Pastor's Corner

When all is not merry and bright

Today is traditionally called *Gaudate* Sunday. This name is taken from the first word of the second reading: rejoice! It is a reminder that Advent is a joyful season, a time of eager anticipation of both the historical birth of Jesus in the manger and his glorious second coming at the end of time. We get a break from the violet vestments, for a day of rose. And all of the trapping of the "holiday season" speak to us of joy.

Yet, this is a hard time of year for many people. Those who lost a loved one during the year: a spouse, a child, a beloved friend or elder, deal with the shadow of that person's absence for the first time at Christmas. Likewise, those who remember the anniversary of the death of a loved one this time of year never see Advent and Christmas quite the same. Those who suffer from chronic mental or physical illness, an unexpected hospitalization, or are facing imminent death are not experiencing these days the same as they once did. We can call to mind victims of violent crime, those who lost their homes and livelihoods during the fires this summer, immigrants and refugees, and the list goes on. And this year, all of us are dealing with a worldwide pandemic that radically altered all of our lives, has sickened and killed millions, whose long-term effects on survivors are still emerging, and whose victims are increasing daily.

Yet, this is precisely the world Jesus chose to be born into. This is the world that God chose to redeem from within. This world, marred sometimes beyond recognition, by sin, suffering, and death is the one where "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us." This is the world that God did not flinch or shy away from, nor abandon humanity to its own designs. In the midst of it all, Jesus became Emmanuel, God with us.

It is precisely in the darkest days when we need the Light of the World the most. And the good news? He is here, already! This is exactly what we are preparing to celebrate at Christmas. Through the *Fiat* of a humble maiden, the cooperation of a simple carpenter, and a whole series of rejections beginning at his birth, Jesus showed the power of God and the wisdom of God. He took on the mess, all of it, more than we could ever imagine, took it to himself, and nailed it to the Cross. Beginning at his birth, God, in our very human nature and flesh, conquered the darkness and the night.

Yes, it is dark. All of us are in a difficult place. But rejoice! Again, I say: rejoice! Our God is among us and within us. In Him, there is no darkness. And He has come to save us. Come, Lord Jesus!

Dominican Saint of the Week



December 16 - Blessed Sebastian Maggi, friar and priest

Sebastian Maggi was born in Brescia, Duchy of Milan, to Nobles in 1414. He is related to Bishop Bernardo Maggi who was also the Duke and Count of Brescia. Blessed Sebastian began his work in 1429 when he joined the order of preachers. His intelligence was noticed and he later received a master's degree in theological studies. He rose through the ranks and became the superior of several religious Dominican houses. He practiced corporal mortification and was strict in discipline. He would often tell his subordinates; "When you have committed a fault, come to me, not as prior, but as your father. If you will not have me as a father, you will find me a severe judge." He appointed the Monk Girolamo Savonarola to the position of novice master and set that famous Florentine fryer on his own path to fame. In his time he was regarded as one of the greatest preachers in the Italian state. Pope Alexander VI chose Father Maggi to investigate revelations that Savonarola claimed were given to him directly from God. Savonarola appealed the choice and believed that Blessed Sebastian - as vicar General of the Lombard Congregation - would be biased and try to take over his recently emancipated San Marco facility in Florence. Alexander VI, however, had already decided to give the facility back to the congregation, making blessed Sebastian, Savonarola's canonical superior. Blessed Sebastian died in 1496. He is buried at the Dominican, Santa Maria di Castello complex in Genoa. In 1963 his remains were still found to be incorrupt. He was beatified on the 15th of April 1760 by Pope Clement XII. Blessed Sebastian Maggie, pray for us.

So they asked him, "What are you then? Are you Elijah?" And he said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No." So they said to him, "Who are you, so we can give an answer to those who sent us? What do you have to say for yourself?" He said: "I am the voice of one crying out in the desert, make straight the way of the Lord, as Isaiah the prophet said." Some Pharisees were also sent. They asked him, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Christ or Elijah or the Prophet?" John answered them, "I baptize with water; but there is one among you whom you do not recognize, the one who is coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie."
