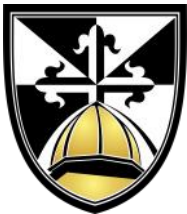

## Pastor's Corner

### "Retreat" is Not Always a Bad Word

Last year was the first year since I was ordained that I missed my annual retreat. It is an obligation in both Canon law and our Dominican Constitutions that I take very seriously. I was scheduled to go during what turned out to be the third week of the first stay-at-home order last March. By the time I, and everyone else, realized that this COVID thing was going to take more than a couple of weeks or months to resolve, it was too late. With the unpredictability, that has been a part of all of our lives; I finally just picked a time. Unlike most years, when I go to my favorite retreat location, New Camaldoli Hermitage in Big Sur, this year I am literally doing it in a house by myself. (This way, I don't have to quarantine for 10-14 days upon my return.)

I look forward to this special time each year. I am a bit more hesitant this year because I am doing it in a way that I have never done before, so I don't really know what to expect. But I do know from the variety of my past retreat experiences, from times at various monasteries, to large groups, to going away with a classmate, I know that our dear Lord will bless my effort and has something for me that, as I write this, I am completely unaware of. For those who have never been on a retreat, here are four things that differentiate it from other times away.

**Solitude.** It is not loneliness, which is being alone with the sense of estrangement from others that drains one of energy. Solitude is a refreshing time of self-engagement, reflection, thinking, and prayer. It is a necessary counterpoint to intimacy with others: it is only in solitude that we can discover the goodness we have to offer others. Solitude is what Jesus meant when he said, "go to your inner room, [and] close the door." (Mt. 6:6)

**Quiet.** The world is noisy! Although I think I am generally moderate in my use of technology, I do enjoy going to places where there is no cell signal nor wifi occasionally. The lack of distraction helps me to notice, really notice what is around me, hear the subtle sounds of nature (especially at night!), and to listen to what is going on (for good or for ill) in my own mind and heart. By clearing the clutter, I can also hone in on God's whisper. (cf. 1 Kings 19:11-13)

**Rest.** Life is busy! Jesus told the Apostles after their first foray into ministry, "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while." (Mk. 6:31) There is always more that can be done; that has not changed since well before Jesus' time. Sleep and rest are not luxuries! They are, rather, necessities for a balanced and sustainable Christian life. One of my favorite sayings of St. John XXIII since I became a pastor is: "It's your Church, Lord. I'm going to bed now." If a pope can say this, I am quite sure that the parish will get on without my activity for 6-8 hours a night just fine.

**Communion with God.** Jesus did it. Many times. Sometimes with an intensity hard to imagine. It was the foundation of his ministry of teaching, healing, and exorcising. Ultimately, it gave him the strength to undergo the Passion. If we are to be true Christians, it must be the same for us. We must spend time with our *Abba* praising, thanking, adoring, and petitioning him. Like any relationship, our relationship with God takes both time and effort to be sustained and deepened.

Each year, Bishop Soto extends an opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation to practicing adult Catholics of the Diocese of Sacramento who have received religious instruction, but for various reasons were never confirmed.

The next celebration of the **Sacrament of Confirmation is scheduled (COVID-19 restrictions permitting) May 22nd/23rd potentially at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament in Sacramento.**

Candidates will be prepared at the parish level by completing a minimum of 8 sessions held over a series of **Sundays beginning March 21, 2021, 2:00 - 3:30 p.m.** via video-conferencing. Sacrament preparation will include prayer, scripture and a review of the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

*To participate the candidate must be a baptized Catholic, who has received catechetical instruction at least up to receiving the Eucharist (First Communion), be either unmarried or in a marriage recognized as valid by the Catholic Church, have a recent copy of their Baptismal Certificate issued within the past 6 months, and have a Confirmation sponsor who must be a confirmed, practicing Catholic and at least 16 years of age.*



# Sunday Worship Aid

**Genesis 22:1-2, 9a**

**A reading from the Book of Genesis:**

God put Abraham to the test. He called to him, "Abraham!" "Here I am!" he replied. Then God said: "Take your son Isaac, your only one, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him up as a holocaust on a height that I will point out to you." When they came to the place of which God had told him, Abraham built an altar there and arranged the wood on it. Then he reached out and took the knife to slaughter his son. But the LORD's messenger called to him from heaven, "Abraham, Abraham!" "Here I am!" he answered. "Do not lay your hand on the boy," said the messenger. "Do not do the least thing to him. I know now how devoted you are to God, since you did not withhold from me your own beloved son." As Abraham looked about, he spied a ram caught by its horns in the thicket. So he went and took the ram and offered it up as a holocaust in place of his son. Again the LORD's messenger called to Abraham from heaven and said: "I swear by myself, declares the LORD, that because you acted as you did in not withholding from me your beloved son, I will bless you abundantly and make your descendants as countless as the stars of the sky and the sands of the seashore; your descendants shall take possession of the gates of their enemies, and in your descendants all the nations of the earth shall find blessing- all this because you obeyed my command." **Mark 9:2-10**

**A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark:**

Jesus took Peter, James, and John and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no fuller on earth could bleach them. Then Elijah appeared to them along with Moses, and they were conversing with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here! Let us make three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He hardly knew what to say, they were so terrified. Then a cloud came, casting a shadow over them; from the cloud came a voice, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone but Jesus alone with them. As they were coming down from the mountain, he charged them not to relate what they had seen to anyone, except when the Son of Man had risen from the dead. So they kept the matter to themselves, questioning what rising from the dead meant.
