

Brother's Corner

Fasting with a deeper Purpose

"Be converted to Me with all your heart, in fasting, in

weeping, and in mourning" (Joel 2:12). Wednesday, March 2nd begins the season of Lent. Christians throughout the world joyfully attend Mass on Ash Wednesday in order to receive ashes on their heads. The use of ashes as a symbol of repentance is rooted in Scripture and preserved in the Tradition. It serves as an external reminder of one's personal need for repentance and conversion to Jesus Christ and Him crucified in all areas of one's life. Ashes traced on our forehead, like the Chrism oil at baptism, remind each Christian (and non-Christian alike) that our lives are not our own and that we are not made for this world but for eternal union with God in heaven. All the external actions and interior conversions we undertake in Lent (an increased attention to prayer, fasting, giving of one's earnings and treasures without anything in return, keeping vigil, the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Penance, Stations of the Cross, the seven sorrows of Mary) serve as direct contradictions to the false promises of happiness that are assured by godless, secularized, consumeristic, individualistic culture. It is a courageous moment for Christians around the world to bear witness to their faith in Jesus Christ.

I want to focus on fasting. Medical professionals and YouTube stars promote fasting (intermittent fasting, dieting, water fasting, calorie restriction, etc.) so that their patients and followers can live a "healthier lifestyle." The Church promotes fasting for different reasons. Saint Thomas Aguinas gives the Christian three reasons for fasting. "First, in order to bridle the lusts of the flesh...since fasting is the guardian of chastity...Secondly, we have recourse to fasting in order that the mind may arise more freely to the contemplation of heavenly things... it is related to Daniel (Dan 10) that he received a revelation from God after fasting for three weeks. Thirdly, in order to satisfy for sins: where it is...declared by Augustine in a sermon "Fasting cleanses the soul, raises the mind, subjects one's flesh to the spirit, renders the heart contrite and humble, scatters the clouds of concupiscence, quenches the fire of lust, kindles the true light of chastity."

Fasting is directed to two things, the deletion of sin, and the raising of the mind to heavenly things. Repent and believe in the Gospel. Lent is an apt time to seriously consider fasting (where a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal) outside of the prescribed days of fasting (Ash Wednesday and Good Friday). We fast in Lent in preparation for Easter, where "the man ought to be cleansed from sin [and] the mind of man ought to be devoutly raised to the glory of eternity, which Christ restored by rising from the dead."

Each year, Bishop Soto extends an opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation to practicing adult Catholics of the Diocese of Sacramento who have received religious instruction but for various reasons were never confirmed.

The next celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation is scheduled in June. Candidates will be prepared at the parish level by completing a minimum of 8 sessions held over a series of Sundays beginning March 27, 2022, 2:00 - 3:30 p.m. via videoconferencing on Zoom.

Sacrament preparation will include prayer, scripture and a review of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. To participate the candidate must be a baptized Catholic, who has received catechetical instruction at least up to receiving the Eucharist (First Communion), be either unmarried or in a marriage recognized as valid by the Catholic Church, have a recent copy of their Baptismal Certificate certified within the past 6 months, and have a Confirmation sponsor who must be a confirmed, practicing Catholic and at least 16 years of age.




