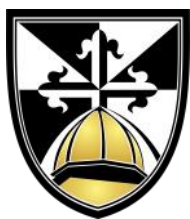

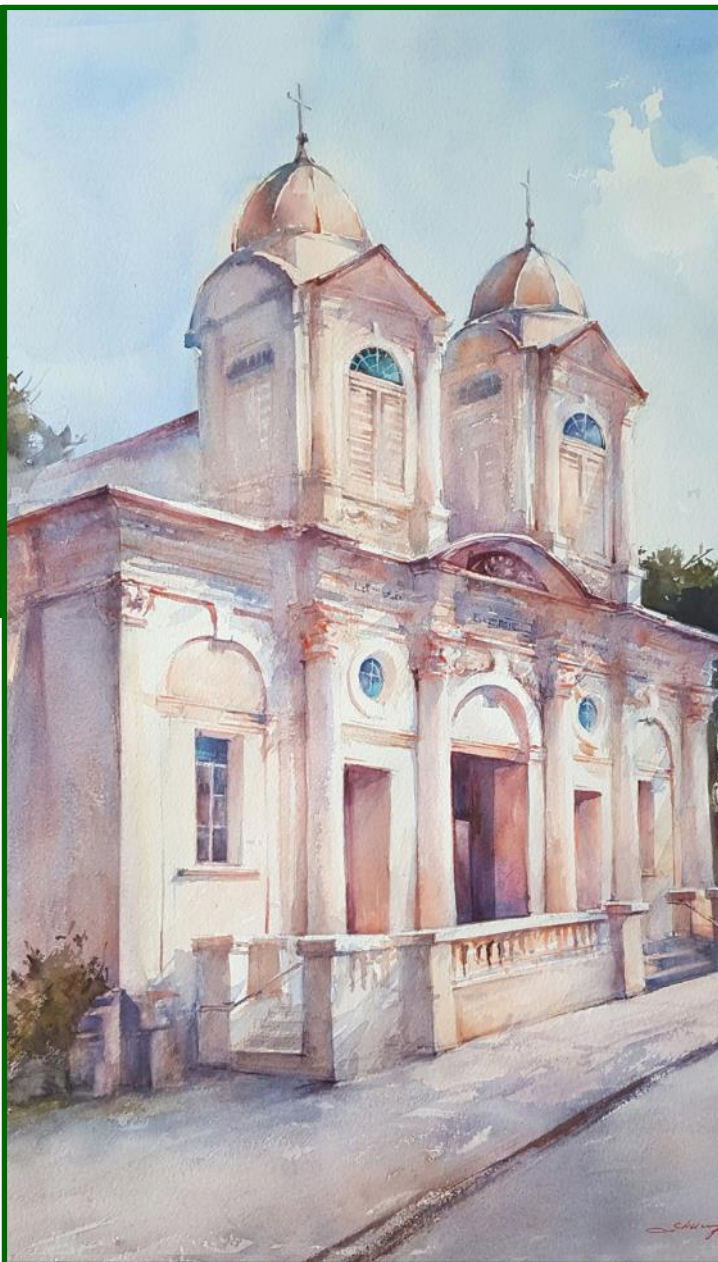

Brother's Corner

The universal Church celebrates the Feast of Saints Simon and Jude on Thursday October 28th. These two men are named as two of the twelve apostles in St. Luke's Gospel (6:14-16) and in the Acts of the Apostles (1:12-14). Not much is known about Simon the Zealot. St. Jude Thaddeus is known as the "saint of the impossible." In John's Gospel, St. Jude asks Jesus the following question at the Last Supper: "Master, what happened that you will reveal yourself to us and not to the world" (Jn:14:22)? He is asking Jesus why the world cannot know Him as they, His disciples, know Him. Jesus responds: *"Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him. Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; yet the word you hear is not mine but that of the Father who sent me"* (Jn: 14:23-24). St. Thomas, in his Commentary on John's Gospel, reflects on Jesus' response. Jesus promises His presence to those who are fit to receive God's manifestation. Two things are needed for this fittingness: charity and obedience. Charity joins our soul to God. We draw near to Him, lift our eyes to Him, and focus our gaze on spiritual things i.e., God Himself and His effects. Obedience follows from the gift of charity. We think, act, and orient our entire lives about those things in life that we truly love. We go to extreme lengths for those whom we love. Our actions, then, follow our love and are the proof of our love. Because of this charity given by God, we are able to admit that He is our ultimate end. This should change how we think, act, and orient our entire lives. We "keep God's word" because our wills are intent on God. Our obedience to God's commandments and precepts follows from this charity. God doesn't "change place;" we move towards Him by the effect of His grace. The Trinity intimately dwells in the souls of those who love and keep His commandments. To those who are enraptured by the world and its goods, i.e., those without charity or obedience, God will not abide. St. Jude Thaddeus is asked for intercession by many Christians throughout the world when difficult cases arise in their lives. St. Dominic's Church in San Francisco has welcomed many pilgrims to their St. Jude Shrine and has had many pilgrims involved in their annual St. Jude Procession. Many intentions are sent to the Shrine asking for God's abiding presence in what seems to be void of hope. Christians approach the saints and ask for intercession so that they themselves can better love and be obedient to God. Sts. Simone and Jude, pray for us.

40 DAYS FOR LIFE™

Peaceful, prayerful, effective 40 Days for Life campaign to build on successes in Vallejo/Benicia/American Cyn CA

Vallejo/Benicia/American Canyon CA – Dear brothers and sisters, beginning on September 22nd through October 31st 2021, the highly successful 40 Days for Life campaign returns to Vallejo with 40 days of prayer and fasting, peaceful vigil and community outreach. I wanted to invite everyone to please prayerfully consider joining us by taking a one hour time slot on Wednesdays between 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Our first day of public prayer begins on Wednesday September 22nd, and our last Wednesday will be October 27th.

40 Days for Life is a peaceful, highly-focused, non-denominational initiative that focuses on 40 days of prayer and fasting, peaceful vigil at abortion facilities, and grassroots educational outreach. The 40-day time frame is drawn from examples throughout Biblical history.

If you are willing and able to come out and join other pro-life people for one hour per week, please make sure you are healthy, wear a mask, and maintain a 6' social distance from other prayer partners. The vigil will take place in the public right-of-way outside Planned Parenthood at 303 Sacramento St. Vallejo, CA. All vigil participants are requested to pray for peace, pledging to conduct themselves in a Christian like manner at all times.

Rosemary Mullane is our current 40 Days for life leader for all four parishes while I remain our St. Dominic's contact person. Rosemary Mullane is down at the PP facility on a regular basis and has invited anyone who is interested and able to meet at 3pm on Friday September 10th and 17th to pray the divine mercy chaplet. While there for that hour of power, she is willing to help anyone who would like to download the 40 Days for life App on their smartphone and log in to see where people can sign up for an hour of prayer during the vigil. I hope many of you will take her up on helping get that free App set up and pray together one of those afternoons. Thanks and God Bless.
