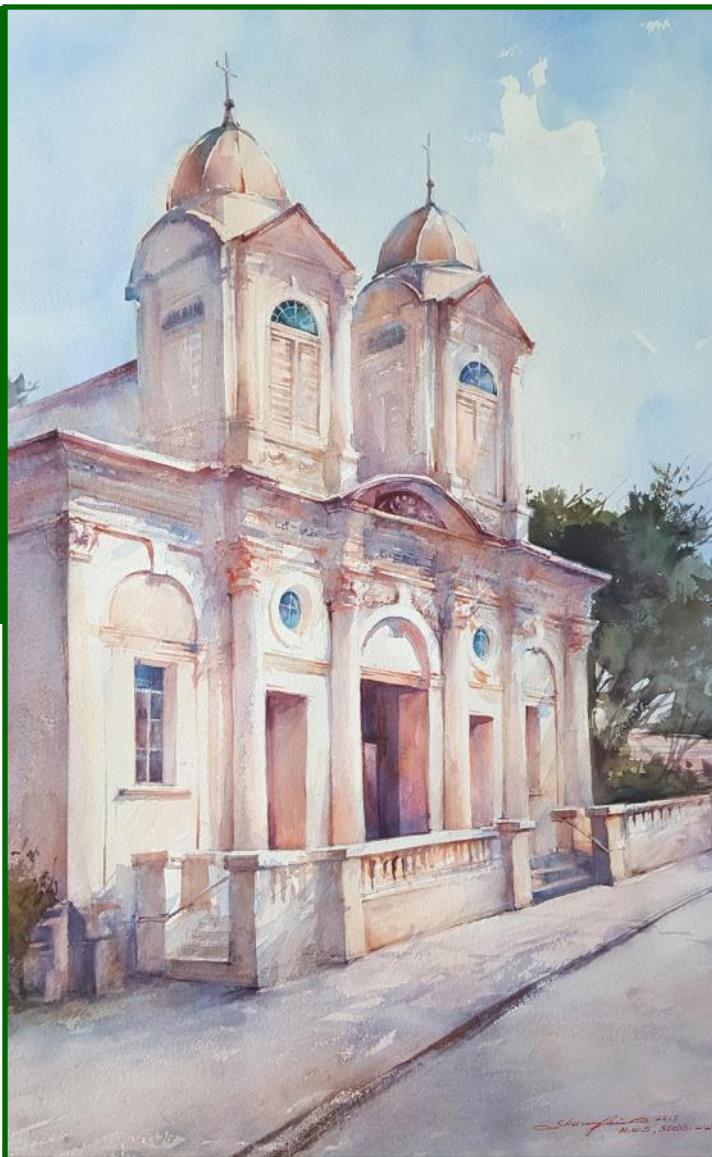

Pastor's Corner

A Call to Action and A Personal Reflection

IMPORTANT: Bishop Soto is calling on all Catholics in the Diocese to help oppose SB 245. It will make only one "choice" more accessible for women in California: the abortion of an unborn child. At the same time, prenatal care and post-natal services continue to have significant co-pays and deductible costs. Reducing the co-pay for abortions urges women, usually those who are poor and isolated, to choose abortion in the absence of any real support to bring their child to birth. On a personal note, this was a rough week for me. I attended the funeral of my first mentor, one who was critical part of my life in my late high school and college years. Because of the pandemic and his deteriorating health, I was not able to see him in person for almost two years and phone conversations became increasingly disjointed. Although I am sad that I was not able to say "goodbye" and "thank you" in person before he died, I take great comfort in the fact that he is no longer suffering.

Some of you saw on my Facebook page that former Master of the Order, Fr. Timothy Radcliffe, had life-altering cancer surgery this week. Fr. Timothy is probably the most well-known living Dominican friar. Perhaps you have read his books or heard him speak at events like the Los Angeles Religious Education Congress. He is an enthralling speaker, despite his famously uncombed hair and dirty habit. He is also one of the kindest, most generous, and encouraging people I have ever met. We first met when he was the newly elected Master of the Order and I was a student brother. He sat across from me at breakfast one morning and treated me like I was the most interesting person in the world. I'm not the most interesting man in world (or I would be on those beer commercials!), so he made a huge impression on me. He continued to "keep up" with me all these years. One of the most enjoyable parts of my sabbatical a few years ago was to live at the house where Fr. Timothy is assigned and get to hang out with him. So it was a blow to the gut to learn of his cancer. Thanks be to God, he got through the surgery and is recovering. These two incidences reminded me how fragile life truly is and not to forget to tell important people that you love and appreciate them!

+ Lectura del santo Evangelio según san Juan:
