Pastor's Corner

This and That

Br. John Peter's Residency year formally concludes at the end of May. Because of the pandemic and the fact that many of the in-person programs that the student brothers do in the summer will not be up and running this summer (again), he will likely get to stay with us longer. I am hoping through at least June and maybe even July, but we will see. Keep your fingers crossed! I have certainly appreciated his time with us this year, and I know you have too, because you have told me so. The Good Lord continues to call wonderful men to join the Western Dominican Province.

Shortly after I recorded this week's *Monday Musings*, in which I told you that we were likely to get a student brother next year, the Student Master contacted me with a name! We will have Br. Jose Maria Barrero, O.P. Ironically, he comes immediately after Br. John Peter (Anderson) in our Province directory, too. I expect he will arrive in Benicia, as Brs. Athanasius and John Peter did, after Labor Day. I will keep you posted.

This Monday, April 26, our teenagers who have been preparing for Confirmation for two years will receive the Sacrament at the hands of Fr. Christopher Frazer, Bishop Soto's new Vicar General. (The Vicar General is a bishop's closest pastoral assistant in the diocese.) Because of the close association of Confirmation of previously Baptized Catholics with the local bishop, it is good reminder for all of us that we are all part of the larger local church.

This Sunday is called Good Shepherd Sunday because of the gospel passage that is assigned to it. Not coincidently, it is also the World Day of Prayer for Vocations, when the whole church prays to the Lord of the Harvest for more vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life. Here at St. Dominic's, we often pray for more Dominican vocations, for hopefully obvious reasons, but we need to also pray for more vocations to the diocesan priesthood, especially here in the Diocese of Sacramento, and to other religious communities. "If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God placed the parts, each one of them, in the body as he intended. If they were all one part, where would the body be? But as it is, there are many parts, yet one body." (1 Corinthians 12:17-20) The Church is richer and stronger because of the vast diversity of expressions of consecrated life and the many ways the ministerial priesthood can be lived out to serve the common priesthood of the Baptized. And may those so called hear the Good Shepherd's call, accept His invitation, and courageously follow after Him!

Dominican Saints & Blesseds ~ April

April 13 - Blessed Margaret of Citta di Castello, Iay Dominican and virgin Born 1287. Died April 12, 1320. Beatified October 19 1609 by Pope Paul V. Margaret was born with horrible deformities. Her parents locked her away for 20 years. She was finally abandoned in the church by her parents and adopted by the townspeople. She went on to found a school for poor children and was never bitter in her life. Blessed Margaret, pray for us.

April 14 - Blessed Peter Gonzalez (Saint Elmo), friar and priest Born 1190. Died April 15, 1246. Beatified in 1254 by Pope Innocent IV, Canonized December 13,1741? Blessed (Saint?) Peter was the court preacher to King Ferdinand III and persuaded the king to have mercy on the defeated Moors. He is especially venerated by Portugues and Spanish sailors. Although his cult was confirmed in 1741, he was never officially declared a saint. Blessed Peter pray for us.

April 17 - Blessed Clara Gambacorta, nun and widow Born 1362. Died April 17, 1420. Beatified March 4, 1830 by Pope Pius VIII Clara was born to rich merchants and was left a widow after a brief marriage. She escaped a second marriage after becoming a professed religious despite her father's fierce resistance. She went on to found a convent paid for by her father. A legend stated that when one of the sisters at her convent was at the verge of death her bones would rattle in her coffin. Blessed Clara pray for us.

Blessed Maria Mancini, nun and widow Born 1350? Died January 22,1431. Beatified by Pope Pius IX Maria was the second Prioress of the Convent of Saint Dominic founded by Bl. Clara Gambacorta. Blessed Maria pray for us.

April 19 - Blessed Isnard da Chiampo, friar and priest Born 1200? Died March 19,1244. Beatified March 19, 1244 by Pope Benedict XV Blessed Isnard studied in Bologna (where Dominic of Osma himself received him into the Order of Preachers) and in Milan before preaching in northern Italian cities, such as Brescia and Bergamo following his ordination. He settled in Pavia in 1231 where he founded a convent and would remain preaching against heretics until his death. Blessed Isnard pray for us.

