Life is difficult. A good life is very difficult. We could spend a great deal of time compiling a list of all "the whips and scorns of time" to prove this point, but at the end of the day, we already know that life is difficult. Reflecting on one day's challenges is enough.


Understandably, difficult things are hard, often painful, and a natural reaction to such things is to flee from them. We see many people who spend their whole lives fleeing difficulty, people who are somehow convinced that life should be easy and effortless. A favorite tactic of such is to compromise their identity, who they are and what they're capable of. "If I'm just a highly evolved brute, then less will be demanded of me." "If God is a harmless, golden calf, I can feast and dance to my heart's content." The scary part of these tactics is that they can eventually constrict our ideas of what is possible for us, and we become able only to dream of a heaven where there's food, drink, sex, and pets. God might be there, but only as an always-affirming friend.

To be fair, the truth about life is hard to accept. The prospect of wandering around a desert for years, eating the same thing every day, subject to an exacting law, and expected to fight battle after battle in order to enter the promised land wasn't exactly inviting for the Israelites, nor is the analogous prospect inviting for us. We might even sympathize with the Israelite's longing for Egypt; I mean, sure, they used to be in slavery, drudgery, and misery, but at least they had had water and had had meat in their fleshpots!

But alas! We cannot long indulge such sympathies. For we have felt the finger of God and can no longer bury our heads in the sand. We old ones have dreamt dreams, and we young have seen visions. We have been told of things which no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor heart fully desired. Our bones ache for the freedom promised us, and we look wisely upon earthly things as a speck of dust on the scale.

The saintly life is indeed difficult, but it is irresistibly so. We embrace its difficulties, not as our punishment, but as our grace; for we are worthy of them. We groan under the burden of new life because we are sons and daughters of God meant for God alone. For when Christ came to us in His freshly-risen life, He wasn't a spectre, a ghost. He had flesh like ours and blood like ours.


