Pastor's Corner

The Fifth Commandment

The commandment to honor father and mother is the first in the Decalogue to carry a promise to the one who obeys it. To honor someone in the biblical sense is more than an internal attitude of courtesy, respect and, to a degree, reverence. Honor must include action; otherwise, it is just lip service. The most obvious way, though certainly not the only way, most of us express this parental honor is caring for them as they grow weak under the burden of years or illness. What most of us do for our parents is the exact opposite of what they did for us: quiding us through complete dependence to appropriate independence and to model the potency of interdependence. It is a challenge in every generation to find appropriate and holy ways to honor parents, given the brokenness of human nature in both parents and children.

I learned the truth of the saying, "The apple doesn't fall far from the tree," in recognizing many of my dad's (and mom's) strengths and weaknesses, or variations thereof, in myself. Seeing my dads' was especially painful for me. I wanted to believe my flaws were completely different (and less egregious!) than my dad's, but the reality is different! I suspect the same is true for many of you. Going through this really helped me to be more merciful and understanding of my father, especially as he approached death; he died 22 years ago today, June 20, 1999.

Maybe this year, we can honor our fathers by doing something other than giving him a tie or a round of golf at his favorite course. Let us start by being grateful that he existed; if he didn't we wouldn't be here. Thank God for all that he did and tried to do for us, regardless of whether or not it turned out well. Thank God for all you appreciate about him. (If your dad is still alive, you can go a step further and communicate that to him. If he has passed on, cannot or will not communicate with you, then you can do so through the communion of the saints; they will make sure it gets to him!) Forgive him for any real or perceived injury he did to you. Do so not because he deserves it, but for your own peace of mind. (Forgiveness is a gift we give primarily to ourselves, not letting someone's else bad behavior in the past affect us in the present. Your father, like you and me, does not have the right to be forgiven of his sins and mistakes, regardless of whether he desires to be or not. It is a gift we offer to him, just as God offers it to us.) And finally, if you're male: don't strive to be half the man your father was (or some such), rather strive to be the man that God created you to be!


