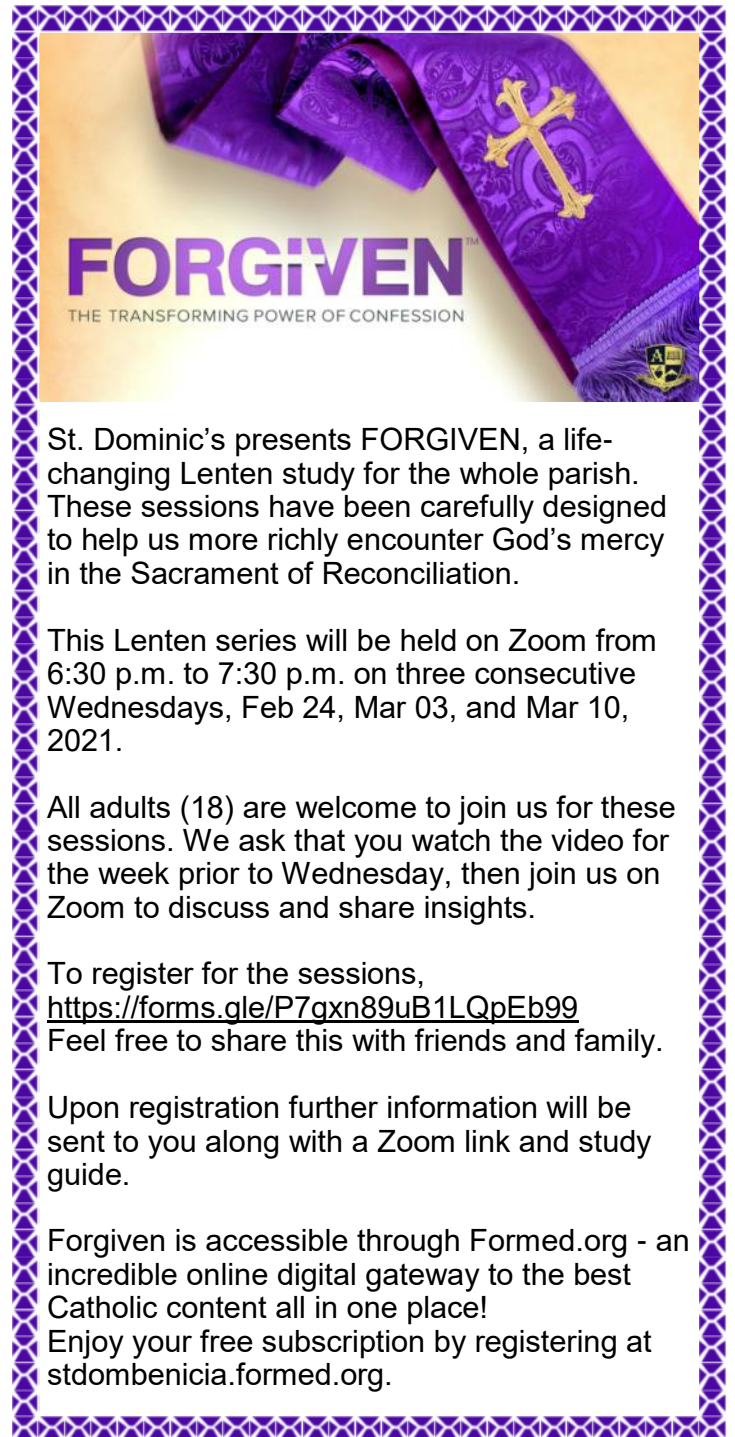
Each year, Bishop Soto extends an opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation to practicing adult Catholics of the Diocese of Sacramento who have received religious instruction, but for various reasons were never confirmed.

The next celebration of the **Sacrament of Confirmation is scheduled (COVID-19 restrictions permitting) May 22nd/23rd potentially at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament in Sacramento.**

Candidates will be prepared at the parish level by completing a minimum of 8 sessions held over a series of **Sundays beginning March 21, 2021, 2:00 - 3:30 p.m.** via video-conferencing. Sacrament preparation will include prayer, scripture and a review of the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

To participate the candidate must be a baptized Catholic, who has received catechetical instruction at least up to receiving the Eucharist (First Communion), be either unmarried or in a marriage recognized as valid by the Catholic Church, have a recent copy of their Baptismal Certificate issued within the past 6 months, and have a Confirmation sponsor who must be a confirmed, practicing Catholic and at least 16 years of age.

