Pastor's Corner

Baptism

Baptism is a watershed event (pun intended) in anyone's life. It marks the person's incorporation into the mystical Body of Christ, the Church. In Jesus' case, the event inaugurated this primordial sacrament, the gateway to the other sacraments. But Baptism can also be a graced moment for the minister. For John the Baptist, it was the conclusion of his preaching of repentance. The one whose way he had prepared was not only present ("Behold the Lamb of God!") but now beginning his own public work ("He must increase; I must decrease.").

I think many of you know that my maternal uncle was a diocesan priest in the Archdiocese of San Francisco. He was ordained a priest the month before I was born. I was his first Baptism. Remembering that time in my life, I can imagine what he might have been feeling. First of nervousness: having only read about it and seen others do it, but not having done it himself. As we all know, there can be a huge difference between knowing something intellectually and experientially. The fact that he was doing it for his sister's first born probably only heightened his anxiety. ("If I mess up or do something stupid, she'll never let me forget it!") The second thing he probably felt was a sense of awe. Having studied Scripture, history, and sacramental theology (to name only a few) for the last number of years, knowing he was now going to be an agent of those graces personally puts all that learning in a new, humbling light.

I do not remember the first Baptism I performed. Unlike when my uncle was going through the diocesan seminary in the late '60's, when I was going through Dominican formation in the '90's, we started baptizing infants when we were deacons. I know in what parish my first Baptism was (St. Mary's in Piscataway, MD), but not who the "lucky" (or unlucky) baby was. (I do remember my first wedding: I was with them through their entire preparation process, and they even moved their wedding date to after my priestly ordination; I was able to celebrate their wedding Mass as well as receive their vows. We are still friends to this day.)

Do you remember your Baptism? Have you, like me, seen the pictures? Have you seen *that* meme? (Baby with a surprised look, holding a cell phone, and saying something like, "Grandma, I'm not kidding. In church today, some guy in a dress tried to drown me, and everybody just stood around taking pictures!") Regardless, we can all renew our own Baptismal vows today, to be faithful members of the Body Christ, and sharing the Good News with those we meet.


