

Pastor's Corner

When I was a Duck

This is the first of two weekends this month that I will be away. You know if you watch my *Monday Musings* that I will be at St. Thomas More Catholic Newman Center in Eugene, Oregon. It has a special place in my heart: it was the first community I served as pastor. I was in my seventh year of priesthood and had served in two of the largest parishes in the Province (St. Dominic's, Eagle Rock and Holy Rosary, Antioch) and two prominent campus ministries (Occidental College and Stanford University). I had also lost both of my parents in my first three years of priesthood: my father to ALS a few weeks after my first anniversary of priesthood and my mother just under two years later to cancer.

Back around this time in 2005, I was happily in the midst of my third year at Stanford University; I had gotten over being intimidated serving at such a prestigious university and learned that I could be an excellent priest for those smart, talented, and driven students from all over the world. You could say I had finally hit my stride as a priest. Stanford was also the first assignment where I didn't have to worry about the health of one or both of my parents; and remember, I'm an only child.

The Dominican community in Menlo Park at the time, prior to our accepting St. Raymond's, was Vallejo boy, Fr. Patrick LaBelle, me, and an older friar serving as chaplain to our cloistered nuns. The three of us had talked about how I could possibly be a good candidate for Eugene, but I didn't think those conversations got past our dinner table. I will never forget the call from the Provincial asking me if I would go to Eugene as pastor: I was having a lunch of sangria and tapas on my day off. I was surprised, honored, and felt completely unprepared, but I said "yes."

Like the first year of priesthood, the first year of being a pastor has a steep learning curve. Fortunately, I had an energetic congregation of students and permanent community, a very competent lay staff, and a dedicated, hard working, newly ordained parochial vicar who all did their part in making the transition a smooth one for me. (In that year, I took a workshop for new pastors from up and down the West coast, one of the other young pastors was a Sacramento diocesan priest; we had lost touch after that workshop and reconnected when I moved to Benicia!) I was feeling pretty good about my first year as it was coming to a close and looking forward to the second year, when everything would not be "first." Then came a complete surprise that brought my 11-month pastorate in Eugene to an abrupt end: I was elected prior of Holy Rosary Priory in Portland.






A reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah:

At the sound of that cry, the frame of the door shook and the house was filled with smoke. Then I said, "Woe is me, I am doomed! For I am a man of unclean lips, living among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!" Then one of the seraphim flew to me, holding an ember that he had taken with tongs from the altar. He touched my mouth with it, and said, "See, now that this has touched your lips, your wickedness is removed, your sin purged." Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? For I handed on to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures; that he was buried; that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures; that he appeared to Cephas, then to the Twelve. After that, he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at once, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. After that he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one born abnormally, he appeared to me. For I am the least of the apostles, not fit

to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace to me has not been ineffective. Indeed, I have toiled harder than all of them; not I, however, but the grace of God that is with me. Therefore, whether it be I or they, so we preach and so you believed. The word of the Lord.

+ A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke:

While the crowd was pressing in on Jesus and listening to the word of God, he was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret. He saw two boats there alongside the lake; the fishermen had disembarked and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, he asked him to put out a short distance from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. After he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Simon said in reply, "Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets." When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them. They came and filled both boats so that the boats were in danger of sinking.
