March 11, 2022 COVID Guidelines

Below is my summary of Bp. Soto's latest COVID guidelines that went into effect this past Monday. For the full text, you can go here. <insert link!>

The distribution of the chalice at Mass remains suspended

Pews are no longer required to be sanitized after every event

Restrictions on the number and function of various liturgical ministers and congregational singing are lifted

Face masks:

- Required for clergy and laity distributing Holy Communion at Mass
- Required for clergy when administering a sacrament in close proximity to the recipient (e.g., during face-to-face Confession and anointings and laying on of hands during Baptism, Confirmation and Anointing of the Sick)
- Strongly encouraged while in a church and parish events; people may choose to wear them at any time

Hand sanitizer is to be made available for ministers of Holy Communion and recipients

Disposable cotton swabs are encouraged, but not required, for the anointings during Baptism, Confirmation, and the Anointing of the Sick

The rites of Holy Week (beginning on Palm Sunday) may return to their traditional practice, though the bishop is encouraging us not to kiss the Cross during the veneration on Good Friday

Each year, Bishop Soto extends an opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation to practicing adult Catholics of the Diocese of Sacramento who have received religious instruction but for various reasons were never confirmed.

The next celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation is scheduled in June. Candidates will be prepared at the parish level by completing a minimum of 8 sessions held over a series of Sundays beginning March 27, 2022, 2:00 - 3:30 p.m. via video-conferencing on Zoom.

Sacrament preparation will include prayer, scripture and a review of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. To participate the candidate must be a baptized Catholic, who has received catechetical instruction at least up to receiving the Eucharist (First Communion), be either unmarried or in a marriage recognized as valid by the Catholic Church, have a recent copy of their Baptismal Certificate certified within the past 6 months, and have a Confirmation sponsor who must be a confirmed, practicing Catholic and at least 16 years of age.



Examination of Conscience - Making a good Reconciliation for Lent

Often we approach the Sacrament of Reconciliation as if it fixes aspects of our lives that we're not willing to fix ourselves. We go, time after time, confessing the same sins, never really rising above them. This happens because we confess only our surface actions, and never get to the underlying motivations within us that lead us to choose sin. An *Examination of Conscience* invites us to go deeper. **To do an** *Examination*: 1) set aside some time in prayer; 2) if possible, read the Bible passage the *Examination* is based on; 3) read through each question in the *Examination*, pausing to ask them of yourself; 4) stay with the questions that speak to you the most (usually only one or two will really resonate); 5) spend some extra time in prayer with those questions (reflect on your motivation); and 6) bring the results of your *Examination* into Confession or a prayer of resolve. You can create your own *Examination* from many different types of Bible passages.



Exodus 3:1-8a. 13-15

A reading from the Book of Exodus

Moses was tending the flock of his father-in-law Jethro, the priest of Midian. Leading the flock across the desert, he came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There an angel of the LORD appeared to Moses in fire flaming out of a bush. As he looked on, he was surprised to see that the bush, though on fire, was not consumed. So Moses decided, "I must go over to look at this remarkable sight, and see why the bush is not burned." When the LORD saw him coming over to look at it more closely, God called out to him from the bush. "Moses! Moses!" He answered. "Here I am." God said, "Come no nearer! Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place where you stand is holy ground. I am the God of your fathers." he continued, "the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, the God of Jacob." Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God. But the LORD said, "I have witnessed the affliction of my people in Egypt and have heard their cry of complaint against their slave drivers, so I know well what they are suffering. Therefore I have come down to rescue them from the hands of the Egyptians and lead them out of that land into a good and spacious land, a land flowing with milk and honey." "This is my name forever; thus am I to be remembered through all generations."
