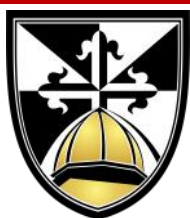

## Pastor's Corner

Excerpts from Pope Francis' 2020 Pentecost homily

...Let us go back to the origin of the Church, to the day of Pentecost. Let us look at the Apostles: some of them were fishermen, simple people accustomed to living by the work of their hands, but there were also others, like Matthew, who was an educated tax collector. They were from different backgrounds and social contexts, and they had Hebrew and Greek names. In terms of character, some were meek and others were excitable; they all had different ideas and sensibilities. They were all different. Jesus did not change them; he did not make them into a set of pre-packaged models. He left their differences and now he unites them by anointing them with the Holy Spirit...

Let us now focus on ourselves, the Church of today. We can ask ourselves: "What is it that unites us, what is the basis of our unity?" We too have our differences, for example: of opinions, choices, sensibilities. But the temptation is always fiercely to defend our ideas, believing them to be good for everybody and agreeing only with those who think as we do. And that's a bad temptation that divides. But this is a faith created in our own image; it is not what the Spirit wants. We might think that what unites us are our beliefs and our morality. But there is much more: our principle of unity is the Holy Spirit. He reminds us that first of all we are God's beloved children, all the same, in this, and all different. The Spirit comes to us, in our differences and difficulties, to tell us that we have one Lord -- Jesus -- and one Father, and that for this reason we are brothers and sisters! Let us begin anew from here; let us look at the Church with the eyes of the Spirit and not as the world does...

For the Spirit himself is gift: he lives by giving himself and in this way he keeps us together, making us sharers in the same gift. It is important to believe that God is gift, that he acts not by taking away, but by giving... But if we have in our hearts a God who is gift, everything changes. If we realize that what we are is his gift, free and unmerited, then we too will want to make our lives a gift. By loving humbly, serving freely and joyfully, we will offer to the world the true image of God. The Spirit, the living memory of the Church, reminds us that we are born from a gift and that we grow by giving: not by holding on but by giving of ourselves...

Brothers and sister, let us pray to him: Holy Spirit, memory of God, revive in us the memory of the gift received. Free us from the paralysis of selfishness and awaken in us the desire to serve, to do good. Even worse than this crisis is the tragedy of squandering it by closing in on ourselves. Come, Holy Spirit: you are harmony; make us builders of unity. You always give yourself; grant us the courage to go out of ourselves, to love and help each other, in order to become one family. Amen.

## Dominican Saints & Blesseds

### May 19 Saint Francis Coll Guiart, friar and priest

Born May 18, 1812. Died April 2, 1875. Canonized October 11, 2009 by Pope Benedict XVI. Saint Francis decided to join the Order of Preachers at the Dominican Convent in Girona. Due to the political atmosphere at the time, and the suppression of the Catholic Church by the Spanish authorities, he was not able to complete his studies until 1836.



In 1856 he founded a Congregation of Dominican nuns which became known as the Congregation of the Sisters of the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The congregation suffered greatly under the suppression of the Catholic Church but they persevered. Saint Francis' dedication to the Dominican life, learning and preaching for the salvation of souls, even in the face of impossible odds, was a remarkable character trait. His teaching and legacy continues to grow through the work of his congregation in Spain and abroad. St. Francis, pray for us.

### May 20 Blessed Columba Guadagnoli of Rieti, sister and virgin

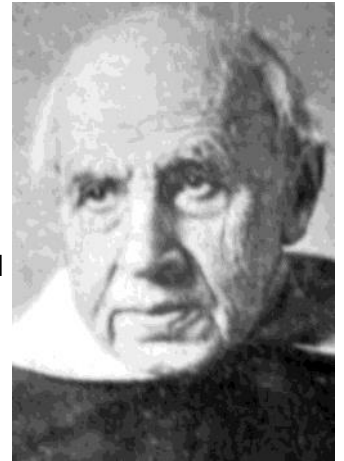


Born February 2, 1467. Died May 20, 1501. Cult confirmed 1627. Patroness of Perugia, at the age of 19, having become a Dominican third order, she left her solitude and founded the convent of St. Catherine in 1490. She was consulted by civil rulers and was known as a peacemaker. She practiced severe penance and endured painful illnesses. Blessed Columba, pray for us.

### May 21 Blessed Hyacinth Mary Cormier, priest, Master of the Order

Born December 8, 1832. Died December 17, 1916.

Beatified November 20, 1994, by Pope John Paul II. Blessed Hyacinth-Marie was born to a well-to-do family of merchants; his father died when he was young and his mother moved the family to live with his uncle, a priest. He received his initial education at home and later studied in the school of the Christian Brothers. At the age of 13 he



entered the minor Seminary. Shortly after his ordination as a Diocesan priest, he began to suffer from chronic hemorrhage. These health problems prevented him from making his religious profession; his health deteriorated so badly that he was thought to be on his deathbed, and was given a special exemption by the Pope to make his religious profession. Upon making his profession, he had a miraculous recovery and went on to many high positions in the Dominican order. In May of 1904, he was elected Master of the order at the general chapter. As Master of the order, he restored many suppressed provinces, and erected new ones including that of the Most Holy Name of Jesus in the Western United States of America. As Master he played a pivotal role in reorganizing the College of Saint Thomas in Rome, the future Pontifical University of Saint Thomas Aquinas, commonly referred to as the Angelicum. After his death, his remains were transferred to the Angelicum University Church of Saint Dominic and Sixtus, where his body rests above the high altar in one direction and above the altar of the University Chapel directly behind it in the opposite direction. Blessed Hyacinth Mary, pray for us.

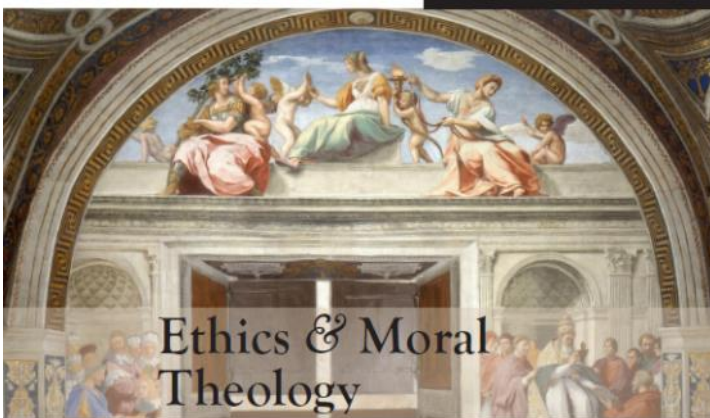

## Hechos 2:1-11
