

Pastor's Corner

20 + C + M + B + 22

This is not some cryptic code. It is actually something you might see above doorways, especially this time of year. It is a house blessing associated with the feast of the Epiphany. The 20 and 22 stand for the year; the crosses are, well, crosses; C, M, and B stand for either the names tradition gives to the three magi/kings: Casper, Melchior, and Balthasar or for *Christus Mansionem Benedicat*, Latin for "Christ Blesses (this) House." Until a few years ago, I had only heard of the former meaning and others only know the latter. According to the internet, both are correct.

Devotions such as these are forms of popular piety: expressions of the faith of the people that occur outside of Mass. While devotions such as this are strictly "optional," they can be a powerful help to a healthy living out of ones' faith. "The Second Vatican Council nevertheless reminds us that 'the spiritual life, however, is not limited solely to participation in the Liturgy' (Sacrosanctum Concilium, 12). The spiritual life of the faithful is also nourished by "the pious practices of the Christian people'..." (Pope John Paul II, September 21, 2001) "Authentic expressions of popular piety are not at odds with the centrality of the [Mass]. Rather, in promoting the faith of the people, who regard popular piety as a natural religious expression, they predispose the people for the celebration of the Sacred Mysteries." (Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, December 17, 2001)

Here is a suggested way of blessing your home with Epiphany kit.


Use the blessed chalk to write 20+C+M+B+22 above the main entrance. You can also do this over other outside doors or even inside doorways.

As you are writing, pray one of the following prayers:
May all who come to our home this year rejoice to
find Christ living among us; and may we seek and
serve, in everyone we meet, that same Jesus
Christ who is Lord, forever and ever. Amen.

Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Lord our God, bless this household. May we be blessed with health, goodness of heart, gentleness, and the joyful keeping of your law. We give thanks to you, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

+ A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew:

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in he days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem. saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.
