Pastor's Corner

Love your mother!

We are about to enter what I think is a particularly joyful stretch of Advent: the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary on the 8th and the Feast of the Our Lady of Guadalupe on the 12th. The Immaculate Conception begins the "white dawn" of human salvation: God preparing Mary to be the mother of the savior from the first moment of her conception. Not only does it celebrate one of the major events in salvation history, it is also patronal feast of the United States. Our Lady of Guadalupe is also a pivotal figure in the history of Mexico and the western United States. Our Lady of Guadalupe is the co-patron (along with St. Patrick) of the Diocese of Sacramento, so is a solemnity for us, not just the next lower rank, feast, that she is in the rest of California.

The Church's reflections on Mary can be roughly put into three stages:

- 1. Mary's divine motherhood, culminating in the Council of Ephesus (431) giving her the title of *Theotokos*, which literally means "God-bearer." Because Jesus is truly and fully God and truly and fully human, his mother is truly Mother of God (a Latinization of the Greek term).
- 2. The implications for Mary herself of this unique privilege, culminating the solemn definition of the Immaculate Conception (1854) and the Assumption (1950).
- 3. Reflecting on Mary's vocation, begun in the patristic era, but mainly since Leo XIII (d. 1903) and culminating in the Second Vatican Council's reflections, especially in *Lumen Gentium*, chapter 8.

Mary stands not only as the first and most eminent disciple of Jesus and member of the Church, she reminds us of the perfection to which all members of the mystical Body of Christ are called (*cf. LG* 65) and also intercedes for us and helps us with her maternal solicitude (*cf. LG* 62). Without the wounds and limitations sin imposes on the human person, she is uniquely able to hold all of her "adopted" spiritual children (*cf.* Rom. 8:17) in her heart in a way that none of the rest of us could. She accepted this last charge from her son at the foot of the cross (Jn. 19:26-27).

We do well early on in Advent to reflect on our Blessed Mother, her role in salvation history and in the life of the Church, and our need to be close to her and ask her help in living out our lives of faith. It is a perfect time to renew or deepen our appreciation of her and devotion to her as we prepare for the birth of her son at Christ. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God! Come, Lord Jesus!

Last Judgement (Detail) (1435-1440) by Fra Angelico

The wall hanging in the church is an enlarged detail of the triptych The Last Judgement by Fra Angelico. Depicted, we see Christ seated in Glory, his right hand raised in righteousness and his left hand cast down in judgement on those condemned to hell. Christ sits on his throne composed of the Thrones, the third order of angelic beings; humble, the essence of peace and submission to God's will. Surrounding Christ are the second order of angels, the Cherubim, with their wings of gold and ruby red bodies. They are the protectors of God's glory-the golden nimbus surrounding Christ in glory. The outer ring is composed of the Seraphim, with their body depicted here in blue. They are the Guardians and attendants of the throne of God. Not a lot of information is available on the Triptych; the date is some time between 1435 and 1440, it is painted on a popular board on three panels. The piece is currently on display at the Gemaldegalerie der Staalichen Mussen, Berlin, Germany.

The Annunciation (1430-1432) By Fra Angelico (Fra Giovanni da Fiesole)

Executed for the cloth Merchant Giovanni de Cola de Cecco for the Church of San Domenico in Cortona, the Annunciation conveys the moment in which the

Archangel Gabriel announces to Mary that she would become the mother to the Son of God. Set in a simple columned loggia with minimal landscape to the left, Fra Angelico creates a dramatic scene. While the words of Gabriel's announcement. translated as "The Holy Spirit shall come upon thee, and the power of the Highest shall overshadow thee", and Mary's response: "Behold the handmaid of the Lord. Be added unto me according to Thy Word", are written on the surface of the painting, Fra Angelico creates weighty, solid figures situated in a rationally designed space. The two figures bow inward towards each other, each responding to the other, as they embark on a journey that will be the salvation of humankind. To underscore this theological connection, in the far distance, Fra Angelico depicts the expulsion from Eden of Adam and Eve, whose sin made Christ's salvation necessary. The loggia and the garden are symbolic of Mary's chastity and seclusion, and the pradella below represents various events in Mary's life. While the component parts of the scene are minimal, Fra Angelico's training as the manuscript illustrator is evident in the work. The intricate details of Gabriel's robe and delicate flowers in the grass belie the simplicity of the work. Fra Angelico excelled presenting different textures; the marble of the loggia it appears smooth against the ruffles of Gabriel's robe, and the feather texture of his wings contrast greatly against the polished finish of their halos. The Annunciation's masterful display of fine details and illusion of space set the stage for Fra Angelico's more mature works in the following decades. The original is tempera and gold on panel; it is located in the Museum of the Diocese of Cortona, Italy.

Isaiah 40: 1-5, 9-11

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah:

Comfort, give comfort to my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her that her service is at an end, her quilt is expiated; indeed, she has received from the hand of the LORD double for all her sins. A voice cries out: In the desert prepare the way of the LORD! Make straight in the wasteland a highway for our God!
