Pastor's Corner

Recent change in the translation of the Mass

Some of you may have noticed that beginning on Ash Wednesday, the conclusion of the opening prayer at Mass changed slightly. It went from "...in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever" to "in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God forever and ever." This change in our English translation was mandated by the United States Latin Rite bishops and approved by the Holy See to bring us into conformity with other English-speaking countries. Here is most of the document from United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, dated February 4, 2021, to give you a little history and insight into the change.

"In May of 2020 the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments wrote to the English-speaking Conferences of Bishops regarding the concluding doxology of the Collects in the Roman Missal (which also appear in other liturgical books).

"Specifically, the Congregation pointed out that the current translation – which concludes "[...] in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever" – is incorrect. There is no mention of "one" in the Latin, and "Deus" in the Latin text refers to Christ. Therefore, the correct translation, which is already reflected in the Missal in other languages (including our own USCCB *Misal Romano*) is simply: "[...] in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever." The Cardinal Prefect has pointed out the importance of affirming this Christological truth amid the religious pluralism of today's world.

"English translations of the Missal for use by the faithful prior to the Second Vatican Council reflected the correct translation, as for example the St. Joseph's Missals of the 1950's. However, when the post-conciliar texts were published in English, the word "one" was added.

"It should be noted that when the translation of the Missal currently in use [published in 2009] was in progress, ICEL [International Commission on English in the Liturgy] pointed out the discrepancy to the Congregation in Rome, but was told to retain the use of "one God" in the new translation...

"This change to the concluding doxology of orations is to be implemented on Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021. The words "one God, for ever and ever" are simply replaced with "God, for ever and ever."

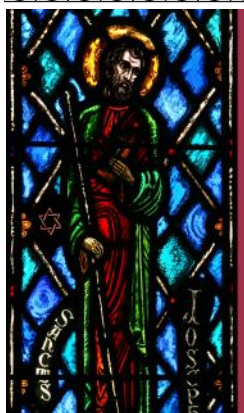

Each year, Bishop Soto extends an opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation to practicing adult Catholics of the Diocese of Sacramento who have received religious instruction, but for various reasons were never confirmed.

The next celebration of the **Sacrament of Confirmation is scheduled (COVID-19 restrictions permitting) May 22nd/23rd potentially at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament in Sacramento.**

Candidates will be prepared at the parish level by completing a minimum of 8 sessions held over a series of **Sundays beginning March 21, 2021, 2:00 - 3:30 p.m.** via video-conferencing. Sacrament preparation will include prayer, scripture and a review of the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

To participate the candidate must be a baptized Catholic, who has received catechetical instruction at least up to receiving the Eucharist (First Communion), be either unmarried or in a marriage recognized as valid by the Catholic Church, have a recent copy of their Baptismal Certificate issued within the past 6 months, and have a Confirmation sponsor who must be a confirmed, practicing Catholic and at least 16 years of age.

A reading from the Book of Exodus

In those days, God delivered all these commandments: "I, the LORD, am your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, that place of slavery. You shall not have other gods besides me. You shall not carve idols for yourselves in the shape of anything in the sky above or on the earth below or in the waters beneath the earth; you shall not bow down before them or worship them. A reading from the holy Gospel according to John:

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, Zeal for your house will consume me. At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." + Lectura del santo Evangelio según san Juan:

Cuando se acercaba la Pascua de los judíos, Jesús llegó a Jerusalén y encontró en el templo a los vendedores de bueyes, ovejas y palomas, y a los cambistas con sus mesas. Entonces hizo un látigo de cordeles y los echó del templo, con todo y sus ovejas y bueyes; a los cambistas les volcó las mesas y les tiró al suelo las monedas; y a los que vendían palmas les dijo: "Quiten todo de aquí y no conviertan en un mercado la casa de mi Padre". En ese momento, sus discípulos se acordaron de lo que estaba escrito: El celo de tu casa me devora. Después intervinieron los judíos para preguntarle: "¿Qué señal nos das de que tienes autoridad para actuar así? Jesús les respondió: "Destruyan este templo y en tres días lo reconstruiré". Replicaron los judíos: "Cuarenta y seis años se ha llevado la construcción del templo, ¿y tú lo vas a levantar en tres días? Pero él hablaba del templo de su cuerpo. Por eso cuando resucitó Jesús de entre los muertos, se acordaron sus discípulos de que había dicho aquello y creyeron en la Escritura y en las palabras que Jesús había dicho. Mientras estuvo en Jerusalén para las fiestas de Pascua, muchos creyeron en él, al ver los prodigios que hacía.
