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Pastor's Corner

Devotions, revelations and dogmas, oh my!

A former Dominican classmate first introduced me to the Divine Mercy devotion back when I first entered the Order in 1990. Two things made me very resistant to it. My first obstacle is the image associated with it. It does not appeal to me at all. I felt somewhat vindicated when I learned that St. Faustina Kowalska (who received the revelations that gave birth to this devotion) herself wept when she first saw the image because she said it did not approach the beauty she saw in her visions. My second obstacle was that my classmate and other devotees seemed to place this devotion on the same level as the nature of the Trinity or the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist: something necessary for salvation. "While sacramental actions are *necessary* to life in Christ, the various forms of popular piety are properly *optional*. Such is clearly proven by the Church's precept which obliges attendance at Sunday Mass. No such obligation, however, has obtained with regard to pious exercises, notwithstanding their worthiness or their widespread diffusion." (Directory on Popular Piety and the Liturgy #11)

Authentic devotions flow from and lead back to the Mass and the sacraments, which lie at the heart of the Church's life. Indeed, the Divine Mercy devotion is exemplary because it encourages the faithful to experience Christ's infinite mercy in the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the Eucharist and then to share the gift of mercy with others. And like any good devotion, it calls us to pray with others and to intimate, personal communion with God. As Vatican II taught, "The spiritual life, however, is not limited solely to participation in the [Mass]. The Christian is indeed called to pray with his brethren, but he must also enter into his chamber to pray to the Father, in secret..." (*Sacrosanctum Concilium* #12)

I think it is no accident that St. Faustina had her revelations and developed this devotion in the 1930's, living under atheistic Communism in Poland, where, as with other absolutist ideologies, there is no room for mercy. We see this "conform or die" mentality still active in the world especially in politics, from mild forms in our nation to more extreme, even literal, forms elsewhere in the world. I see God's beautiful providence in Pope Pius XII's solemn definition of the dogma of Mary's Assumption body and soul into heaven in 1950, after the horrors of the World Wars and the great devaluing of human life, to state unequivocally that human life is sacred and that redemption has a very real physical component that cannot be ignored.

We, like every generation of Christians, need God's mercy. We need it no less than St. Thomas or St. Peter. Indeed, encountering and abiding in Christ's mercy can transform us just like it transformed Mary Magdalene, the woman at the well, the Apostles and countless others. It makes us what we are meant to be: saints.

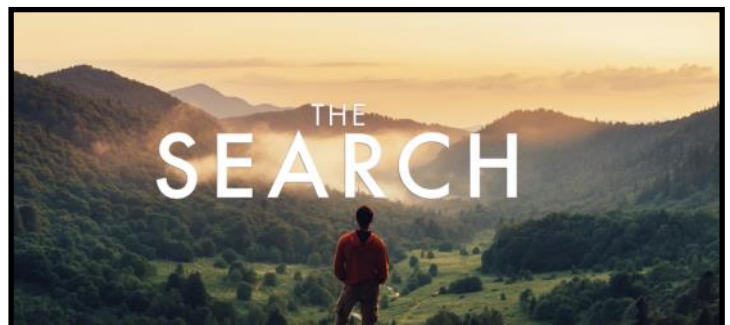

Dominican Saints & Blesseds

April 1 Blessed Guiseppe Girotti, friar, priest and martyr



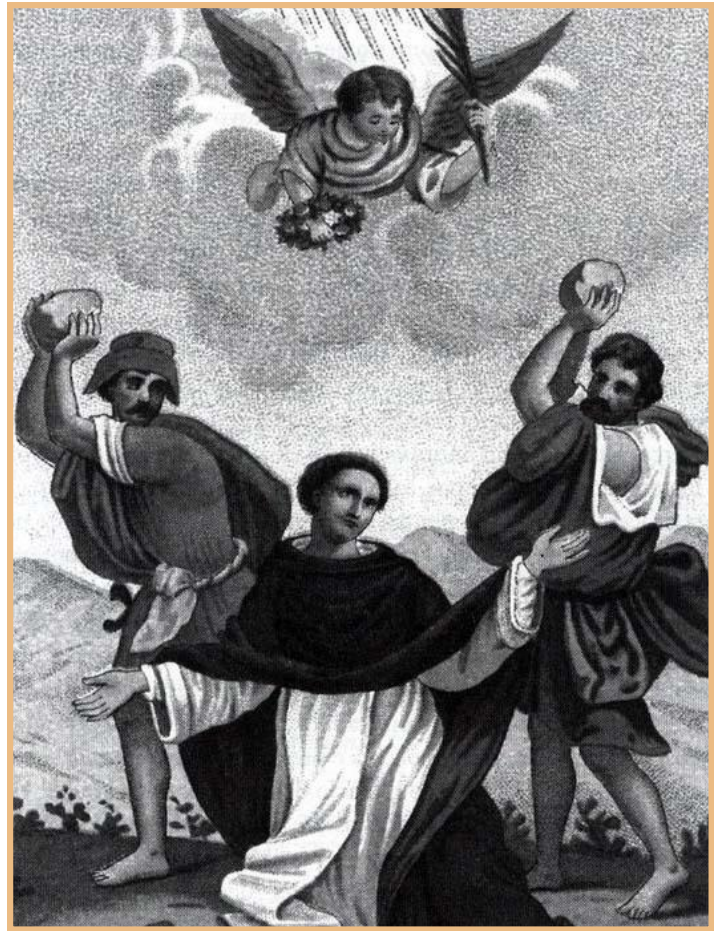
Giuseppe was born on July 19, 1905 in Alba, Cuneo, Kingdom of Italy. He died by lethal injection of gasoline, on April 1, 1945 in Dachau Concentration Camp, Nazi Germany. He was beatified by Pope Francis on April 26, 2014. Giuseppe took final vows on September 30, 1922, and he was ordained

to the priesthood on August 3, 1930. During the war, he helped many Jewish people avoid the Nazis in Italy. He was arrested in August, 1944 and sent to several prisons in Italy and finally was deported to Dachau, October 9, 1944. Giuseppe was branded with the inmate number 113355 and imprisoned with a thousand other priests in a space that had been designed for 180. He was recognized to be a "Righteous Among the Nations" by Yad Vashem for his work in helping Italian Jews during the War. It was determined by Pope Francis that Blessed Girotti was killed "in odium fidei" (in hatred of the faith). Blessed Guiseppe Girotti, pray for us.

April 10 Blessed Anthony Neyrot, friar, priest and martyr

Anthony was a 15th century Dominican Friar from Rivoli, in northern Italy—he was a restless soul. He worked in Florence for the Archbishop St. Antoninus, although good friends with the Archbishop, Anthony grew dissatisfied with this work and asked for a transfer to Sicily. En route there, his ship was captured by Northern African Muslim pirates and was taken to Tunis. The Caliph of Tunis took a liking to Anthony, but due to his incessant preaching of the Gospel, he was thrown into prison and given only bread and water to eat. Near death Anthony committed the sin of apostasy and became an ardent member of the Muslim faith. He was released from

prison, adopted by the Caliph, and was about to be married. News reached Anthony of the death of St. Antoninus and in a dream and mystical conversation, he decided to renounce Islam and return to the Catholic Church. He was received back into the church on Palm Sunday 1460, and was readmitted to the Dominican order. After preaching in public, the furious Caliph ordered him stoned to death for his apostasy. Thus, on Holy Thursday the execution was carried out. Italian sailors brought his body back to Italy and Anthony became famous for the miracles he granted. He was beatified by Pope Clement XIII on February 22, 1767.

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you."
