### Welcome Br. José María



My name is Br. José María
Barrero, O.P. I am one of 36
Dominican friars in initial formation
for the priesthood of Jesus Christ.
I belong to the Dominican
Province of the Most Holy Name of
Jesus that serves Catholics in the
western United States. I have lived
and studied at the Priory of St.
Albert the Great, our House of

Studies, in the city of Oakland, CA for the past 2 years. I was born on May 5<sup>th</sup>, 1994, and reared in the city of Upland, CA. I attended St. Joseph's Catholic School in the same city from 1999-2008. I attended Damien High School in La Verne, CA. I graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Theology and Religious Studies from The Catholic University of America in Washington, DC in the spring of 2018. I met the Dominican friars at the House of Studies in Washington, DC and our active Dominican sisters, the Dominican Sisters of Mary, Mother of the Eucharist, while attending the university. The Order of Preachers was founded by St. Dominic de Guzman in the year 1216. The charism of the Order is that of preaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ for the conversion and salvation of souls. When I was actively discerning the vocation to the priesthood, the diocesan priesthood seemed to be the clearest way for me to bring others to Christ and Christ to others. But as I got to know the friars and the sisters. I found the religious life, the life of an itinerant mendicant, i.e., a traveling beggar, whose mission in life is to bring the truth of Jesus Christ wherever he or she went, to be an authentic and compelling witness to the world for Christ in our contemporary age. Both the friars and the sisters preach and teach in parishes, schools, and universities while living a common life. We chant the Liturgy of the Hours daily, wear a distinct black and white habit, and are devoted to the Blessed Virgin Mary through the daily recitation of the Rosary. With a strong dedication to study and doctrinal preaching, utilizing the wisdom of the philosophy and theology of St. Thomas Aquinas, the Order of Preachers has been proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ for the last 800 years. During my time in college, I would encounter a Dominican friar at Mass, on YouTube videos, on podcasts, and in the confessional. I always went away having learned something new about the breadth and depth of the Catholic faith and its rich intellectual tradition. I found great peace and purpose when learning about the Order that is dedicated to preaching the truth of Jesus Christ while living a balanced active-contemplative life dedicated to the conversion and salvation of souls. I am excited to spend my Residency Year at St. Dominic's here in Benicia. Please know of my continued prayers for the Catholic community of St. Dominic's. Thank you for your continued support and generosity.



Each year, Bishop Soto extends an opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation to practicing adult Catholics of the Diocese of Sacramento who have received religious instruction but for various reasons were never confirmed.

The next celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation is scheduled for Saturday, November 6, 2021 at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament in Sacramento.

Candidates will be prepared for the sacrament at the parish level. A minimum of sessions will be convened over a series of Sundays beginning September 12, 2021, 2:00-3:30PM via video-conferencing. Sacrament preparation will include prayer, scripture and a review of the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

To participate the candidate must be a baptized Catholic, who has received catechetical instruction at least up to receiving the Eucharist (First Communion), be either unmarried or in a marriage recognized as valid by the Catholic Church, have a recent copy of their Baptismal Certificate issued within the past 6 months, and have a Confirmation sponsor who must be a confirmed, practicing Catholic and at least 16 years of age.

## Peaceful, prayerful, effective 40 Days for Life campaign to build on successes in Vallejo/Benicia/American Cyn CA

Vallejo/Benicia/American Canyon CA – Dear brothers and sisters, beginning on September 22nd through October 31st 2021, the highly successful 40 Days for Life campaign returns to Vallejo with 40 days of prayer and fasting, peaceful vigil and community outreach. I wanted to invite everyone to please prayerfully consider joining us by taking a one hour time slot on Wednesdays between 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Our first day of public prayer begins on Wednesday September 22nd, and our last Wednesday will be October 27th.

40 Days for Life is a peaceful, highly-focused, non-denominational initiative that focuses on 40 days of prayer and fasting, peaceful vigil at abortion facilities, and grassroots educational outreach. The 40-day time frame is drawn from examples throughout Biblical history.

If you are willing and able to come out and join other pro-life people for one hour per week, please make sure you are healthy, wear a mask, and maintain a 6' social distance from other prayer partners. The vigil will take place in the public right-of-way outside Planned Parenthood at 303 Sacramento St. Vallejo, CA. All vigil participants are requested to pray for peace, pledging to conduct themselves in a Christian like manner at all times.

Rosemary Mullane is our current 40 Days for life leader for all four parishes while I remain our St. Dominic's contact person. Rosemary Mullane is down at the PP facility on a regular basis and has invited anyone who is interested and able to meet at 3pm on Friday September 10<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> to pray the divine mercy chaplet. While there for that hour of power, she is willing to help anyone who would like to download the 40 Days for life App on their smartphone and log in to see where people can sign up for an hour of prayer during the vigil.
