## **Pastor's Corner**

Back to the Beginning

Today's Gospel presents the Annunciation to us. We celebrated this feast exactly nine months ago. In a sense, now with the birth of Jesus so close at hand, we look back to the moment when it all began. If you remember from last year, Br. Athanasius shared with us that it is well within the realm of possibility that Jesus' birth really was around the end December, and so the Annunciation was at the end of March. This Gospel passage recounts both God's invitation to be Mother of God, or in Greek, the *Theotokos*, or God-Bearer, and Mary's consent, or acceptance of that invitation. It is really quite remarkable to reflect on the fact that God's entire plan for salvation hinges on a single human being, albeit one without sin.

There are a number of things I love about the scene. First and foremost is that Mary is not afraid until **after** the angel speaks. In every other apparition in both the Old and New Testaments, the person to whom the angel appears is frightened by the angel's presence, even before it speaks. Mary, being "full of grace," that is without sin, is not frightened by the appearance of the divine messenger. To me this is an image of heaven: when a person is completely cleansed of sin, he or she is perfectly comfortable in the presence of the divine, even here on Earth, like our first parents were before the fall. How much more will it be the case in heaven!

Another thing that gets my attention is that the Blessed Mother, unlike many others and especially St. Peter, reflects and ponders before making a response. In our modern world, so many of us are like Peter and blurt out the first thing that comes to mind, rather than taking a moment. In our day, part of the dark side of social media is that once an ill-advised statement is out there, there is no taking it back, ever. More people need to ask them themselves: Is what I'm thinking of saying true? Is it useful? Can this person hear it from me? A wise saying states that we have two ears and one mouth: they should be used in that proportion.

Finally, I have always loved Mary's *Fiat*: "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." It is a beautiful expression of her faith and trust in God. Like all the patriarchs, prophets, and so many others, she had no idea what the implications of her "yes" to God would be. And like all of her Jewish forbears, the implications were huge: her "yes" began God's crowning act of salvation history!

This Christmas will be unlike any other any of us have ever experienced. The good news is that salvation history (just read the Bible, for starters) is full of examples of God acting in unexpected ways, at unexpected times, and through unexpected people. The Annunciation is one in a long line of such examples. And my point is this: God can, and does, and will act in ways we are not expecting in these days. Let us take a moment (or many!) to reflect. Let us turn our spiritual senses both inward and outward to look, really look, to see God's fingerprints, the traces of God's action, both near and far. Let us open our ears, our minds, and our hearts to experience the wonder the Lord has in store for us. Come, Lord Jesus!



During COVID our regular group sessions can't meet but our Grief Ministry team is available for one on one grief support via telephone.



### **Dominican Saint of the Week**



## December 20 - St. Dominic of Silos, priest

Born in Canas, La Rioja, to a family of peasants, he worked as a Shepherd before becoming a Benedictine monk at the monasteries of San Millan de la Cogilla. He was ordained a priest and soon became master of novices then the prior, before being driven out with two of his fellow monks by King Garcia Sanchez III of Navarra, for opposing his intentions to annex the monastery lands. Under the protection of King Ferdinand I of Leon, in 1014 they found refuge in the town of Silos at the Benedictine Abbey of Saint Sebastian, occupied by only 6 monks. Wealthy patrons endowed the monastery, and Dominic raised funds to ransom Christians taken as prisoners by the Moors. By the time of his death on December 20th 1073, the monastery numbered 40 monks, and it was renamed in his honor. The reason that a Benedictine monk is honored by the Dominican order is due to the fact that the mother of the better known Saint Dominic of Guzman, the Blessed Joan of Aza, is said to have prayed at his Shrine before she was able to conceive the son she named for him. As we know that son would grow up to establish the Order of Preachers. Dominic's special patronage thus became connected with pregnancy, and until the establishment of the second Spanish Republic in 1931, his abbatial crozier was used to bless the queens of Spain, and was placed by their beds when they were in labor. St. Dominic of Silos is patron saint of prisoners, pregnant women, and shepherds. Saint Dominic of Silo pray for us.

## December 22 - Anniversary of the Approval of the Order.

The Order of Preachers was given approval this day in 1216 by Pope Honorius III. It is a very interesting document and can be found on line in its entirety at the blog of the Dominican student brothers at Blackfriars, Oxford. This is the last paragraph of the document, note this may be the reason for the longevity of the Order. If, therefore, in the future any ecclesiastical or secular person whosoever, having knowledge of this our document, shall rashly attempt to contravene it, and if, after a second or third admonition, he refuses to correct his faults by fitting satisfaction, let him forfeit the dignity of his power and honor; and let him know that he shall stand guilty of the perpetrated evil before God's judgement and shall be denied the most sacred Body and Blood of our God and Lord, Our Savior Jesus Christ, and shall, at the last judgment, be delivered to strict vengeance. Nevertheless, may all those who uphold the rights of said place have the peace of Our Lord Jesus Christ, received the fruit of good action here on Earth, and, before the Just Judge, received the rewards of Eternal peace. Amen, amen, amen.
