Pastor's Corner

A New Beginning

Happy Liturgical New Year! To celebrate, we are having an Advent Mission given by a familiar friar, Fr. Bartholomew Hutcherson, OP. Fr. Bart will be preaching at the Masses this weekend, as well as on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday. A mainstay of Fr. Bart's ministry is leading two pilgrimages a year to the Holy Land. Obviously with the pandemic, those haven't happened. In order to support some of the people he works with in Bethlehem, religious articles made in the Holy Land will be available this weekend and after the Masses through Wednesday, or until supplies run out. This time of year is always reflective for me, and this year especially so. I have a mixed relationship, shall we say, with Thanksgiving. And this December 4 marks the 20th anniversary of my mother's death.

I did not enjoy Thanksgiving growing up. After my parents separated when I was about 7, I spent Thanksgiving with my dad. Apart from the two years he and his second wife were together, my father and I never celebrated Turkey Day with the same group of people two years in a row. This was a trial for me as a shy, reserved child; as a result, it became my least favorite holiday. That is particularly sad, because Thanksgiving dinner itself has always been one of my favorites. (Needless to say, Thanksgiving since I entered the Dominicans has been a much different, much more pleasant experience.)

My mother's last significant meal was Thanksgiving dinner. It was prepared by her best friend who is an excellent cook (and at her insistence, since she was expecting a houseful, "so three more is no problem!"). Since I had no cooking to do that day, my uncle and I pulled out all the stops in setting the table. We got out Mom's best china, linen tablecloths, crystal wine glasses and goblets, actual silver silverware, and all the rest for our little dinner party. I remember her really enjoying watching the preparations, even though she couldn't help. We all knew that she was very sick because she didn't give either my uncle or me any directions or "suggestions" as we were setting things up. "Dressing for dinner" that night was putting on a button-down shirt. And, of course, we ate at the dining room table, rather than the kitchen table where we usually ate. (This was a bonus because it was closer to Mom's bed.) It was one of the most beautiful and significant family meals I can remember. It is one of my most treasured memories of my mom's final days in this life.

These experiences give me great sympathy for those who find the "holiday season" stressful because of painful or traumatic memories and experiences from the past. Be around people who love you and be OK with not always being OK.
