Pastor's Corner

St. Dominic, the Joyful Friar

St. Dominic was born in Castille, Spain around 1170 to Blessed Jane d' Aza and Felix de Guzman. He had two older brothers, Anthony and Blessed Mannes, who were already preparing for the priesthood when he was born. Ordinarily, he would have been trained to be a soldier like his father, but his mother had other plans. He showed great aptitude for study and pastoral zeal even in his youth. Shortly after his ordination to the priesthood he was recruited to be a canon (a group of diocesan priests who lived in community like religious) in the city of Osma.

In 1203, Bishop Diego of Osma took St.

Dominic with him on a journey to Denmark. It turned out to be a watershed journey. They saw the Church in Toulouse, France in turmoil from erroneous teaching and preaching of the Christian message. They also saw the Church's ministers either unable to cope with the errors or living and teaching those same errors themselves!

Bishop Diego tried a novel approach on his second trip three years later: he put aside all of the trappings and finery of his status as a bishop and worked a simple street preacher. He sent his entourage home to Osma but kept St. Dominic with him. Together, they sought to teach solid, well-argued Catholic doctrine while begging and otherwise imitating the evangelical, austere life of the apostles described in Luke 10. He established a convent of nine women in Prouille to take part in the mission by community life, penance and prayer. They also taught the daughters of the nobility. (That monastery of nuns still exists today.)

St. Dominic continued the task after Bishop Diego died. St. Dominic did not abandon his mission, despite the storm around him. He and his sixteen followers shared a vision and an ardent desire to preach Jesus Christ. His company was charged by the bishop of Toulouse to assist him in his role as teacher and preacher. This was a novelty, because at that time only bishops preached. The newly elected Pope Honorius III gave St. Dominic the recognition he wanted on December 21, 1216, not only of his preaching band, but also of the cloistered women in Prouille and the associations of laity he organized throughout southern France. The Order of Preachers was born.

St. Dominic's vision was nothing short of revolutionary. First, he set up a democracy in a time when the only recognized form of government was monarchy. Second, priests were given the prerogative to preach and to do so universally. Third, he included women and the laity in the mission of preaching and teaching. Think about it for a moment: any one of these is incredible, but all three! Within a century of St. Dominic's death in 1221, there were over 30,000 friars throughout Europe and the frontiers

of the known world, established and growing numbers of nuns' monasteries and many associations of laity.

While founding the Order, St. Dominic was very aware of his status as the *pater familias* and used his magnetic personality to the fullest. He always strove to encourage those around him by setting a good example for them, not just by his exemplary preaching. He was warm and affectionate to all and a cheerful companion. He was persistent in encouraging the members of his little flock never to settle for less than the demanding standards they had set for themselves. He prayed for them unceasingly. He told his brothers on his deathbed, "I will be of more use to you in heaven than on earth."

St. Dominic's genius was his ability to bring out what is true, good and beautiful in those around him by his example and his preaching, and then to send them out to do the same for others. He shows us that happiness and holiness are more contagious than cynicism and evil. He continues to call us to be a light in the shadow of the death, a leaven of peace where the effects of sin are rife and salt to accentuate the essential goodness of all God's creation.

Youth Painting Class



A Family of Faith follows a four-year cycle: one pillar of the Catechism is covered per year from September through May. Parents are given a detailed picture of authentic and vibrant Catholic family life, the tools to implement this life in their home, and age-appropriate readings, games, crafts, and other activities to help them deepen among their children a love for Christ and His Church. Each year is self-contained, and so families may join at any time in the cycle. After four years, families will have been guided through the entirety of the Catechism and will have developed a broad understanding of the Church's teachings. Families then cycle through the program again in order to deepen their knowledge and develop the habits needed for life-long spiritual growth.
