

Brother's Corner

ADVENT STATIONS

While I was in studies for my undergraduate degree at The Catholic University of America in Washington DC, I had the pleasure of experiencing the young adult Catholic sub-culture that thrived in the nation's capital. My vocation to the Dominicans grew out of these moments where I discovered hidden jewels not found on any DC bus tour. The Dominican friars of the Province of St. Joseph administer a parish (St. Dominic's) in southwest DC, in addition to their house of studies (their St. Albert's equivalent) where initial formation of their student brothers takes place. Each Advent, St Dominic's Church hosted an event known as "Advent Stations."

In addition to the Masses and traditions in Advent, Advent Stations is a unique evening event that can help people more deeply enter into and appreciate the Advent Season and prepare for the coming of Christ at His Nativity and at the end of time. It is doing something special outside of simply attending Mass and lighting the Advent Wreath. It is an invitation for people to take time apart from the busyness of life and pre-Christmas shopping and devote themselves to Advent. and in this time to be enriched through prayer, Dominican chant, the Scriptures, and preaching. We will begin Advent Stations this year by hearing the chant, the Rorate Caeli, "Drop down, ye heavens, from above, and let the skies pour down righteousness: let the earth open, and let it bring forth a Savior," thus joining our prayers to the longing of Isaiah the prophet. this, there are seven Advent Stations, corresponding to the seven "O Antiphons." The seven verses of O Come, O Come Emmanuel are poetic translations of the seven O Antiphons. From December 17th to December 23rd, there is an O Antiphon assigned to each day and chanted at Evening Prayer (Vespers). Each O Antiphon begins with the proclamation of Christ as the fulfillment of some aspect of the Old Testament. It ends with a prayer for Him to come and save us in that particular way. The traditional Latin O Antiphons will be chanted in the Dominican tone before each station. The corresponding verse from O Come, O Come Emmanuel will also be sung by all. During the seven stations there is also an Old Testament reading, about hope this year, followed by a short reflection. Once the seven stations conclude, Mary's Magnificat will be chanted. We will then end the event with Night Prayer, traditionally called Compline. It is all done in the dark, candle-lit church as we wait in anticipation for the coming of our Lord, Jesus Christ. It is being held today, Friday, December 17th, from 7:30 -8:30 p.m. here at St. Dominic's in Benicia. This is an opportunity to enter deeper into the Advent season and thus desire a greater intimacy with Jesus, who is the Messiah, the Savior of the world.