Dominican Saints and Blesseds of the Week

February 24

Blessed Constantius Servoli of Fabriano, friar and priest

Constantius was born early in the fifteenth century in Fabriano, Italy. He died circa 1481 in Ascoli Piceno, Italy. He was beatified by Pope Pius VII in 1821. Known as a pious child, Constantius once convinced his parents to pray with him for the healing of his terminally ill sister, and she was immediately cured. He joined the Dominicans at age 15 at the Convent of Saint Lucia. He was formed in a more rigorous religious life, being part of the Observant movement within the Dominican Order. Throughout most of his life, he appeared to be crying. His tears appeared to have three causes; first that it was a gift of tears from the Holy Spirit, secondly that it was related to an internal trial which was permitted by God for his personal sanctification, and thirdly he wept for the sins of others. He was so revered for his holiness especially with regard to his concern for the salvation of souls. He would daily recite the Office of the Dead. He also memorized all 150 Psalms which he frequently used in his preaching. Likewise, he is known for his obedience to the strict observance in the priories where he lived. He was known for his deep prayer life, as a miracle worker, and his gift of prophecy. He was considered a saint in his lifetime by all who knew him. Under the anti-clerical laws promulgated in the early twentieth century, the Spanish government took over the school and expelled the sisters in 1913. The sisters were looking for a new ministry and decided to join the missions. They were invited by friar Ramen to join him in his new vicariate in the Peruvian Amazon. Five sisters volunteered for this mission and Nicole was chosen to lead them. After a two-year period of cultural acclimation and preparation for the mission, Nicole set off in 1915 with two other sisters for their final destination in the mountain forests. After a journey of 24 days crossing the Andes to a region where white women had never before traveled, they arrived in Puerto Maldonado, a small village in the Amazon basin situated between two large rivers. Within days of their arrival, the sisters began teaching the girls of the region and started the construction of a school. Soon girls from the indigenous Baraya tribe started coming from the forest to receive an education. Nicole made it clear that they would be welcome in their classrooms. This was despite the hostility of white plantation workers who formed the population of the town. The lack of any organized healthcare led the poor and the sick to come to the sisters for care. The sisters responded to this need, caring for them in their own convent, when necessary. They began to visit the sick in their homes, and provide whatever rudimentary care they could. Eventually the sisters would expand into medical care as a new apostolate. This pattern was repeated as other communities of sisters were established in the region. In 1917 the Catholic Church established the code of canon law; these new regulations would have severely hampered the work the nuns were undertaking. Under recommendation of the Master of the Order of Preachers who was visiting Peru, the sisters under the auspices of Bishop Zubietta, decided to separate from the monastic communities from which they had come and to form a new and independent congregation of religious Sisters of the Dominican Third Order Regular. Nicole was elected as the first Priors General of the congregation and continued in that office the rest of

Blessed Ascension of the Heart of Jesus Nichol Goni, Virgin

Nichol was born on March 14, 1868 in Tafalla, Navarre, Spain. She died on February 24, 1940 in Pamplona, Navarre, Spain. She was beatified by Pope Benedict XIV on May 14, 2005. Nicole was the youngest of four daughters, and as a child she had many duties including helping her family with household chores. Nicole was enrolled by her father at the boarding school of the Beaterico Convent of Santa Rosa in Huesca, a religious community of cloistered Sisters of the Third Order of Saint Dominic, which was considered a prestigious school in the region. She felt called to join the Dominican Sisters who had taught her, but she returned home to reflect on her choices. By the following October, Nicole had received the permission of her father to enter the convent. In 1886 she professed religious vows taking the religious name of Mary Ascension of the Sacred Heart. She then became a teacher at the school and served in that capacity for 27 years.



her life; she was also the Mistress of Novices training candidates in missionary work. In 1932 she led the founding of the community in mainland China, and she also established a congregation in Spain. Today the congregation has 785 sisters serving in 21 nations on five continents. A reading from the Book of Genesis:

God said to Noah and to his sons with him: "See, I am now establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you and with every living creature that was with you: all the birds, and the various tame and wild animals that were with you and came out of the ark.
