moved outside. If the weather is inclement, it will be inside and live-stream only. We hope to be able to do this through Advent & Christmas. There will be no 5:00 pm Sunday evening Mass while we are in the purple tier. For the other Sunday Masses (Saturday 5:00 pm, Sunday 7:00 am, 9:00 am, and 1:00 pm), they will be live-streamed and Holy Communion will be available at the main door of the church from the end of the Mass for 30 minutes or until the last person present has received, whichever is longer. The same holds true for the 8:15 am Mass Monday - Saturday and the 11:00 am Sunday Mass if weather is inclement.

The only change to the Confession schedule will be that Friday morning Confessions will begin a bit later, about 9:15 or 9:20 (as opposed to 9:00), at the conclusion of the distribution of Communion. It is very important to check either the Friday email or the website to see if the Sunday 11:00 Mass will be outside. If you are not currently getting the weekly parish emails, please contact Lori at <u>Itelepak@stdombenicia.org</u> or (707) 335-4671.

There are two happy differences from when we were under strict shelter-in-place orders. The first is that Solano County is continuing to allow religious communities to have gatherings outside as long as attendees wear masks, keep 6 feet apart and participate in contact tracing. We have been doing this for all outdoor liturgies, not just Sunday Masses, since we've been allowed to be outside. Second, the bishop is now mandating parishes to distribute Holy Communion after each live-stream Mass so that you will not be deprived of the Eucharist while unable to attend Mass inside.

Deacon formation - Mike Scafani is long-time parishioner who is discerning a call to the permanent diaconate. He and his wife, Sandy, are beginning their second year in the program. I have asked to introduce himself to you and generally describe the deacon formation program. I'm sure many of you remember when Shawn and Shannon Carter went through this program a number of years back. Mike will give occasional updates to the parish to keep the community updated on his progress and to offer you his reflections on it. These will be similar to the "Student Brother Reports" that you've heard from our Residency Student brothers over the years.

Permanent Deacons are men from the community who may, or may not, be married and are ordained to serve in the community and Liturgy of the Church. We are blessed at St. Dominic's to have two permanent Deacons – Deacon Errol Kissinger and Deacon Shawn Carter. Deacons as clergy perform baptisms, celebrate marriages, celebrate funerals an serve with the priests at Mass to name a few liturgical duties. Deacons are a bridge between the community, the parish, and the Diocese. Diaconate formation for Ordination is a 4-year process and requires dedicated prayer and study time by Diaconate candidates and their wives.

St. Dominic's is very excited to announce that another couple has stepped forward answering the call to Diaconate formation – introducing Mike and Sandy Scafani. Mike and Sandy are long time parishioners of St. Dominic's joining the parish in 1996. They are the parents of three grown children, Michael, Alessandra and Micaela. All three of their children attended St. Dominic school in their childhood. Michael is recently engaged and living in Portland, Oregon. Alessandra is currently living in

Las Vegas, Nevada and Micaela recently returned to Benicia while waiting for admission to Physicians Assistant school.



Mike and Sandy officially began their journey to Diaconate formation in 2018 and received the Rite of Candidacy in September 2019. Recently, on October 10, 2020, Mike received the Rite of Lector. This is an important step on the journey to Ordination and permanently sets him apart as a Lector called by the Bishop for the Diocese. If Mike continues to discern he is being called to be a Deacon, the Rite of Lector will be followed next year by the Rite of Acolyte, and then Ordination in 2022. Wives participate in the formation journey and study along with their husbands all that the church teaches and believes. This time of prayer, study and discernment adds a new dimension to a marriage as each of them grows spiritually.

This discernment of "the call" is a two-way street as the Bishop, the Diaconate Formation Director and his team walk this journey with the candidates. Our prayers for Mike's formation is an important part of the discernment process for Mike and for our Bishop. Please join us in prayers for Mike, Sandy and their family as they grow in faith and holiness.

Dominican Saints of the Week

November 24 - **St. Ignatius Delgado**, friar & Bishop, **St Vincent Liem,** friar and priest, **St Dominic An-Kham,** lay Dominican & father, and companions, martyrs in Vietnam

The Vatican has estimated that they were between 130,00 and 300,000 Vietnamese Martyrs between the 15th and 20th centuries. Whether it was during the church's original missionary attempts or during the various political persecutions, numerous martyrs watered the soil of the faith of Vietnam with their blood. In 1988 Saint John Paul II canonized 117 martyrs who could be named. This included a large number of Dominicans bishops, priests, and thirdorder members, as well as members of the Confraternity of the Rosary. Saint Ignatius Delgado 1761 to 1838, Saint Francis Gill 1702 to 1745, Saint Vincent Liem 1731 to 1773, Saint Hyacinth Castaneda 1743 to 1773, Saint Dominic Hena 1764 to 1838, and Saint Valentine Berrio-Ochoa, 1827 to 1861. These are some of the noble examples of faithfulness to Christ during these persecutions. It is thought that the Vietnamese Martyrs suffered some of the most gruesome deaths in the history of the church. All the Martyrs of Vietnam pray for us.



November 25 - Saint Catherine of Sinai (Alexandria), virgin and martyr

From the 10th century onwards veneration for Saint Catherine of Alexandria (Sinai) has been widespread in the Church of the East, and from the time of the Crusades this saint has been popular in the west, where many churches have been dedicated to her, and her Feast Day kept with great solemnity, sometimes as a Holy Day of Obligation. She is listed as one of the fourteen holy helpers of mankind among the Saints in heaven; she is the patroness of young women, philosophers, preachers, theologians, wheelwrights, miller's, and other working men. She was said to have appeared with our lady to Saint Dominic and to Blessed Reginald of Orleans; the Dominicans adopted her as their special protectress. A beautiful young woman she went to confront the Emperor Maxentius because he so cruelly persecuted the Christians. When he saw her beauty he wanted to marry her, but she refused which angered him and he had her beaten and imprisoned. Catherine was sentenced to be killed on a spiked wheel. When she was fastened to the wheel, her bonds were miraculously loosened and the wheel itself broke its spikes flying off into the crowd killing some of the onlookers. She was then beheaded. Legend has it that her body was carried by angels to Mount Sinai where a church and monastery were afterwards built in her honor. Saint Catherine of Sinai pray for us.



November 27- Blessed Margaret of Savoy, nun and widow

Margaret was the eldest of four children, all daughters born to Armando of Savoy oh, lord of Piedmont.On January 17th 1403, Margaret married Theodore II Marguess of Montferrat. Her piety increased after she heard the preaching of Saint Vincent Ferrer, who spent several months in Montferrat. The marriage lasted for 15 years but was childless. Theodore died in 1418. When she was left a widow, she decided to abandon the world leaving the direction of the Affairs of the Marquisate to the son of her husband by his first marriage. She retired to Alba where she joined a Third Order of Saint Dominic. A little later, Filippo Maria Viconti, Duke of Milan, asked for her hand in marriage but she refused. She founded a monastery and placed it under the rule of the Order of Saint Dominic. She redoubled her mortifications and remained a model of piety and died in Alba on November 23, 1464 . She was beatified on October 9, 1668 by Pope Clement IX. Blessed Margaret of Savoy pray for us.
