

Each year, Bishop Soto extends an opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation to practicing adult Catholics of the Diocese of Sacramento who have received religious instruction, but for various reasons were never confirmed.

The next celebration of the **Sacrament of Confirmation is scheduled (COVID-19 restrictions permitting) May 22nd/23rd potentially at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament in Sacramento.**

Candidates will be prepared at the parish level by completing a minimum of 8 sessions held over a series of **Sundays beginning March 21, 2021, 2:00 - 3:30 p.m.** via video-conferencing. Sacrament preparation will include prayer, scripture and a review of the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

To participate the candidate must be a baptized Catholic, who has received catechetical instruction at least up to receiving the Eucharist (First Communion), be either unmarried or in a marriage recognized as valid by the Catholic Church, have a recent copy of their Baptismal Certificate issued within the past 6 months, and have a Confirmation sponsor who must be a confirmed, practicing Catholic and at least 16 years of age.

Dominican Saints and Blesseds of the Week

February 16 Blessed Nicola Paglia, friar and priest



He was born circa 1197 in Giovinazzo, Bari, Kingdom of Sicily. He died February 16, 1256 in Perugia, Papal State. Nicola was beatified March 26, 1828 by Pope Leo XIII. Nicola was noted as being pious and studious in his childhood. In his childhood an angel appeared to him and ordered him to abstain forever from eating meat. In 1217 he traveled to Bologna for

the completion of his education where he heard Dominic of Osma preach. Nicola was so moved from Dominic's sermon that as soon as Dominic exited the pulpit, he rushed over and asked him for immediate admission into the Order of Preachers, where he would later be ordained to the priesthood; he received his habit from Dominic himself. Nicola exhibited an exceptional determination to make great progress in his spiritual life towards God and was known to convert Jewish people to the Christian faith. Nicholas served two terms as provincial of the order's Roman province and he founded convents in Perugia. Pope Gregory IX also commissioned him to visit several monasteries and to preach a crusade against the Saracens. Blessed Nicola Paglia, pray for us.

February 18 Blessed John of Fiesole (Fra Angelico) friar and priest

Fra Angelico was born circa 1395 in Rupecanina, Mugello, Republic of Florence. He died February 18, 1455. He was beatified in 1982 by Pope John Paul II. His common English name is Fra Angelico, which means the Angelic fryer. He earned his reputation primarily for the series of



frescoes he made in his own friary, San Marco, in Florence. Vasari wrote of Fra Angelico "that it is impossible to bestow too much praise on this Holy Father, who was so humble and modest in all that he did and said and whose pictures were painted with such facility and piety." You can see Fra Angelico's work in our own church, as all of the banners are by his hand. Fra Angelico, pray for us.

February 19 Blessed Alvaro of Cordoba, friar and priest

Alvaro was born circa 1350 in Zamora, Spain. He died February 19, 1430, in Cordoba, Spain. He was beatified September 22, 1714 by Pope Benedict XIV. Alvaro preached throughout Spain and Italy and also established The Priory of Scala Caeli at Cordoba where he promoted the regular life. By his preaching and contemplation of the Lord's passion, he spread the practice of the Way of the Cross throughout the West. Blessed Alvaro of Cordoba, pray for us.



February 20 Blessed Christopher of Milan, friar and priest

Christopher was born circa 1400, somewhere in Italy. He died in 1484, in Taggia, Italy. He was beatified in 1875 by Pope Pius IX. He is recorded as being holy and abstemious, the ordinary virtues that we have come to take for granted among the beatified; there is nothing to indicate the type of person Christopher was or what particular circumstances might have led him to the Dominicans. He is noted especially for his preaching and his gift of prophecy. In a vision he saw that most of the population would be carried off by the plague. Twenty years before anyone was paying any attention to the Turks, he told the people of Taggia that the Turks would invade the city, and they did, as he had prophesied. A disastrous flood swept the area, fulfilling another of his prophecies. He wrote four volumes of sermon aides, containing scriptural examples and quotations from the fathers of the church. Blessed Christopher of Milan, pray for us.
