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Pastor's Corner

The desire to be soon recognized

By Pope St. Leo the Great
Sermon 31, On the Epiphany

After celebrating but lately the day on which immaculate virginity brought forth the Savior of humanity, the venerable feast of the Epiphany, dearly beloved, gives us continuance of joy, that the force of our exultation and the fervor of our faith may not grow cool, in the midst of neighboring and kindred mysteries. For it concerns all peoples' salvation that the infancy of the Mediator between God and men was already manifested to the whole world, while He was still detained in the tiny town. For although He had chosen the Israelite nation, and one family out of that nation, from whom to assume the nature of all humanity, yet He was unwilling that the early days of His birth should be concealed within the narrow limits of His mother's home: but desired to be soon recognized by all, seeing that He deigned to be born for all. To three wise men, therefore, appeared a star of new splendor in the region of the East, which, being brighter and fairer than the other stars might easily attract the eyes and minds of those that looked on it, so that at once that might be observed not to be meaningless, which had so unusual an appearance. He therefore who gave the sign, gave to the beholders understanding of it, and caused inquiry to be made about that, of which He had thus caused understanding, and after inquiry made, offered Himself to be found.

These three men follow the leading of the light above, and with steadfast gaze obeying the indications of the guiding splendor, are led to the recognition of the Truth by the brilliance of Grace, for they supposed that a king's birth was notified in a human sense, and that it must be sought in a royal city. Yet He who had taken a slave's form, and had come not to judge, but to be judged, chose Bethlehem for His nativity, Jerusalem for His passion. But Herod, hearing that a prince of the Jews was born, suspected a successor, and was in great terror: and to compass the death of the Author of Salvation, pledged himself to a false homage. How happy had he been, if he had imitated the wise men's faith, and turned to a pious use what he designed for deceit. What blind wickedness of foolish jealousy, to think you can overthrow the Divine plan by your frenzy! ...

The Wise men, therefore, fulfill their desire, and come to the child, the Lord Jesus Christ, the same star going before them. They adore the Word in flesh, the Wisdom in infancy, the Power in weakness, the Lord of majesty in the reality of man: and by their gifts make open acknowledgment of what they believe in their hearts, that they may show forth the mystery of their faith and understanding. The incense they offer to God, the myrrh to Man, the gold to the King, consciously paying honor to the Divine and human nature in union...

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Banners in the Church



The Nativity by Fra Angelico 1440-41 Convento di San Marco, Florence, Italy

Like some other nativities of this period, the artist compromises between the tradition of setting the birth in a cave and the one that sets it in the stable. The painting most likely depicts the vision of Saint Bridget of Sweden, as he has Mary on her knees and the child lying naked on the ground. As usual, Angels Sing above and the ox and the ass look on. The Saint behind Mary is probably Catherine of Alexandria, because of the crown. The saint in the back is Peter Martyr, identified by the gash in his head.


In the late 14th century an influential Memoir by Saint Bridget of Sweden leads to a sharp change in the iconography: Joseph and Mary now kneel before the Christ child, who lies naked on the ground before them. Often light will radiate from the child's body outshining the light of the candle Joseph has brought. All this comes from a passage in the Memoir where Bridget recounts a vision she had when she visited the Nativity cave in Bethlehem:

When Joseph and Mary had entered the cave

and after the ox and the ass have been tied to the manger, the old man went outside and brought to the Virgin a lighted candle and fixed it on the wall and went outside in order not to be personally present at the birth. And so the virgin then took the shoes from her feet put off the white mantle that covered her, removed the veil from her head, and laid these things beside her, remaining in only her tunic, with her most beautiful hair, as of gold, spread out upon her shoulder blades. When all these things had thus been prepared, then the Virgin knelt with great reverence, putting herself at prayer; and she kept her back towards the manger and the face lifted to Heaven towards the east, and then and there, in a moment and in the twinkling of an eye, she gave birth to a Son. From whom there went out such great and ineffable light and splendor that the sun could not be compared to it. After the birth, I saw a glorious infant lying on the Earth, naked and glowing in the greatest of neatness, when therefore the Virgin felt that she had now given birth, at once, having bowed her head and joined her hands, with great dignity and reverence she adored the boy. When these things, therefore, were accomplished, the old man, Joseph, entered; and prostrating on the earth, he adored him on bended knee and wept for joy.

homage." When King Herod heard this, he
was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with
him. Assembling all the chief priests and
the scribes of the people, he inquired of
them where the Christ was to be born. They
said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for
thus it has been written through the
prophet: And you, Bethlehem, land of
Judah, are by no means least among the
rulers of Judah; since from you shall come
a ruler, who is to shepherd my people
Israel." Then Herod called the magi secretly
and ascertained from them the time of the
star's appearance. He sent them to
Bethlehem and said, "Go and search
diligently for the child. When you have
found him, bring me word, that I too may go
and do him homage." After their audience
with the king they set out. And behold, the
star that they had seen at its rising
preceded them, until it came and stopped
over the place where the child was. They
were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on
entering the house they saw the child with
Mary his mother. They prostrated
themselves and did him homage. Then they
opened their treasures and offered him gifts
of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And
having been warned in a dream not to
return to Herod, they departed for their
country by another way.

Ellos le contestaron: "En Belén de Judá, porque así lo ha escrito el profeta: Y tú, Belén, tierra de Judá, no eres en manera alguna la menor entre las ciudades ilustres de Judá, pues de ti saldrá un jefe, que será el pastor de mi pueblo, Israel". Después, abriendo sus cofres, le ofrecieron regalos: oro, incienso y mirra. Advertidos durante el sueño de que no volvieran a Herodes, regresaron a su tierra por otro camino.
