Pastor's Corner

Are turkeys a sign of the End Times?

As it often seems to happen, the Sunday after Thanksgiving is the first Sunday of Advent, the beginning of the new liturgical year. I find the confluence of turkeys (Thanksgiving), the end of world (Christ the King) and hopeful new beginnings (Advent) an amusing juxtaposition that is worth reflecting on.


Thanksgiving is a time closely associated with reflecting on the many things we have to be thankful for as individuals, as a community and as a nation, symbolized by our sharing a lavish meal steeped in tradition. We are truly blessed in so many areas. Sadly, our culture does not encourage us to be grateful. (Rather, we are told that to be happy we must always have simply more.) Stopping for even a moment to be grateful for what we have, great or small, is not something we do enough.

As a boy, I remember one of the first animated Christmas specials to air was "Daffy Duck's Thanksfor-giving Special." Daffy reflects how much he really does deserve all that he has and will get at Christmas and how good it all is. Daffy Duck is so humorous because we (or at least I) see the darker side of ourselves presented in a way we can laugh at and, more importantly, with the help of someone like Bugs Bunny, change the egocentric, self-aggrandizing attitude into genuine, heartfelt gratitude.

The feast of Christ the King reminds us not only of Jesus' sovereignty over all creation, but more specifically, that our thoughts, attitudes and actions have consequences beyond this life: we are accountable whether we like it or not. The Last Judgment reminds us that as creatures made uniquely in the image and likeness of God, we are responsible for how we use (or abuse) our free will. What we do in the mean time is entirely up to us. I find it a sobering reminder. There are (at least) two bits of good news: the Judge is perfectly just and that we have time to grow. I take comfort in the fact that God sees me more clearly and truly than I even see myself. (I may be able to delude you or myself, but God won't be fooled.) Even better, the Judge wants to rule in my favor! ("Love and truth will meet; justice and peace will kiss." Ps. 85:11)

Advent is a season of new beginnings: reflecting on the historical birth of the Savior, and working toward a re-birth of Christ in our own hearts and in the world. Advent is the perfect time to reflect on the last year, put it trustingly before Christ the King, and then to renew our resolve to "stay awake" and act like those who believe that Jesus Christ has come and will come again. Happy New Year! May it be a blessing for you and for all of us.

Dear Fellow Parishioners,



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Holiday Global Faire 🚣



Dominican Saints of the Week

December 1 - Blessed John of Vercelli, Friar, Priest and Master of the Order



John was born in 1205, a native of Vercelli and qualified at Paris as a doctor of both civil and canon law. While he was carrying out the office at Vercelli, encouraged by the Master General Jordan, he entered the Order of Preachers. Later he founded a Convent there, which he also governed as prior. Afterwards while most religiously ruling the Province

of Lombardy, in the year 1264, John was elected as the sixth Master General of the Order. Austere with himself, gentle towards others, he quickly visited nearly all the Order's convents in Europe on foot, and for almost twenty years labored fruitfully and attentively for the good of the whole Order. Furthermore, he made out an agenda for the Second Council of Lyons at the request of Pope Gregory X. zealously propagated the practice of showing reverence to the name of Jesus. He founded and is the patron of the Holy Name Society. John strenuously upheld the reputation and teaching of Thomas Aguinas. Adverse to honors and unremitting in his work he died peacefully at Montpelier. He was beatified by Pope Pius X in 1903. Blessed John of Vercelli pray for us.