Blessed Sibyllina Biscossi, lay Dominican and virgin Born 1287? Died March 19,1367. Beatified in 1853 by Pope Pius IX Having gone blind at the age of 12, Sibyllina lived in a cell next to the dominican church of Pavia. She lived alone for the next 67 years practicing severe penances. She was said to have the gift of prophecy and clairvoyance. Her body was found to be incorrupt in 1853. Blessed Sibyllina pray for us.

April 20 - Saint Agnes of Montepulciano, nun and virgin Born January 28, 1268. Died April 20, 1317 Canonized 1726 by pope Benedict XIII At the age of 9 St. Agnes joined the Franciscan monastery in Gracciano. At the age of 14 she became bursar of a new monastery in Proceno. Due to her holiness and devotion, she was elected as abbess at the age of 20. Agnes was favored with many visions, most notable that of St. Dominic who asked her to join him: therefore, she led her sisters to embrace the rule of St. Augustine and joined the Order of Preachers. She was known in her lifetime for miraculous healings of the sick and mentaly ill. St. Agnes pray for us.

April 24 - Conversion of St. Augustine, bishop and doctor of the Church

April 27 - Blessed Osanna of Kotor, lay Dominican and virgin Born November 25, 1493. Died April 27, 1565. Beatified 1934 by Pope Pius XI Blessed Osanna was a visionary and anchoress from Cattoro. She was a teenage convert from Eastern Orthodoxy of Serbian descent from Montenegro. She became a Dominican tertiary and was posthumously venerated as a saint in Kotor. Blessed Osanna pray for us

April 28 - Saint Louis Marie Grignion de Montfort, and Dominican tertiary Born January 31,1673. Died April 28 1716. Beatified in 1888 by Pope Leo XIII. Canonized July 20, 1947 by Pope Pius XII. St. Louis was known in his time as a preacher and was made a missionary apostolic by Pope Clement XI. As well as preaching, St. Louis found time to write a number of books which went on to become classic Catholic titles and influenced several popes. Montfort is known for his particular devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary and the practice of praying the Rosary. He is considered one of the early writers in the field of Mariology. His most notable works regarding Marian devotions are contained in the "Secrets of the Rosary" and "True Devotion to Mary." St. Louis pray for us.

April 29 - Saint Catherine of Siena, lay Dominican, Virgin and Doctor of the Church Born March 25, 1347. Died April 29, 1380. Canonized June 29,1461 by Pope Pius II. Declared Doctor of the Church on October 4, 1970 by Pope Paul VI. St. Catherine was a lay member of the Dominican order, was a mystic, activist, and author who had a great influence on Italian Literature and the Catholic Church. St. Catherine pray for us.

April 30 - Saint Pius V, friar and pope Born January 17, 1504. Died May 1, 1572. Beatified May 1,1672 by Pope Clement X. Canonized May 22, 1712 by Pope Clement XI. St. Pius is notable for his role in the Council of Trent, the Counter-Reformation, and the Standardization of the Roman Rite within the Latin Church. He also declared Thomas Aquinas a Doctor of the Church. St. Pius pray for us.



THE DSPT ANNUAL AQUINAS LECTURE



Presented by Most Rev. Anthony Fisher, O.P., Archbishop of Sydney, Australia

It is widely agreed that trust is eroding, especially trust in major institutions and their leaders. Religious, political, governmental, justice, corporate and media institutions are less trusted today, and trust between individuals is also diminished. This plays out in many negative ways in people's lives. In this lecture Archbishop Fisher will seek to unpack the "what, why, and how" of trust with the help of St Thomas Aquinas. In particular, he will identify three warrants of trust without which one party will not trust another. He will also examine some of Aquinas' thinking on leadership, concluding with some thoughts on how best to address the contemporary loss of trust and crisis of leadership.

Archbishop Anthony Fisher, having received degrees in history and law from the University of Sydney, joined the Dominican Onder in 1985 and was ordained priest in 1991. He earned a Doctorate in bioethics from Oxford in 1995, and has lectured at many prestigious universities. He currently serves as a Member of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, the Congregation for Oriental Churches, the Council of the Synod of Bishops, and the Pontifical Academy for Life. He has published extensively, including mine books, on exhical, bioethical, legal and theological subjects, with works on immigration, abortion, bioethics, healthcare, and suffering.
