

Pastor's Corner

A very eclectic Easter

If you have taken a look at this year's Holy Week schedule, you will see it is quite a mix. A mix of in-person outside, in-person in the church, livestream with a congregation, livestream without a congregation, reservations required and no reservations required. We are still in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, which necessitates flexibility both on my and the staff's part as well as on your part to celebrate these holiest of days on our calendar.

There are some parishioners who do not yet feel safe in coming to any gathering, whether it be inside or outside. For them, we will offer live-streaming and Holy Communion after liturgies. This will work just like Holy Communion after livestream Masses has worked for the past several months.

There are some parishioners who feel safe being outside, but not in the church. Outside is still the safest place to gather, especially with the added precautions of masks and physical distancing. (This is why we will begin having the 9:00 a.m. Sunday Mass outside again on Palm Sunday, as well as the temperature being warmer; if you remember, the 9:00 a.m. was outside through last summer and fall.) I received word from the bishop's office this week that we are now permitted to sing all together as a community at outside Masses and liturgies. We will begin singing at the 11:00 outside Mass this weekend. (The same guidelines made it clear that we will continue to not sing when inside the church for the foreseeable future.)

Finally, there are parishioners who very much want to be inside the church. To do that safely is why we continue to need volunteers for greeting, seating, and cleaning for every Mass inside the church. I do hope those of you who regularly come to Mass inside express your gratitude to these volunteers because without them Mass inside would not be doable. I also hope you will consider volunteering yourself for Holy Week, since there are more Masses and liturgies than usual that week.

I have resisted doing reservations for any Mass here at St. Dominic's; I just don't like the idea of making reservations to come to Mass. But in order to minimize having to turn people away from Mass, which I dislike even more, we will be having a couple of "reservation only" Masses for Easter. We will also be having a Mass up at St. Dominic Cemetery on Easter Sunday morning, a bit later than years past, but scheduled in such a way that people who are turned away at the door for the 7:00 a.m. Mass in the church will have another Mass option. Outdoor Masses have the benefit of not being limited in the number of attendees, which is why our two largest Easter Sunday Masses will be outside.

This year's celebration of Holy Week and Easter will still be different from a "normal" year. It will, however, be much better than last year, when we were not able to gather at all. It is a reminder that the only constant in this life is change. I hope it reminds all of us to be grateful for what we have and what we are able to do. We continue to pray for and work with those who are not as fortunate as we are. But regardless, we stand together in our common faith in Jesus Christ and the saving power of His Passion, death, and Resurrection.



Adult Confirmation Still not Confirmed?

Each year, Bishop Soto extends an opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation to practicing adult Catholics of the Diocese of Sacramento who have received religious instruction, but for various reasons were never confirmed.

The next celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation is scheduled (COVID-19 restrictions permitting) May 22nd/23rd potentially at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament in Sacramento.

Candidates will be prepared at the parish level by completing a minimum of 8 sessions held over a series of **Sundays beginning March 21, 2021, 2:00** - **3:30 p.m.** via video-conferencing. Sacrament preparation will include prayer, scripture and a review of the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

To participate the candidate must be a baptized Catholic, who has received catechetical instruction at least up to receiving the Eucharist (First Communion), be either unmarried or in a marriage recognized as valid by the Catholic Church, have a recent copy of their Baptismal Certificate issued within the past 6 months, and have a Confirmation sponsor who must be a confirmed, practicing Catholic and at least 16 years of age.

+ A reading from the holy Gospel according to John:

Now a man was ill, Lazarus from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. Mary was the one who had anointed the Lord with perfumed oil and dried his feet with her hair; it was her brother Lazarus who was ill. So the sisters sent word to Jesus saying, "Master, the one you love is ill." When Jesus heard this he said, "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it." Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. So when he heard that he was ill, he remained for two

days in the place where he was. Then after this he said to his disciples, "Let us go back to Judea." The disciples said to him, "Rabbi, the Jews were just trying to stone you, and you want to go back there?" Jesus answered, "Are there not twelve hours in a day? If one walks during the day, he does not stumble, because he sees the light of this world. But if one walks at night, he stumbles, because the light is not in him." He said this, and then told them, "Our friend Lazarus is asleep, but I am going to awaken him." So the disciples said to him, "Master, if he is asleep, he will be saved." But Jesus was talking about his death, while they thought that he meant ordinary sleep. So then Jesus said to them clearly, "Lazarus has died. And I am glad for you that I was not there, that you may believe. Let us go to him." So Thomas, called Didymus, said to his fellow disciples, "Let us also go to die with him." When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, only about two miles away. And many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary to comfort them about their brother. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him; but Mary sat at home. Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask of God. God will give you." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise." Martha said to him, "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" She said to him, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world." When she had said this, she went and called her sister Mary secretly, saying, "The teacher is here and is asking for you." As soon as she heard this, she rose quickly and went to him. For Jesus had not yet come into the village, but was still where Martha had met him. So when the Jews who were with her in the house comforting her saw Mary get up quickly and go out, they followed her, presuming that she was going to the tomb to weep there. When Mary came to where Jesus was and saw him, she fell at his feet and said to him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." When Jesus saw her weeping and the Jews who had come with her weeping, he became perturbed and deeply troubled, and said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Sir, come and see." And Jesus wept. So the Jews said, "See how he loved him." But some of them said, "Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?" So Jesus, perturbed again, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone lay across it. Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the dead man's sister, said to him, "Lord, by now there will be a stench; he has been dead for four days." Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone. And Jesus raised his eyes and

said, "Father, I thank you for hearing me. I know that you always hear me; but because of the crowd here I have said this, that they may believe that you sent me." And when he had said this, he cried out in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, tied hand and foot with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in a cloth.
