Brother's Corner

New Year's Resolutions

According to a study done in 2016, of the 41% of Americans who make New Year's resolutions, by the end of the year only 9% feel they were successful in keeping them. This is time of year where many people decide to take on a resolution to lose weight, exercise, save money, quit a habit, etc. I'm going to take the opportunity to encourage you to pick up (maybe dust off) and read Sacred Scripture daily. Read it for about 5 or 10 minutes a day. You can start with the daily Mass readings or your favorite Gospel. There are many kinds of "Read the Bible in 356 days" plans online that you can start. Bring the Bible with you to the Adoration chapel, download an audiobook version and listen to it on your commute, or read the readings in your *Magnificat* before arriving to the church for daily Mass. Over the span of weeks and months, you will find that reading Scripture fuels the fire of divine love in the soul for God, as exemplified in the lives of the saints.

It is one thing to have the resolve to read Scripture every day, but there needs to be a certain attitude that accompanies the determination. In his book, Saint Thomas Aguinas, Vol. 1, The Person and His Work, fr. Jean-Pierre Torrell, O.P., the great French Dominican and theologian, reflects on Thomas's life and works. He goes into great detail on the overlooked but profound text, Thomas's Catechetical Instructions. In it, St. Thomas elucidates the necessary attitude one needs to take when approaching the Word of God. "St. Thomas enumerates five attitudes toward the Word of God. 1) We must first listen willingly to it: "We ought to hear the Word of God gladly; for such is a sign that we love God." 2) We must next believe it. "We ought also to believe the word of God whereby the Word of God dwells in us, who is Christ: "That Christ may dwell by faith in your hearts." 3) We must also meditate on it constantly, "we should meditate often upon this; for otherwise we will not be benefited to the extent that such meditation is a great help against sin." 4) We must further communicate it to others by "advising, preaching and inflaming their hearts...Preach the word; be it in season, out of season; reprove, entreat, rebuke in all patience and doctrine...let the word of Christ dwell in you abundantly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another." 5) We must finally complete it, "we ought to put the word of God into practice: by being, as Saint James wrote, "Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deceiving only yourselves." St. Thomas finishes his reflection on these attitudes and explains that the Blessed Mother observed these attitudes perfectly during the life of Christ.

"First, she heard what was said to her: "The Holy Spirit will come upon you." Then she gave her consent through faith: "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord." And she also received and carried the Word in her womb. Then she brought forth the Word of God and, finally, she nourished and cared for Him."

Through the intercession of Mary, the Mother of God, we ask God to open our minds and souls to receive Christ, both in Word and Sacrament, as we enter into this new year.

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was

there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers. "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from -although the servers who had drawn the water knew-, the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.
