# **Pastor's Corner**

We seem to give them back to You, O God, who gave them first to us. Yet as You did not lose them in giving, so do we not lose them by their return. Not as the world gives, do you give, O Lover of souls. What You give, You take not away, for what is Yours is ours also if we are Yours.

And life is eternal and love is immortal, and death is only a horizon, and a horizon is nothing, save the limit of our sight.

Lift us up, strong Son of God, that we may see further; cleanse our eyes that we may see more clearly; draw us closer to Yourself that we may know ourselves to be nearer to our loved ones who are with You. And while You prepare a place for us, prepare us also for that happy place, that where You are we may be also for evermore.

Attributed to Fr. Bede

This is one of my favorite reflections on death. Someone gave to me on a prayer card at my mother's funeral. It has always brought me peace and consolation when I reflect on my parents and other loved ones who are now with God. This year, I will be especially remembering my friend, Fr. Matt, whose brother died when he was hit by a car a couple of months back. I am sure you too have special people who either died this year or who lost ones they loved who you hold close to your heart. I hope Fr. Bede's reflection brings you similar peace. (Feel free to share it, if it does!)

I think that All Saints Day and All Souls Day are a beautiful summary of the doctrine of the Communion of the Saints. I think Fr. Bede puts it so well: Life is eternal and love is immortal, and death is only a horizon, and a horizon is nothing, save the limit of our sight. What the Communion of Saints teaches us is that because Jesus Christ conquered sin and death, the latter is no longer a barrier at the end of life, but a state to be passed through. Death cannot impede God's love for creation, particularly humanity, nor our love, care and concern for one another. We can pray for those who have died, that they might enter God's presence if they aren't there already, those who have died but aren't "there yet," (i.e., those sometimes called the "holy souls") can pray for us, and the saints (both those on the Church's formal rolls and those who, unknown to us, enjoy the glory of heaven) can pray for us and the holy souls.

Although November is a somber month, it is fundamentally hopeful and joyful. It is so because death is not the end. Yes, it is inevitable; we all experience it not only by losing others, but also directly ourselves, sooner or later. What we see, standing on the arms of Jesus' cross, is "the fullness of your glory, when you will wipe away every tear from our eyes. For seeing you, our God, as you are, we shall be like you for all the ages and praise you without end."

Our community was working towards recovering from decreasing contributions from 6 years ago, when we hit a snag with Covid. Like in the prior year (19/20), the parish has approximately \$40,000 more expenses over income for fiscal year 20/21. # CAPITAL PROGRAM

We continue to work on certain capital projects as funds become available. Air conditioning units in the parish hall were replaced. The Parish Hall windows need to be replaced soon as there was water intrusion during the last storm, and re-paving of the parking lot will happen Summer 2022.

# DIOCESAN ASSESSMENT

This year's annual assessment from the diocese was \$183,927. This amount is taken out from the parish's regular operations.
